JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) The Israeli military set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Shu'fat refugee camp in Jerusalem replacing the old checkpoint placed at the entrance of the camp which will close off and separate Shu'fat Ras Khamis ,Ras Shihadeh, Al Salam neighbourhood, Anata and Shu'fat camp from Jerusalem Settlement Activity: (i) Israeli authorities approved construction plan #12259 for the construction of 23 settlements units in Ras Al-Amoud neighbourhood in Jerusalem. (ii) Israeli authorities approved the construction of 680 settlement units, 500 of which are for Har Homa settlement and 180 for Giv'at Ra'if settlement Wall Gates: (i) The Israel

Flying Checkpoints: At 09:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Nabi Saleh village and detained a resident. At 19:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Yabrud village and temporarily detained Bilal Hamad, an Intelligence officer, and released him at a later time.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	 Raid: (i) At 17:20, Israeli forces raided Beitin village. (ii) At 00:50, Israeli forces raided Deir Al-Sudan village and opened fire randomly. Attack: At 09:40, Israeli forces positioned at Beitunia checkpoint fired rubber-coated bullets, stun grenades and teargas grenades towards family members of detainees awaiting their release in the second phase of prisoner swap deal between the Israeli government and Hamas. Also, at 16:30 Israeli forces again opened fire towards residents, injuring 5 residents while several others suffered suffocation as a result of teargas inhalation. Detention: Israeli forces detained Baker Al-Tamimi at the entrance of Al-Nabi Saleh village. Settler Violence: At 01:40, a group of Israeli settlers raided Beitin village, set fire to 4 vehicles and a truck owned by Najah Mustafa, Najah Al-Imseity, Ahmad Abul Sanbal, and Samia Badran and withdrew under the protection of Israeli forces. Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in

- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 15:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Tarousah village junction.
- (ii) At 18:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al Thahiriya.

- <u>Detention:</u> On December 18th 2011, Israeli forces positioned near the Ibrahim Mosque in Hebron's Old City detained Khaled Bashir, a resident of Hebron.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark. This is in breach of the agreement in this regard with the Israeli side, which specified the limit of territorial waters at 20 nautical; Israel had unilaterally changed this agreement first in October 2006, when it shrunk the area to 6 nautical miles, then in January 2009, when it declared the limit at 3 nautical miles.
