#### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

## (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.

- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
- (iii) At 20:35, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at Huwwara checkpoint and impeded civilian access.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Nablus city and 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city. At 21:00, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 22:00.
- (ii) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near 'Ein ad Duyuk village (the northern entrance to Jericho city) and impeded civilian access. At 21:30, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 02:20.
- <u>Arrest</u>: On 07 April 2011, Israeli troops positioned on Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge arrested Yousef 'Imad Mar'i, while he was returning from Jordan.
- <u>Destruction of Property</u>: At 20:20, the Israeli army demolished three barracks north of 'Ein ad Duyuk al Foqa village north of Jericho city. The property belonged to:
- (i) Nayef Dawoud ar Rashaydeh;
- (ii) Suleiman Dawoud ar Rashaydeh; and
- (iii) Yousef ar Rashaydeh.

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the southeastern area of the village.
- (ii) Beginning on 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has continued to prevent civilians from accessing or staying on 22 *dunums* of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
- (iii) Beginning on 20 January 2011, the Israeli army has continued to close the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: At 17:35, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 11:25, the Israeli army raided Al Khadr town, delivered a notice for the demolition of a house belonging to Omar Khalil Ahmed Subeih, claiming that it had been built without the required construction licence.
- (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided Wadi Fukin town and searched two houses. Of these, Israeli troops removed a window on a house belonging to Omar al Huroub. At 17:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 17:35, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained three civilians:

#### **BETHLEHEM**

- (i) Mike Yagi;
- (ii) Khaled Abu Tahoun; and
- (iii) Sameer ash Sha'er.

At 19:50, Israeli troops released all detained civilians after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).

• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

#### Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street; As Sahleh, Khuzq al Far, and Al Khan areas; and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) Beginning on 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evacuated residents and denied civilian access to the area.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya towns, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani and Al Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.

#### Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 15:05, and again at 20:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Sa'ir town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 17:00, and again at 21:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 17:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 07:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al Fahs area south of Hebron city and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Physical Assaults:

- (i) At 08:25, Israeli troops severely beat Islam Rafiq Hammad 'Ubeidu at the entrance to Ash Shuhada' Street in the old city of Hebron, leaving him with contusions.
- (ii) Israeli troops severely beat Mohammed Suleiman al 'Awawdeh, a resident of Idhna town, near Ar Ramadin village while he was returning from his workplace inside the Green Line. At 01:55, Al 'Awawdeh was admitted to the Hebron Public Hospital for treatment of contusions sustained.

#### Hebron

- Attack: At 14:15, Israeli troops positioned in the area opposite Al 'Arrub refugee camp fired rubber-coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades on civilians at the entrance to the refugee camp, allegedly for throwing stones.
- Raids:
- (i) At 11:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hebron city. At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the city again, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (ii) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided Beit Ummar town and searched a number of houses.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.

#### **GAZA STRIP**

# • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold.

#### • Violations of the Ceasefire:

#### ALL DISTRICTS

- (i) Throughout the Gaza Strip districts, the Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and fired artillery shells from its locations on the Green Line on civilian houses and property. Israeli combat aircraft also fired missiles on Palestinian territory. The Israeli military offensive resulted in the killing of four civilians and three armed Palestinian individuals. In addition to two armed Palestinian individuals, 40 civilians, including women, children, a medic, a journalist, were wounded. Of these, two civilians were in critical condition.
- (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired 27 mortars towards the Green Line.

• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank.

The local electricity grid and a civilian house also sustained damage during the attack.
- (ii) In the afternoon of 07 April 2011, Israeli combat helicopters opened machinegun fire on agricultural land and civilian houses east of At Tuffah and Ash Shuja'iya neighbourhoods east of Gaza city, injuring a civilian.
- (iii) In the afternoon of 07 April 2011, the Israeli army fired a number of artillery shells from its location on the Green Line on Palestinian territory south of Gaza city.
- <u>Killing</u>: The Israeli army killed Mahmoud Manassrah, 50 years old, east of Ash Shuja'iya neighbourhood east of Gaza city.
- <u>Raid/Attack</u>: At 21:00, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers, raided Palestinian territory east of Ash Shuja'iya neighbourhood and opened fire intensively on agricultural land and civilian houses.

#### POLITICAL PRISONERS

• <u>Hunger Strike</u>: On 07 April 2011, political prisoners held in An Naqab (Ketzioyt) Military Detention Camp declared a one-day hunger strike in protest against placing a number of prisoners in solitary confinement. Political prisoners demanded that medical treatment be offered to ill prisoners and that humiliating searches of prisoners' families during visits be halted.
