Flying Checkpoint: At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Ya'bad town and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 14:40, the Israeli army raided 'Arraba town, served a summons on Bassam Sharif Fares al 'Ardhah to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency, and withdrew at 16:30. At 16:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Fahma village. At 17:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kafr Ra'i town. At 01:40, the Israeli army raided Jenin city and Jenin refugee camp and patrolled these areas until 06:00. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

At 21:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Kafr Laqif village and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Jayyus town and Sir village and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 12:30, the Israeli army raided the southern quarter of Jayyus town and surveyed land. At 15:30, the Israeli army raided 'Azzun town and searched a commercial premise. At 00:10, the Israeli army raided the town again and searched four houses. At 17:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kafr Thulth town. At 21:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Jayyus town. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:25, and again at 17:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Nablus city and 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Madama village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 19:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Deir Sharaf village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 20:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between 'Aqraba town and Osarin village and searched civilians.

• Raids/Air Patrol/School Disruption/Attack:

- (i) At 10:25, the Israeli army raided 'Awarta village and arrested three civilians (brothers). At 00:10, the Israeli army raided the village again and arrested another two civilians.
- (ii) At 20:15, Israeli troops, dispatched by combat helicopters, raided and combed Al Ghawabi area north of 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and Al Qurs area west of Talluza village.
- (iii) At 22:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled 'Asira ash Shamaliya town.
- (iv) At 23:55, the Israeli army raided Nablus city and provided protection to a group of Israeli settlers, who visited Prophet Joseph Shrine. The Israeli army occupied the roof of a school and converted it into a military post. Allegedly for throwing stones, the Israeli army opened fire and fired sound grenades on civilians at the entrance to Balata refugee camp. At 05:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

	 Arrests: The Israeli army arrested five civilians in 'Awarta village: (i) Ahmed Ma'an Yihya 'Awwad; (ii) Niyaz Mohammed Niyaz 'Awwad; (iii) Samer Abdul Hafeeth Mohammed; (iv) Ahmed Abdul Hafeeth Mohammed; and (v) Ramzi Abdul Hafeeth Mohammed. • Settler Violence/Destruction of Property: At 14:30, and for the second time, a group of Israeli settlers from Yitzhar settlement gained access to civilian land in Duma village and destroyed a water spring and pipeline south of the village.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the northern entrance to Bruqin town. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland. Beginning on 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has continued to open the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Flying Checkpoints: At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Yasuf village and searched civilians and vehicles. Settler Violence: At 12:30, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to Al Birak area east of Bruqin town and made a tour until 13:00. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of Emmanuel settlement.
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks. - (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 10:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Adh Dhahiriya town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 12:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Ummar town and denied access to civilian vehicles after it had also closed the iron gate at the entrance. The Israeli army reopened the gate at a later time.
- (iv) At 15:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Wadi al Joz road east of Hebron city and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 17:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint north of Hebron city, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a civilian, ostensibly for locating a knife in his vehicle.
- Attack: At 17:55, Israeli troops positioned near Al 'Arrub refugee camp fired tear gas grenades on a number of civilians, allegedly for throwing stones.

• Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Security Forces:

- (i) At 13:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hebron city.
- (ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided Al 'Arrub refugee camp, searched a house, and arrested two children (brothers).
- (iii) At 14:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al Karmel village east of Yatta town.
- (iv) At 14:55, the Israeli army raided Tarusa village and searched a house.
- (v) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided Bani Na'im town, searched a house, and took photographs of the town's Palestinian Police station.
- (vi) At 15:15, the Israeli army raided Karma village and searched two houses.
- (vii) At 15:35, the Israeli army raided Rabud village and searched a house.
- (viii) At 23:25, the Israeli army raided Adh Dhahiriya town, searched a number of houses and commercial premises, and arrested a civilian.
- (ix) At 23:40, the Israeli army raided Idhna town, searched a number of houses, and arrested a civilian.

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold. Violations of the Ceasefire: Israeli navy boats opened fire on Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of Khan Yunis city. At noon on 04 April 2011, Israeli F16 combat and reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over all districts of the Gaza Strip. Armed Palestinian individuals fired a mortar towards the Green Line.
NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank. Palestinian Attack: In the evening of 04 April 2011, armed Palestinian individuals fired an unidentified mortar towards the Green Line.
GAZA	Closure of Crossing Points: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Attack: In the morning of 04 April 2011, the Israeli navy opened fire on Palestinian fishing boats at sea of the beach of Khan Yunis city.

<u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u>
Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed.

- (ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to allow civilians, patients, students, and civilians holding visas and residence cards abroad to depart the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to patients, who had received medical attentions at Egyptian hospitals.
- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
- (iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, and cooking gas. 20 vehicles imported by the private sector were also transported through the Crossing.
