ALL DISTRICS	• In disregard of the decision on settlement freeze, the Israeli Government decided to install 23 caravans in 8 settlements in the West Bank districts. To be used as classrooms, these caravans will be installed in the settlements of Adam, 'Ofra, 'Eli, Talmon, Itamar, Alon Moreh, 'Emanuel, and Efrat.

JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the AI Aqsa Mosque compound. (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. • Raid/Physical Assaults/Detentions: At 21:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. Israeli troops detained and severely beat 2 civilians (brothers): (i) Na

Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu (i) Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall (ii) gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement (i) blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian RAMALLAH access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. & **Flying Checkpoints:** EL BIREH At 13:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to (i) the town of Al Mazra'a al Gharbiya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to (ii) the town of 'Atara and impeded civilian access. Raid: At 18:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled At Tira neighbourhood in the city of Ramallah. Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flying Checkpoint/Detention/Confiscation of Property: At 22:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Qabatiya and the village of Mirka and searched civilians and vehicles. Israeli troops **JENIN** detained Ayman Mohammed Mahmoud Kamil, a Palestinian Preventive Security officer, confiscated his pistol, and released him at 23:30 after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO). Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

	 Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. Raid: At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Tammun, searched 2 houses, arrested 2 civilians, and withdrew at 02:50. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Tammun: Nadir Mahmoud Yousef Bisharat; and Mahmoud Abdullah Bisharat. Destruction of Property: On 14 August 2010, the Israeli army distributed
TUBAS	notices for the demolition and evacuation of a number of farmers' and shepherds' makeshift houses in the area of Al Farisiya in the Northern Jordan Valley, ostensibly because they were located in Area C, which is under full Israeli control. • Attack on Property: On 15 August 2010, the Israeli authorities disconnected the irrigation water source provided by the Israeli Mikorot Company to civilian farmland in the village of Bardala, under the pretext of inadequate water supplies. Continued cut off of the water supply may cause damage harvests in the village.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Raids: At 01:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Lid and the village of Saffarin. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Kafr Laqif and searched civilians and vehicles. At 12:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. Hat 02:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 02:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of An Nabi Elyas. Detentions: At 18:35, Israeli troops detained 2 civilians (brothers) near the village of 'Izbat at Tabib along the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road, and released them after interrogation and payment of a fine of NIS 1,000 (approximately USD 263). The civilians were: Banan Ahmed 'Odeh; and Bassam Ahmed 'Odeh.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate and cement blocks the southern entrance to the town of Jamma'in.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of 'Iraq Burin and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/Air Patrol:

- (i) At 22:40, Israeli troops dispatched by 3 combat helicopters raided and conducted military training on the outskirts of the village of Talluza.
- (ii) At 23:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Nablus.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 10:10, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to civilian farmland in the area between the villages of Qusra and Jalud, damaging a number of olive trees.

SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to 2 detour roads connecting the village of Marda to respective agricultural land. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Flying Checkpoint: At 06:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Bruqin and the village of Qarawat Bani Zeid
	 and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flving Checkpoint: At 06:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Ein ad Duyuk and searched civilians and vehicles.
ВЕТНІЕНЕМ	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a.

- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 22:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raids: At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Nahhalin and Husan.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:20, and again at 16:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles at the entrance to the area An Nabi Yunis near the town of Halhul on the Hebron-Bethlehem main road.

• Raids:

(i) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided Al Fawwar refugee camp and arrested a child.

HEBRON

- (ii) At 00:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army also searched a house, served a summons on Fahed Abu 'Eisheh to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the area of Wadi Ali in Adh Dhahiriya town and arrested a civilian.

• Arrests:

- (i) The Israeli army arrested 14-year-old Mohammed Abdullah Ahmaro in Al Fawwar refugee camp.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested Usamah Mohammed Ahmed an Najjar in Wadi Ali area in the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was resumed in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the

GAZA STRIP

Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 ALL February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the **DISTRICTS** ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. Violation of the Ceasefire: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire on civilian houses and property in the Rafah district. **NORTHERN** Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. GAZA **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (i) **GAZA** Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January (ii) 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. **CENTRAL** Activities were not reported. GAZA KHAN YUNIS Activities were not reported. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (i) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow (ii) **RAFAH** patients, students, civilians holding visas, and others leaving for Saudi Arabia to perform 'Umrah (minor pilgrimage to Mecca) to depart the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals.

- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
- (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
- Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: At dawn on 16 August 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by combat helicopters and reconnaissance aircraft, raided 200 metres into Palestinian territory east of An Nahda neighbourhood east of the city of Rafah. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled land.
