<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) On 08 April 2011, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city, set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and denied access to civilians from other districts to perform Friday prayers at the Al Aqsa Mosque.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba’.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoint:</b> The Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designates a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>• <b>Demonstration:</b> At 14:00, civilians performed Friday prayers in the sit-in tent erected in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem city in protest against the eviction of civilian homes for construction of Israeli settlement projects. After the prayers, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and participants, during which the Israeli army injured a number of civilians as a result of tear gas inhalation.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continues in the area north of Qalandiya village; south of Az Za’ayyem village; and in Wadi al ‘Eizariya west of Ma’ale Adumim settlement.</li> </ul>
<b>RAMALLAH &amp; EL BIREH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil town and Saffa village and the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages.</li> <li>(ii) Although it removed the dirt barricade, the Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to An Nabi Salih village.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Demonstrations:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 13:40, a mass demonstration, including international and Israeli peace activists, took place in Bil'in village in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which a number of participants were injured as a result of tear gas inhalation.</li> <li>(ii) At 14:00, a mass demonstration, including international and Israeli peace activists, took place in Ni'lin town in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which a number of participants sustained wounds as a result of tear gas inhalation.</li> <li>(iii) At 15:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in An Nabi Salih village in protest against Israeli settler violence and confiscation of civilian land for the expansion of Halamish settlement. Meanwhile, the Israeli army raided the village and fired rubber-coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades on protestors, injuring a civilian and international peace activist. A number of participants and civilians also sustained wounds as a result of tear gas inhalation. In addition to Safwat at Tamimi, a Palestinian National Security officer, the Israeli army detained two civilians and released them at a later time.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding 'Ofarim settlement and north of Al Lubban al Gharbi and Rantis villages.</li> </ul>
<b>JENIN</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Road:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of Dotan settlement.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>
<b>TUBAS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas.</li> </ul>
<b>TULKAREM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting Kafr al Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> At 10:15, the Israeli army intensified restrictions and impeded civilian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 12:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Ramin village and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 15:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Lid town and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<p>(iii) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Kafriyat road and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> </ul>
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 15:50, the Israeli army set up two flying checkpoints at the entrances to Immatin and Jit villages and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near ‘Azzun town and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Jit village and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iv) At 01:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near An Nabi Elyas village and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Settler Violence:</b> At 00:35, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling near Kedumim settlement along the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians and students, with a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.</li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<p>(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <p>(i) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Deir Sharaf village on the Nablus-Tulkarem main road and searched civilians and vehicles until 12:45.</p> <p>(ii) At 13:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and Talluza village and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iii) At 14:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Furik town and impeded civilian access. At 23:00, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iv) At 15:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Nablus city and 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:10.</p> <p>(v) At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Qusin village and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Detentions:</u></b> <p>(i) At 14:10, the Israeli army raided Til village, set up a checkpoint between it and Sarra village, and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army also patrolled Til village until 14:35.</p> <p>(ii) At 22:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Beit Furik town.</p> <p>(iii) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided Jamma'in town, searched a house, and withdrew at 05:00.</p> <p>(iv) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled 'Aqraba town.</p> <p>(v) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided 'Asira al Qibliya town, searched a number of houses, detained three civilians, and released them at a later time.</p> </li> </ul>
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> At 10:00, the Israeli authorities declared the Wadi Qana area a closed military zone and denied access to farmers to their land. The Israeli army also prevented farmers, who had been present in the area, from leaving it until 14:00.</li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland.</p> <p>(iii) Beginning on 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has continued to open the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Yasuf village and searched civilians and vehicles until 14:30.</li> <li>(ii) At 14:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Kafr ad Dik town and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 00:40, the Israeli army raided Bruqin town, searched a house, and served a summons on Raed Abdul Mun'em Isma'il to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 01:15, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:20, a group of Israeli settlers from Zahav settlement near Kafr ad Dik town threw stones at Wajdi Saqr Mohammed ad Dik, while he was ploughing his land west of the town.</li> <li>(ii) At 12:00, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to civilian land in Al Matwi area west of Salfit city and withdrew at 13:45.</li> <li>(iii) At 12:30, Israeli guards of Netafim settlement detained a number of Palestinian farmers, while they were working on their land in Deir Istiya town. Israeli guards forced farmers to leave the area at 13:10.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of Emmanuel settlement.</li> </ul>
<b>JERICHO</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Road:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district as well as to others holding access permits.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near 'Ein ad Duyuk village (the northern entrance to Jericho city) and searched civilians and vehicles until 12:00.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Physical Assault:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 10:25, the Israeli army raided Al 'Auja village and arrested a civilian and a Palestinian security officer. Israeli troops also severely beat the Palestinian security officer. At 11:05, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(ii) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided the western quarter of Jericho city and patrolled it until 23:20.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> The Israeli army arrested a civilian and Palestinian security officer in Al 'Auja village: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Hani Tayseer Ma'ali, a Palestinian General Intelligence officer; and</li> <li>(ii) Nadir Tayseer Ma'ali.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>BETHLEHEM</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) According to Military Order # S/02/07, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order T/31/07.</li> <li>(iii) Beginning on 20 January 2011, the Israeli army has continued to close the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoint:</b> At 22:20, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b></li> <li>(i) At 11:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Artas village.</li> <li>(ii) At 13:30, the Israeli army raided Harmala village, installed surveillance cameras along the main road near the village, and patrolled the area until 14:20.</li> <li>• <b>Arrest:</b> On 08 April 2011, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint arrests Mahir Mohammed as Samamreh.</li> <li>• <b>Settler Violence:</b> At 09:30, a group of armed Israeli settlers from Efrat settlement gained access to civilian land in Artas village and opened indiscriminate fire. Subsequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.</li> <li>• <b>Demonstration/Attack:</b> At 12:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Al Ma'sara village in protest against Wall construction. To prevent participants from accessing the land under the threat of confiscation, Israeli troops fired tear gas grenades, injuring a number of participants as a result of tear gas inhalation.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Hebron</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.</li> </ul>

