Assault on Places of Worship	1	—	1	The Israeli Minister of Public works and Housing along with several Israeli settlers stormed Al-Aqsa mosque compound.
Settler Violence	2	—	2	Israeli settlers gathered around the home owned by Abu Al-Rajab family in the old city of Hebron and chanted racist slogans and demanding the family leave the home in order to for settlers to take over the home and opened fire towards a vehicle in Beit Anoun village in Hebron.

<p style="text-align: center;">JERUSALEM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army, intensified their restrictions at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city and prevented worshipers under the age of 40 from conducting prayers at Al-Aqsa mosque compound. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) On September 19th 2012, Israeli forces closed Ras Khamis checkpoint near Shu’fat camp and impeded the free flow of traffic in order to construct the wall. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 09:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near “Malee Adumin” settlement until 10:15. • <u>Raid:</u> At 18:30, Israeli forces raided Biddu village (After a resident allegedly ran over 3 Israeli soldiers near Sinjil village in Ramallah), clashed with several residents as they stormed Raed Badowan’s home and as a result injured 3 residents and left several others suffocated from tear gas inhalation, detained a resident, confiscated a computer then withdrew at 20:30. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Ashraf Badwan in Bidou village. • <u>Assault on Places of Worship:</u> At 09:00, a group of Israeli settlers under the protection of Israeli Military and Police Officers stormed Al-Aqsa mosque compound and provoked worshipers. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Slewahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAMALLAH & AL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) At 21:40 on June 30th 2015, Israeli forces closed the main road near “Bet El” settlement leading to Al-Jalazoun camp with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> At 15:35, Israeli forces closed down Al-Mahakma checkpoint located near “Bet El” settlement located in North Al-Bireh city and impeded the free flow of traffic until reopening it at 17:50. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:05, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Atarah bridge located in North Bir Zeit. (ii) At 16:05, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Ain Sinya village junction until 18:40. (iii) At 16:05, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Ayoun Al-Haramiya area junction (located along the main road connecting Ramallah and Nablus) until 18:40. (iv) At 01:15, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint between Deir Ibzi’ and Ain Arik villages until 03:30. • <u>Raid:</u> At 02:00, Israeli forces raided Beituniya and summoned Assad Haddad to report to Israeli Intelligence for questioning then withdrew at 03:30. • <u>Attack:</u> At 15:25, Israeli forces positioned near Sinjil opened fire towards a vehicle (after it allegedly ran over and injured three Israeli soldiers) as a result left the driver critically injured. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Raed Badwan (A resident of Biddo village in Jerusalem) after opening fire towards him and left him critically injured. • <u>Temporary Detention:</u> At 19:45, Israeli forces temporarily detained Raniya Jabarin (A resident of Ramallah) and then released her after assaulting her and as a result left her hospitalised with contusions.
<p style="text-align: center;">JENIN</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. (ii) Since the evening of November 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the western entrance of Ya’bad. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> Israeli forces continue too close the wall gate and only allow those holding special permits to enter through it.
<p style="text-align: center;">TULKAREM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Checkpoint:</u> Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at “Eniv” checkpoint located along the main road connecting Tulkarem and Nablus and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Raid:</u> At 09:05, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem until 11:00.
<p style="text-align: center;">QALQILIYA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of Azzun town. (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second Intifada, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. (iii) Since 16:55 on December 18th 2014, Israeli forces closed an agricultural road leading to Far’ata village which is located near “Gillad” settlement with dirt mounds • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Qaddum village. (ii) At 12:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Jit village junction and detained three residents. (iii) At 13:55 and again at 02:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Qalqiliya. (iv) At 15:35, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Lafik village.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (v) At 16:05, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Izbit Al-Tabib village. (vi) At 20:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Nabi Eliyas village. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained three residents: Fateh Allah Ashour, Firas Abdel-Khaliq and Ameer Akkawi (All residents of Tulkarem). • <u>Destruction of Property:</u> At 11:00, Israeli forces levelled 3-bypass road, which lead to Kafr Qaddum village and uprooted several Olive trees. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and impeded the free flow of traffic. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al- Rasha and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
<p style="text-align: center;">NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> Since December 17th 2013, Israeli forces ordered the closure 500 dunumes of land in Qusra village as a closed military area. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Til-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 10:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near “Yitsahar” settlement junction located in North Huwara until 11:30. • <u>Raid:</u> At 03:00 on August 6th 2015, Israeli forces raided Nablus and detained a resident. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Samah Nassif in Nablus.
<p style="text-align: center;">SALFIT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) On 15.04.2012, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian, which was closed since the year 2000 and prevented access from 08:00 until 09:20. (iii) Since 11:00 on July 30th 2012, Israeli forces have closed two roads leading to Abu Nasar and Qatan Al-Jama’ located in western area of Deir Istiya with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at Za’tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.
<p style="text-align: center;">JERICHO</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces intensified its restrictions at Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus District. (ii) At 12:30, Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at “Malee Afaarim” settlement and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 19:50, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the Dead Sea junction until 21:00. • <u>Raid:</u>

