JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to increase restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoint: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. Raids: At 2:25am, the Israeli Army raided Qalandiya Refugee Camp and searched a number of houses. Confrontations took place between Israeli troops and residents, during which 2 civilians, including a Security officer were, killed. Two civilians were also arrested and one was injured. Killing: Israeli Troops killed 2 civilians in Qalandiya refugee camp including: (i) A Palestinian Security Officer Ali Kalefa (ii) Moutasim Issa Odwan. Arrests: Israeli troops detained 2 civilians at a checkpoint near the connecting road leading to the Districts of Jerusalem, Ramallah and Jericho including: (

• Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in (i) Abu Dis town. The Israeli army continues to deny civilians access through the Wall (ii) gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil and Saffa villages as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. Raids: At dawn, Israeli forces raided Al-Mughier village, searched homes (i) and arrested a civilian. At 12:30, Israeli forces raided and patrolled El-Bireh city. (ii) At 19:50, Israeli forces raided Deir Abu Masha'al village during (iii) RAMALLAH which confrontations ensued between the Israeli forces and & residents AL BIREH Arrest: The civilian arrested in Mugheir village was Munthir Adnan Na'san • Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages. **Closure of Main Road:** The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. Raids: (i) At 08:00, Israeli forces raided Thahir Alabed village. At 19:50, Israeli forces raided Al-Jalmat village until 22:00. (ii) At 21:00, Israeli forces raided Deir Abu Da'if village and served 2 (iii) civilians summon orders to report to Israeli Intelligence: **JENIN** (i) Ibrahim Khalil Arif Yasin. (ii) Adel Mohammad Amin A'liat Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.

TUBAS	Checkpoint: By allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to restrict access through Tayasir checkpoint, east of Tubas city.
TULKAREM	Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinians' access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Fiving Checkpoints: (i) At 10:00 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to 'Alar town and searched civilians and vehicles (ii) At 11:00 Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint on Kafriyat road (which connects Tulkarim and Qalqilya Districts) and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 17:00 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Faru'n Village and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At 5:30, on 31/7/2011 Israeli forces raided Tulkarem city and arrested a civilian. (ii) At 9:40, Israeli forces raided Seyda village. (iii) At 22:40, Israeli forces raided Deir Al Ghsoun Village. Arrest: the civilian arrested during raid of Tulkarem City was Omar Mohammad Al sheikh Qassim. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route has resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	Closure of Roads: Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. In addition to closing the iron gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i> , the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.

• Flying Checkpoints :

(i) At 13:00 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzunn village. At 20:30, Israeli forces set up another flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raid:

- (i) At 17:50, Israeli forces raided Jayous town during which confrontations took place between residents and the troops.
- (ii) At 19:15, Israeli forces raided 'Azzunn and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to Al-Naqura village opposite the illegal settlement Shavei Shomron.

NABLUS

• Checkpoints:

The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

- (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
- (iii) At 19:40, Israeli forces restricted access to Huwwara checkpoint

and impeded the free flow of traffic.

Flying Checkpoints:

- At 15:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to (i) Azmout village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- From 18:50 to 20:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the (ii) junction to Sarra village on the Nablus-Qaliqiliya main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- At 23:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the bypass (iii) road near Madma village and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- At 00:15, Israeli forces raided Awarta village. (i)
- At 00:55, Israeli forces raided Biet I'ba town, searched several (ii) homes and arrested 2 civilian (brothers).

Arrests:

The tow brothers arrested in the town of Biet I'ba were:

- (i) Bader Ahmad Abu Namous.
- (ii) Khalid Ahmad Abu Namous.

Settler Violence:

On the 31st of July, 2011, a group of Israeli Settlers from Shevot Arhell settlement set fire to agricultural land located in Khaldoun village, destroying several Olive trees

Closure of Main Roads:

- The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the northern (i) entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Brugin town.
- The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to (ii) two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland.
- Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern (iii) entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.

Checkpoint:

The Israeli army continues restrict civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. At 19:15 Israeli forces blocked access at the checkpoint but resumed access at a later time.

Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Skaka village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafil Haris town and arrested a civilian

Raids:

- At 20:00, Israeli forces raided Kafil Haris town and searched a (i)
- At 20:45, Israeli forces raided and patrolled Rafaat village. (ii)

	• Arrest:
	the civilian arrested during Israeli raid of Kafil Harris village was Hassan Sharif Fayiz Dawud.
	Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks. Checkpoints: Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area. At 19:15 Israeli forces continue to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district as well as to others holding access permits. Flving Checkpoints: At 17:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city. At 20:40, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 23:30.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the southeastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. Flying Checkpoint: (i) At 12:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on Al-Nashash junction and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) From 16:50 to 17:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the North-West entrance to Beit Jala City and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At 08:55, Israeli forces raided Al 'Ubeidiya town. (ii) At 22:36, Israeli forces raided Al Shou'ara village. (iii) At 1:30, Israeli forces raided Hus'an village and arrested a civilian.

- (v) At 02:00, Israeli forces raided Beit Jala city.
- (vi) At 03:00, Israeli forces raided and patrolled Biet Sahour city.

• Arrest:

Israeli forces arrested *Mohammad Saleh Za'ol* during its raid into Husan village.

• **Demonstration:**

At 09:30 a peaceful demonstration, attended by international peace activists, took place in Al Walja village in protest against Israel's confiscation of land. Confrontations ensued between the protestors and Israeli forces, during which a number of participants suffocated from teargas inhalation.

• Wall Construction:

Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al-Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Al-Shalala Old Street in Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to As Simiya village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Bani Na'im town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 10:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Fahs area south of Hebron city and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 15:30, Israeli forces raided and patrolled Halhul town.
- (ii) At 23:00, Israeli forces raided and patrolled Krisa village.
- (iii) At 02:00, Israeli forces raided and patrolled Ras Al Taweel village.

Hebron

• Wall Construction:

Wall construction has resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011.
- <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army opened fire from its location on the Green Line in Rafah district.
- <u>Violation of the Ceasefire:</u> Armed Palestinian individuals fired mortars towards the Green Line

NORTHERN GAZA

- <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously coordinated critically ill patients, foreign journalists, international organization staff, business people and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through *Al karama* (Allenby) bridge in the West Bank.
- <u>Palestinian Attack</u>: During the afternoon of July 31 2011, armed Palestinian individuals fired mortars towards the Green Line.

GAZA

• Closure of Crossing Points:

- (i) Al-Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
- (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.

• Closure of Crossing Points:

- (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed.
- (ii) Rafah (*Al 'Awdah*) Crossing was open to civilians departing from the Gaza Strip and to others arriving from Egypt.
- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.

RAFAH

(iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, and cooking gas. In addition to 20 vehicles imported by the private sector, construction cargo designated to internationally-funded projects was transported through the Crossing.

• Attacks:

On the 31st of July, 2011, the Israeli army repeatedly opened fire from its location on the Green Line towards farm land located near the outskirts of Al-Shouka village, east of Rafah city
