JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. Raids: At 03:00, Israeli forces raided Qalandia refugee camp and confrontations ensued between civilians and Israeli forces and withdrew at 04:00. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; and in Wa			
	• Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.			
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	 Flying Checkpoints: At 09:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Al-Tayba village (on the road connecting Ramallah and Jericho) and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban 			
JENIN	Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages. Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.			

	Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services
	for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Checkpoints: At 10:00, the Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 10:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Beit Lid village, searching civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 17:45, Israeli forces raided Beit Lid village. Detention: At 13:45, Israeli forces detained the civilian Hamza Fathi Qara'wi at "Einav" on Tulkarem-Nablus road. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route was suspended in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village because of the Sabbath holiday.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 09:00 and again at 20:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Hajja village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 09:00 and again at 19:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Jinsafut village, searching civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 09:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Immatin and Kafr Laqif villages. (iv) At 17:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of 'Azzun town, searching civilians and vehicles. (v) At 07:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Jit village, searching civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows

NABLUS	the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • Wall Construction: Wall construction has halted in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement because of Sabbath holiday. • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood. (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and
	ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. • Flying checkpoints:
	(i) At 12:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Deir Sharaf, searching civilians and vehicles.
	(ii) At 14:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Salim
	village, searching civilians and vehicles until 15:10.
	 Raids: (i) At 17:00, Israeli forces raided Beit Furik and Khirbet Tana villages.
	(ii) At 01:00, Israeli forces raided Nablus city and Balata camp,
	confrontations ensued between the residents and Israeli forces, searched 3
	homes, temporarily detained 2 cilvillians and detained 2more civilians:
	Omar Khalili Dweikat and Saber Sulaiman withdrawing at 01:55.
	• <u>Detentions:</u> Israeli forces detained 2 civilians during its raid into Nablus city: Thaer Na'im Masoud Dweikat and Jaber Fayez Jaber Jia'an.
	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the northern entrance to Bruqin town.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two
	detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
SALFIT	(iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
	• Checkpoints: Israeli forces continue imposing restrictions on Zatara checkpoint
	and obstructing the free flow of traffic.
	Flying checkpoints.
	At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Deir Istiya
	town and searched civilians and vehicles until 11:40.

	Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel because of Jewish Sabbath holiday.
JERICHO	Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.
	Checkpoints: (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to 23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding area.
	 (ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-'Auja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits. Flying Checkpoints:
	At 19:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho. The checkpoint was set up again at 20:55 and 06:10 until 06:45. Civilians and vehicles were searched. At 21:55 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of the village Fassayal. Civilians and vehicles were searched.
	Raids: At 23:00, Israeli forces raided Fasayil village and searched a home.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 12:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Al-Nashash junction, near the southern entrance Bethlehem. The checkpoint was set up again at 21:25, and searched city civilians and vehicles until 21:55.At 15:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the main road connecting Bethlehem and Hebron, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 03:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the north-western entrance of Beit Jala city. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended northwest of Beit Jala town because of Sabbath holiday.
Hebron	Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.

(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the northern entrance of Hebron and detained a Palestinian National security officer.
- (ii) At 17:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Khursa village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 20:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Hebron, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 20:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance of Al Nabi Younis neighbourhood north of Hebron city, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 20:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Halhoul village searching civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 20:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the bridge leading to Halhoul village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- Raids: At 12:40, Israeli forces raided Hebron city and set up 2 flying checkpoints in the area.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 16:00, Israeli settlers trespassed onto privately owned agricultural land and planted trees.
- <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 16:00, a demonstration, including international peace activists took place in Biet Ummar in protest against attacks by Israeli settlers against Palestinian farmers. While intercepting the demonstration, Israeli forces assaulted and injured 4 protesters leaving them with contusions and detaining another protester.

• <u>Detentions:</u>

- (i) Israeli forces detained Mo'tasim Ahmad Zidat, a National security officer at a flying checkpoint located on the northern entrance of Hebron.
- (ii) Israeli forces detained Saqir Abu Maria, a demonstrator at a flying checkpoint located near Biet Ummar.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town because of the Jewish Sabbath holiday.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011. Attacks: Armed Palestinians fired projectiles towards locations in the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was closed. Palestinian Attack: On the evening of August 13th 2011 armed Palestinian individuals fired projectiles towards the Green Line.
GAZA	Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to civilians departing from the Gaza Strip and to others arriving from Egypt. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed.
