JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound. (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksha due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00. Claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp, the checkpoint will be closed for two and a half weeks. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Bir Nabala and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 20:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Anata and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raid/Detentions: At 01:45, the Israeli army raided the town of Al 'Eizariya and searched a pharmacy and a health care centre. The Israeli army also detained 3 civilians (a father and his sons) and released them at a later time. • Arrests: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On 25 April 2010, the Israeli army arrested Rihab Tareq Ahmed Mustafa, a female advocate, in Ash Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem.

	<p>(ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army arrested Ahmed Nasser ad Din 'Useileh, while searching his house in the old city of Jerusalem.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Settler Violence/Attack/Injuries/Detentions:</u> At 08:00, a group of Israeli settlers organised a provocative vigil in Silwan neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem. Israeli troops guarding the settlers' vigil fired rubber coated steel bullets as well as sound and tear gas grenades towards civilians, who attempted to confront settlers. As a result, Israeli troops injured 5 civilians, including a medic, while he was evacuating an injured civilian. Israeli troops also detained a number of civilians, including Hatem Abdul Qader, Palestinian official in charge of the Jerusalem File. After he paid a bail, the Israeli authorities released Abdul Qader. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was resumed in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was resumed west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
<p style="text-align: center;">JENIN</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the Haddad Tourist Village and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Az Zababida. (ii) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and patrolled the area until 04:40. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:00, and again at 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Bardala and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Ein al Beida and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:00. • Raid: At 08:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Bardala. • Settler Violence: At 18:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Maskiyyot gained access to the area of 'Ein al Hilwa near the village of Al Malih, erected a tent in the vicinity of Bedouins' makeshift houses, and demanded that they evacuate the area at gunpoint. Subsequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area at 19:30.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Flying Checkpoint: At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Qaffin and searched civilians and vehicles. • Detentions: At 18:30, Israeli troops positioned at 'Einav checkpoint detained 2 civilians as well as 1 Palestinian Preventive Security officer and released them at a later time. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of 'Azzun and the village of 'Izbat at Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 18:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<p>(iii) At 20:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of An Nabi Elyas on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raids: (i) At 00:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area between the towns of ‘Azzun and Kafr Thulth. (ii) At 01:35, the Israeli army raided the village of Ras ‘Atiya and searched a house and a commercial premise. • Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. • Flying Checkpoint: At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of ‘Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabalan and arrested 2 civilians. • Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Qabalan: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) ‘Uthman Ahmed Hussein Az’ar; and (ii) Bilal Kamal Farah Az’ar.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.

	<p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. • Flying Checkpoint: At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Yasuf and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <p>(i) At 09:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Biddya. At 18:40, the Israeli army raided the town again, searched a number of houses and commercial premises, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</p> <p>(ii) At 22:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Bruqin and arrested 1 civilian.</p> <p>(iii) At 02:25, the Israeli army raided the village of Farkha and arrested 1 civilian.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrests: <p>(i) The Israeli army arrested Hilmi Rabah Samarah in the town of Bruqin.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army arrested Marwan Saber 'Awadh Muhrah in the village of Farkha.</p> • Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. • Checkpoints: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.</p> • Arrests/Confiscation of Property: At 22:00, and after confiscating 2 bulldozers that were repairing the road in the centre of the village of Al 'Auja, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Tareq Abu Shukheidim; and (ii) Suleiman Abdul 'Aziz.

<p style="text-align: center;">BETHLEHEM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. • Flying Checkpoint: At 22:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Fajjar and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Beit Jala. (ii) At 23:50, the Israeli army raided and combed the cemetery area near 'Ayda refugee camp in the city of Bethlehem. • Demonstrations/Attacks/Injuries/Detentions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Walaja in protest against land levelling for the completion of Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured a journalist. A number of participants also sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation. The Israeli army also arrested 1 civilian detained an international peace activist. (ii) At 11:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Ma'sara in protest against land levelling for the completion of Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured a number of participants as a result of tear gas inhalation. The Israeli army also detained several international peace activists. • Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Haytham Khaled Mustafa al Atrash in the village of Al Walaja. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.
<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market

- with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.
- **Closure of Main Roads:**

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.

(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
 - **Flying Checkpoints:**

(i) At 10:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.

(ii) At 12:30, and again at 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iii) At 13:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iv) At 17:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Bani Na'im and searched civilians and vehicles.

(v) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Zif and searched civilians and vehicles.

(vi) At 22:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Beit Ummar and searched civilians and vehicles.
 - **Raids/House Occupation/Detentions/Air Patrol/Curfew:**

(i) At 07:10 on 25 April 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of At Tabaqa, occupied a house, and converted it into a military post, after having detained residents in one room. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians near the house. At 11:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

(ii) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. At 23:05, the Israeli army raided the city again and arrested 1 civilian.

(iii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Surif.

(iv) At 01:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Idhna.

(v) At 05:10, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by a combat helicopter, raided the town of Beit 'Awwa and imposed curfew, after having closed all entrances to the town and denied civilian access. While surrounding a house, an armed

	<p>confrontation took place between Israeli troops and an armed Palestinian individual. Israeli troops demolished the house, while the individual was inside, resulting in his death. Later, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 4 civilians and arrested 2 others (brothers).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Death:</u> The Israeli army killed Ali Isma'il Ali as Suweiti in the town of Beit 'Awwa. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army arrested Sharif al Jamal in the city of Hebron. The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Beit 'Awwa: (ii) Nasser Abdul Jaleel Mohammed ar Rujoub; and (iii) Mohammed Abdul Jaleel Mohammed ar Rujoub. • <u>House Demolition:</u> The Israeli army demolished a house belonging to Mahmoud Abdul 'Aziz as Suweiti in the town of Beit 'Awwa. • <u>Injuries:</u> At 18:40, the Israeli army pursued a bus transporting 25 workers east of the town of Yatta. As a result, the bus turned over. A number of workers were injured and transported to hospital for medical treatment. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 22:10, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat Sami Saleem Mohammed Abu Markhiyyeh along Ash Shuhada' Street in the old city of Hebron, leaving him with contusions. As a result, Abu Markhiyyeh was transported to hospital for medical treatment. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was resumed in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. • <u>Violations of the Ceasefire:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilians and property in the districts of Khan Yunis and Rafah. Israeli troops opened fire from its location on the Green Line towards civilian houses and property in the district of Gaza. (ii) On 2 occasions, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops near the Green Line.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.

GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. • <u>Palestinian Attacks/Israeli Attacks:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:45, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards an Israeli army patrol near the Green Line. Consequently, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory east of Gaza city. (ii) In the evening of 25 April 2010, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards an Israeli army patrol near the Green Line. Consequently, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory east of Ash Shuja'iyah neighbourhood east of Gaza city.