(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S on the closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

- **Closure of Main Roads:**

(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya towns, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani and Al Karmil villages.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.

(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.

- **Flying Checkpoints:**

(i) At 09:10, and again at 17:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles.

(ii) At 10:00, and again at 16:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iii) At 14:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iv) At 19:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Zif village, searched civilian vehicles, and arrested two civilians.

- **Physical Assault:** At 22:40, Israeli troops severely beat Firas Muneer Barad'iyyeh in the old city of Hebron. Barad'iyyeh was transported to hospital for treatment of contusions sustained.

- **Raids/Physical Assaults/Detentions:**

(i) At 08:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dura town.

(ii) At 09:20, the Israeli army raided Hebron city and severely beat three Palestinian Police officers, while they were on duty in Bab az Zawiya area. All Police officers were transported to hospital for treatment of contusions sustained.

(iii) At 11:45, the Israeli army raided Al 'Arrub refugee camp. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army arrested a child, allegedly because he had thrown stones.

(iv) At 18:30, the Israeli army raided Khirbet Safa village. While preventing farmers from tending their land, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. The Israeli army also detained some 20 civilians and released them at a later time. At 19:20, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

- **Arrests:**

(i) At 12:00, the Israeli army arrested Faeq Ibrahim Muheisen, a resident of Beit Ummar town, while he was present near the main road near the town.

Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on the junction to Zif village arrested two civilians:

### GAZA STRIP

<b>ALL DISTRICTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold.</li> <li>• <b>Violations of the Ceasefire:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Throughout the Gaza Strip districts, the Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and fired artillery shells from its locations on the Green Line on civilian houses and property. Israeli combat aircraft also fired missiles on Palestinian territory. The Israeli military offensive resulted in the killing of six armed Palestinian individuals and four civilians, including a child as well as a mother and daughter. In addition to three armed Palestinian individuals, 17 civilians, including six children, women, and a medic, were wounded. Of these, three civilians were in critical condition.</li> <li>(ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired 72 mortars, including eight Grad missiles, towards the Green Line.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
