JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to increase restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba’. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from the town of Al-Ram. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • Checkpoint: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On the morning of August 2nd 2011, Israeli forces raided A’sawia village, searched homes and arrested 3 civilians. (ii) At 10:00, Israeli forces raided Jaba' village. • Arrests: Israeli forces arrested 3 civilians during their raid on A’sawia village: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Majd Darwish (ii) Shadi Dary (iii) Ahmad Sharaf Hamdan • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilians access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.

<p style="text-align: center;">RAMALLAH & AL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil and Saffa villages as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 20:30, Israeli forces raided Silwad village.. • Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area west of ‘Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement ‘Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
<p style="text-align: center;">JENIN</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Physical Assault: At 15:50 civilian Usayed Abdallah Zitawi was severely beaten inside Israel and suffered severe contusions . He was later admitted to a governmental hospital in Jenin. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
<p style="text-align: center;">TUBAS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: By allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to restrict access through Tayasir checkpoint, east of Tubas city. • Raid: At 11:10, Israeli forces erected several tents and opened fire near Aqba village.
<p style="text-align: center;">TULKAREM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and ‘Izbat Shufa villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinians’ access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 20:45 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint along Alkafriyat road connecting Tulkarem and Qalqilya and searched civilian and vehicles. At 22:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of Kifin village and searched civilians and vehicles. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route has resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.

<p style="text-align: center;">QALQILYA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun. (ii) In addition to closing the iron gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • <u>Flying Checkpoints :</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. At 13:45 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qalqilya city and searched civilians and vehicles ii. At 19:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Alnabi Elyas village and searched civilians and vehicles iii. At 23:20 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of Aljit village and searched civilians and vehicles.. . • <u>Raid:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At 13:50 Israeli forces raided Alnabi Saleh village and searched a home. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction has resumed in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.
<p style="text-align: center;">NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to Al-Naqura village opposite the illegal settlement Shavei Shomron. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all

	<p>other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.</p> <p>(ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raid: At 12:30, Israeli forces raided Qusin village and detained Suhaib Nitham Abd Rabo for a short time then withdrew at 14:00.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland.</p> <p>(iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.</p> • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues restrict civilian access at the Za’tara junction checkpoint. At 19:15 Israeli forces blocked access at the checkpoint but resumed access at a later time. • Flying Checkpoints: <p>(i)</p> <p>(ii) At 20:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Salfit city and Iskaka village and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> • Settler Violence: At 06:20, a group of Israeli settlers trespassed into agricultural land west of Iskaka village and Wadi Al-Shaa’er area north of salfit. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al ‘Auja village with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <p>(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area.</p> <p>(ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al ‘Auja village along Al-Mu’arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others holding access permits.</p> • Flying Checkpoints: At 21:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city and detained and physically

	<p>assaulted 4 civilians, including a woman and a security officer.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Physical Assault : Israeli forces physically assaulted 4 civilians at a checkpoint in Jericho:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) <u>Mohammad Nasr Hussni Ghanam, a security officer</u> (ii) <u>Alia mohammad Harbi, a female civilian.</u> (iii) <u>Dawod Adel Hanoun</u> (iv) <u>Mohammad Jamal Jouda</u> • <u>Arrest: On August 1st 2011 Israeli troops positioned on Al Karama (Allenby) bridge arrested Mohammad Nabil Abu Hussien as he was travelling to Jordan.</u> • :
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • <u>Flying Checkpoints :</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 8:30, Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint on Road 60 near Alkhadir town and impeded the free flow of traffic until 11:35. (ii) At 10:20 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the north-west entrance of Biet Jala city. (iii) At 14:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Dar Salah village near the eastern entrance of Biet Sahur city and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 23:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Nahalin village and searched civilians and vehicles. (v) At 00:40 Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint on Al Nashash junction (Southern entrance of Bethlahem) and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raid:</u> At 22:30 the Israeli forces raided Al-Khader village, searched a number of home and arrested a University student and withdrew at 01:40. • Arrest: Israeli forces arrested the university student Mohamad Abdallah Otwan during their raid into Al khadir village. • Military Posts: At 17:15 Israeli forces erected a military post overlooking a home in Al Ebat area (Area C: under Israeli Military and Administrative control) located south of Bethlehem. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.
Hebron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old

In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al-Laban Market with iron plates.</p> <p>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Al-Shalala Old Street in Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 9:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Tarmat and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 10:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Beit Al-Roush Altahta. (iii) At 18:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the northern entrance of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 19:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-A'dseyeh village and searched civilians and vehicles. (v) At 19:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance Tarwusa and searched civilians and vehicles. (vi) At 19:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of Biet Anun village and searched civilians and vehicles. (vii) At 20:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of Farsh Al hawwa north of Hebron city and searched civilians and vehicles. ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011. •
NORTHERN GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously coordinated critically ill patients, foreign journalists, international organization staff, business people and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through <i>Al karama</i> (Allenby) bridge in the West Bank •
GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing was open to civilians departing from the Gaza Strip and to others arriving from Egypt. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, and cooking

	<p>gas. In addition to 24 vehicles imported by the private sector, construction cargo designated to internationally-funded projects was transported through the Crossing.</p>
