RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.</li> <li>Checkpoints: At 14:20, Israeli forces intensified its restrictions on Al-Mahkama checkpoint near Bet Eil settlement, located north of El Bireh city and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>Flying Checkpoints: <ol> <li>At 02:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Um Suffa village and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.</li> </ol> </li></ul>
JENIN	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.</li> <li>Flying Checkpoints: <ol> <li>At 00:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Kafr Ra'i town and Fahma village, searching civilians and vehicles until 00:45.</li> <li>At 01:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of A'tara village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>

According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
	Closure of Roads:     Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.      In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second Intifada, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.

	<ul> <li>Wall Gates: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.</li> </ol> </li></ul>
NABLUS	Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan

	town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.
	<ul> <li>Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:         <ol> <li>Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.</li> <li>At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Flying checkpoints:         <ol> <li>At 14:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Salem village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
SALFIT	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Roads:         <ul> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the northern entrance to Bruqin town.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.</li> <li>Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.</li> <li>Checkpoints: Israeli forces continue imposing restrictions on Zatara checkpoint and obstructing the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>Flving checkpoints:</li></ul></li></ul>
	<ul> <li>Detention: At 01:40, Israeli forces detained Palestinian security officer, Raed Nasha't Adel Al-Nadi at Za'tara checkpoint.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.</li> </ul>
JERICHO	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.</li> <li>Checkpoints:         <ul> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to 23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	while searching the surrounding area.  (ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-'Auja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits.  • Flying Checkpoints:  (i) At 09:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho. The checkpoint was set up again at20:25 and 02:30 until 03:10. Civilians and vehicles were searched.
BETHLEHEM	<ul> <li>Closure:         <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>Flying Checkpoints:         <ul> <li>(i) At 24:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Al-Nashash junction, near the southern entrance Bethlehem, and searched city civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Demonstrations: At 09:10, a demonstration against Israels confiscation of land and construction of the wall took place in Al Walja village and included international peace activists. Israeli forces prevented demonstrators from reaching the site being razed by Israeli bulldozers; confrontations ensued, with several protestors reporting injury from teargas inhalation. In addition, Israeli forces searched a home, detained a civilian and 10 international peace activists.</li> <li>Detentions: Israeli forces detained the civilian , Hisham Khalid Al-Atrash in Al-Walja village.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Hebron	<ul> <li>Closure: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and</li> </ol> </li></ul>

denied them access to the area.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 16:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Yatta and Samo' towns, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 16:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Halhoul town, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 16:50 and again at 20:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Hebron, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 19:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpointon the junction between I'thna town and Deir Samet village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 20:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Al-Surra village searching civilians and vehicles.

#### Raids:

- (i) At 11:45, Israeli forces raided Khalet Saleh village, located south of Yatta town.
- (ii) At 19:00, Israeli forces raided Sinjer area, located between Hebron and Dura.
- (iii) At 20:50, Israeli forces raided E'in Qanar area near Dura village.
- (iv) At 21:30, Israeli forces raided Yatta town.
- (v) At 01:30, Israeli forces raided Nubba village, searched a home and fired sound grenades then withdrew at 04:30.
- (vi) At 01:35, Israeli forces raided Surif town.
- (vii) At 06:10, Israeli forces raided the Haninieh neighbourhood in Dura town and searched 2 homes.

#### • Attacks:

(i) At 21:00, Israeli forces fired tear gas and sound grenades towards civilians in Al-A'rub refugee camp, allegedly because of a stone throwing incident.

#### • Detentions:

1. At 21:00 Israeli forces detained the civilian Ghassan Iz Al-Dien Abu Hadidnear the Ibrahimi mosques and physically assaulted him

# • Settler Violence:

- (i) At 16:00, Israeli settlers demolished a fence surrounding a home belonging to the civilian Fayiz Al-Ahmad..
- (ii) At 18:00, Israeli settlers threw stones towards at the home of Mohammad Hamed Abu Aiyash in Ta'l Al-Roumeda neighbourhood in Hebron's Old City.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction has resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.

#### **GAZA STRIP**

# At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian **ALL** groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been DISTRICTS further renewed on 10 April 2011. Attacks: Israeli Naval forces opened fire at Palestinian fishing boats at sea, off the coast of central Gaza. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to coordinated critically ill patients, foreign journalists, **NORTHERN** previously international organization staff, business people and civilians intending to GAZA travel to Jordan through *Al karama* (Allenby) bridge in the West Bank. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al-Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, (i) the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli **GAZA** decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January (ii) 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Attacks: On the morning of August 11th 2011, Israeli Naval unites **CENTRAL** opened fire towards Palestinian fishing boats off the coast of Al-**GAZA** Nusairat refugee camp in central Gaza. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to civilians departing from the Gaza Strip and to others arriving from Egypt. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for transportation **RAFAH** of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, and cooking gas. In addition to construction cargo designated to internationally funded projects was transported to the Gaza strip through the crossing.
