JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to increase restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from the town of Al-Ram. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. Raids: At 14:00 Israeli forces raided Al Eizariya town until 16:00 Obstruction of Access to Places of Worship: On the evening of August 7th 2011 Israeli police raided the Al-Aqsa Mosque Compound while worshipers were praying Tarawih Prayers (Prayers during the Holy Month of Ramadan) and forced 30 worshipers to exit the mosque. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilians access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil and Saffa villages as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 21:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the enterance of Silwad town and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 02:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the bridge

	at Yabrud village and searched civilians and vehicles.		
	(i) From 21:10 to 23:40, Israeli forces raided Al Jalazoun Refugee camp and set up a checkpoint at the entrance of the camp. (ii) From 06:40 to 23:40, Israeli forces raided El Berih city and searched Al-Huda Gas station.		
	Settler Violence: (i) At 20:50, Israeli settlers from Bet El settlement threw stones at civilian vehiclesalong the main road in El Berih city. The settlers later threw stones at civilian vehicles and homes along the main road leading to Jalazoun camp.		
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.		
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall. 		
TUBAS	Checkpoints: By allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to restrict access through Tayasir checkpoint, east of Tubas city.		
	 Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinians' access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. 		
TULKAREM	 Raids: At 14:30, Israeli forces raided Al-Shweika neighbourhood in Tulkarem city and set up a checkpoint in the area. Flying Checkpoints: At 20:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Ramin village and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 3:30 on August 7th 2011, Israeli forces raided Nazlat Issa village and detained 2 civilians, including a child. At 09:55, Israeli forces raided the villages of Anabta and Kufur Ruman. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route has resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the 		
	village.

Closure of Roads:

- (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.
- (ii) In addition to closing the iron gate installed since the outbreak the second *Intifada*, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Oaddum village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- i. At 9:15 and again at 14:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qalqilya city and searched civilians and vehicles.
- ii. At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kufr Laqif village and searched civilians and vehicles.

At 18:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzun town and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to Al-Naqura village opposite the illegal settlement Shavei Shomron.

• <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

- (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

• Flying checkpoints:

NABLUS

	 (i) At 20:00, Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Biet Fourik village. (ii) At 22:35, Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint near the junction of Esawiya village, searching civilians and vehicles then detaining a civilian. • <u>Detentions:</u> At 14:45 Israeli forces detained the civilian Mohammad Radwan Nawaf Awad at the flying checkpoint in Asawia village.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland. Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years. Checkpoints: At 10:30, Israeli forces increased its restrictions on Zatara checkpoint and impeded civilian movement. Flying checkpoints: At 19:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qarawat Bani Hasan village and searched civilians and vehicles until 20:10.
	 <u>Temporary Detentions</u>: At 09:15, Israeli forces detained Palestinian security officer Wahib Yousef Sliem Odeh at Za'tara checkpoint and released him at 10:20. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks. Checkpoints: Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area. Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others holding access permits.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the southeastern area of the village. Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting

Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.

• <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction has resumed in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al-Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Al-Shalala Old Street in Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 9:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Ithna village and detained Kamal Slima, a Palestinian police officer, and released him at a later time
- (ii) At 09:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Nabi Younis neighbourhood (On the main road connecting Hebron with Bethlehem), searching civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 8:45, Israeli forces raided Dura town until 10:30.
- (ii) At 17:05, Israeli forces raided Yatta town.
- (iii) At 20:00, Israeli forces raided Beit Ummar town and detained a University student.
- (iv) At 23:15, Israeli forces raided Wadi Khnies neighbourhood North of Halhul town and fired sound and flash grenades.

Detentions:

- (i) At 22:50 on August 6th 2011, Israeli forces detained 2 civilians in addition to those reported in the previous report, including a minor, during their raid into Biet Umar:
 - 1. Mohammad Amin Mohammad Al khalil, 15 years old.
 - 2. Afif Ibrahim Abdallah Awad.
- (ii) At 01:25 on August 7th 2011, Israeli forces detained the civilian Mohammad Deif Allah Al Hariq.
- (iii) The civilian detained in Biet Ummar is Abada Ahmad Khalil Al alami.
 - Settler Violence: At 21:00, an Israeli settler opened fire on a Palestinian home in Hebron's Old City. Israeli forces later intervened and searched 2

homes. • Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011. Attacks: Israeli forces raided and attacked neighbourhoods in Rafah and Gaza. Palestinian Attacks: Armed Palestinian groups fired 4 rockets towards the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u> : Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously coordinated critically ill patients, foreign journalists, international organization staff, business people and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through <i>Al karama</i> (Allenby) bridge in the West Bank.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Raids: At 23:00, Israeli forces escorting military bulldozers raided Al Shija'iya neighbourhood, opened fire and levelled agricultural land in the area. Palestinian Attacks: During the evening of August 7th 2011, armed Palestinians fired unidentified rockets towards the Green Line. At 00:10, armed Palestinians fired 3 rockets inside the Green Line.
CENTRAL GAZA	No incidents reported.
KHAN YUNIS	No incidents reported.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to civilians departing from the Gaza Strip and to others arriving from Egypt. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, and cooking gas. Raids: On the morning of August 7th 2011, Israeli forces escorted by military aircrafts raided Al-Shawkah neighbourhood north of Rafah, attacked farmers and levelled land in the area.

Palestinian Detainees and Prisoners in Israeli Detention

The Ministry of Detainees confirmed reports that 40 prisoners suffered food poisoning as a result of eating expired dairy products in Alnaqab Desert prison.
