JERUSALEM	Closure:  (i) The Israeli army continues its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.  Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.  Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.  Attack: At 1:30 on August 14th 2011, Israeli forces raided several homes in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem, firing sound and teargas grenades towards civilians; they also detained 3 children.  Detention:  On August 13 2011, Israeli forces detained Ahmmad Herbawi from Silwaan.  The 3 children detained during the raid into Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem were:  (i) Musalam Musa Odeh, 11 years old.  (ii) Mohammad Odeh, 13 years old.  (iii) Kathim Abu Shafia', 17 years old.  Wall Cates:  The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians

	Closure of Main Roads:
	<ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the</li> </ul>
	southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
	(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.
NABLUS	(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and
	ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

	• <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 06:10 on August 14 <sup>th</sup> 2011, a group of Israeli settlers
	stoned civilian vehicles on the Ramallah –Nablus main road, injuring Asa'ad Shahin
	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the
	northern entrance to Bruqin town.
CAL EVE	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
SALFIT	(iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : Israeli forces restricted access at the Zatara checkpoint obstructed the free flow of traffic and detained 2 civilians.
	• <b>Detention:</b> Israeli forces at Zatara checkpoint detained the civilians:Mu'ataz and

	• Settlement Activity: Israeli Military Authority approved the expansion of 277
	housing units in "Ariel" settlement on civilian land north of Salfit city.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir
	Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
	• <u>Closure of Main Road</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.
	• Checkpoints:
	(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up
	along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to 23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding area.
JERICHO	(ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the
JERICHO	junction to Al-'Auja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho
	District and others with access permits.
	Flying Checkpoints:
	At 18:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of
	Jericho. The checkpoint was set up again at 01:35 and severely beat the civilian
	Mohammad Khalil A'faneh from Bethlehem afterwards he was hospitalized with
	severe contusions.
	• Raids: At 20:15, Israeli forces raided Fasayil village.
	• Closure:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
	(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from
	accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya
	area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
	• Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al
	Jab'a villages.
	• Flying Checkpoints:
BETHLEHEM	(i) At 10:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Al-Nashash junction, near the southern entrance Bethlehem. The checkpoint was set up again at 13:15; civilians and vehicles were searched.
	• Raids:
	(i) At 21:35, Israeli forces raided Um Al Rakaba neighbourhood in Al
	Khader village and set up a flying checkpoint and withdrew at 22:40.
	(ii) At 23:00, Israeli forces raided Tako'a town, searched 4 homes detained 4 civilians, two of them (Ziad Khalaf Jibril and Riyad Khalaf Jibril) were set
	free.
	(iii) At 00:40, Israeli forces raided Biet Jala city and set up a flying checkpoint near Palestinian security forces and withdrew at 01:10.
	• <u>Detentions:</u> Israeli forces detained 2 civilians during a raid of Tako'a village: Murad Sami Za'al Jibriel and Ahmad Kayed Khalaf Jibril
	Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.
	- Tran Construction of the Construction resulted northwest of Delt Jaia town.

#### **Closure:**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

#### **Closure of Main Roads:**

- The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-(i) Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as (iii) detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to (iv) the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

## **Flying Checkpoints:**

- At 11:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the northern (i) entrance of Biet Ummar, searching civilians and vehicles.
- At 14:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the bridge leading to (ii) Halhul village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 16:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance of Fawar refugee camp and prevented civilians from accessing a water well nearby.
- At 21:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance of (iv) Ithna village and fired flash grenades and again set up a check point at 07:50, searching civilians and vehicles.
- At 02:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Yatta and (v) Samoa' villages searching civilians and vehicles until 02:55.

### Raids:

- (i) At 14:05, Israeli forces raided Hebron city and occupied a home. Israeli forces raided Hebron city again at 17:00 and 19:55.
- (ii) At 01:25, Israeli forces raided Adh Dhahiriya village.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.