	<p>(i) At 23:40, Israeli forces raided Al-Oja village, forcibly shut down several merchant shops located along road (90) for the alleged stoning of an Israeli Ambulance then withdrew at 00:50.</p> <p>(ii) At 01:45, Israeli forces raided Jericho and summoned Fadi Khalayteh to report to Israeli Intelligence for questioning then withdrew at 02:00.</p>
<p>BETHLEHEM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunumes of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road between Um Tuba and Al-Jass ; a road between Um Tuba and Khilat Nu'man: a road between Um Tuba and the wall; a road between Al-Khas village and the wall; the 2 by pass roads located south of Al-Walaja; a road between Talita Qumi and Nazlat Al-Sider in Beit Jala; the eastern road of Al-Khader; the road between Al-Khader and Beit Jala ; Wadi Rahal road near "Ifrat" settlement ,the road between Al-Khader and road #60 which lead to the eastern neighbourhoods of Bethlehem; a road leading to Wadi Rahal, and a road east of Beit Fajjar town with dirt mounds. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road leading to "Newe Daniyyel" settlement and agricultural land in Al-Khader; a road between Um Tuba and Wadi Al-Hums: Wadi Fukin, Al-Jaba, the Green Line; a road between Za'tara and a detour road, and a road between Taqou and Khirbet Al-Deir with cement blocks. (iii) Since August 2nd 2012, Israeli forces closed a road leading to Beit Jalla. (iv) Since May 8th 2013, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Carmisan area in Beit Jalla and Al-Walaja with a steel gate and barbed wires. (v) Since June 3rd 2013, the Israeli army closed the road connecting Nihalin and road 60 with dirt mounds. (vi) Since 13:20 on September 29th 2013, the Israeli army closed a road leading to 50 acres of agricultural land in Wadi Salem area in Al-Khadr with dirt mounds. (vii) Israeli forces closed the main road connecting Surif and Al-Jub'a village with dirt mounds. (viii) On January 28th 2014, Israeli forces closed the steel gate at the entrance of Nihalin { replacing the dirt mounds placed at the entrance since the year 2002 } and placed time schedule for opening the gate from 06:00 until 14:00 on a daily bases. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the North entrance of Taqou'. (ii) At 21:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the West entrance of Jorat Al-Sham'a until 22:35. • <u>Raid:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 23:00, Israeli forces raided Taqou' until 00:30. (ii) At 01:35, Israeli forces raided Beit Fajjar, clashed with several residents as they stormed several homes and summoned Nasser Thawabteh to report to Israeli Intelligence for questioning.

HEBRON

- **Closure:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
 - (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.
- **Closure of Main Roads:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
 - (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
 - (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
 - (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to e to Al-Simiya village, the southern entrance of Al-Samou' and the entrance of Beit Annun with cement blocks.
 - (v) Since July 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Safa and Al-Dirat and closed the entrance of south Yatta with cement blocks.
- **Flying Checkpoint:**
 - (i) At 10:50 and again at 20:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Ithna until 21:30.
 - (ii) At 19:05, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Sufa village junction located in North West Beit Ummar.
 - (iii) At 21:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Oroub camp, temporarily detained Muhanad Khiran (A National Security Force Officer) then released him at a later time then withdrew at 22:10.
 - (iv) At 22:15, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Al-Nabi Yunis area junction located along the main road connecting Bethlehem and Jericho until 23:30.
 - (v) At 23:25, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Huwar area located at the North entrance of Halhoul.
- **Raid:** At 23:35, Israeli forces raided Al-Dowarat and Al-Duyy'eiseh area located near Sa'ir and clashed with several residents.
- **Detention:** At 19:00, Israeli forces positioned at the entrance of Beit Ummar detained the child Mohanad Arrar(16 years old).
- **Settler Violence:**
 - (i) At 21:05, a group of Israeli settlers gathered around the home owned by Abu Al-Rajab family in the old city of Hebron and chanted racist slogans and demanding the family leave the home in order to for settlers to take over the home.
 - (ii) At 01:10, a group of Israeli settlers positioned near Beit Abuon village junction opened fire towards a vehicle owned by Mahmoud Alameh and as a result damaged the vehicle.

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 19:00 on August 26th 2014, Palestinian Gunmen and the Israeli military agreed to a cease fire agreement (brokered by the Arab Republic of Egypt) which includes the opening of border crossings to allow the entry of emergency supplies and humanitarian goods as well as construction material and agreed to increase the fishing limit to 6 nautical miles with possibility of increase to 12 nautical miles by the end of the year and to decrease the Military area to 100 meters, allow freedom of movement and a halt to targeted killings and assassinations and negotiations will be held for discussion on rebuilding the sea port and airports in the coming month.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for the passage of critical patients, journalists, NGO staff, businesspersons and passengers travelling abroad through Al-Karama crossing with previous coordination.
<p style="text-align: center;">GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAFAH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points :</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is closed. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the entry of tourist and foreign diplomats and the entry of Humanitarian assistance and construction material funded by UNRWA.
