- <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 21:40, a group of Israeli settlers stone residential vehicles near Beit Ur junction.
- <u>Demonstrations</u>: At 12:30, Palestinian and international peace activists marched towards Tel Al-Rumayda and Abu Sneina neighbourhoods in the Old City, protesting against settlement activity and the closures, during which Israeli forces fired teargas grenades and sprayed sewage at demonstrators, preventing them from reaching the demonstration sites; as a result 20 protestors suffocated from teargas inhalation.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark. Israeli forces broke the ceasefire opening fire towards central Gaza and fired tank artillery shells towards Gaza. Palestinian gunmen launched 18 projectiles towards the Green Line.
