JERUSALEM	Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with a rion gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a 'border crossing point' and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. Detentions:			

RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages. Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the
JENIN	 Flying Checkpoints: At 13:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction Kafriyat village, searching civilians and vehicles. At 21:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of A'raba village, searching civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road, impeding the free flow of traffic. Flying checkpoints: At 20:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Faroun village, searching civilians and vehicles. Detention: At 20:45, Israeli forces detained 2 residents from Zieta village for entering Israel without a permit: Omar Jamal Nimer Rabah and Mahmoud Basam Nimer Rabah Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route has resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. Flying Checkpoints: At 14:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Immatin village, searching civilians and vehicles. At 18:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Jinssafut village, searching civilians and vehicles.

(iii) On the evening of August 17 th 2011, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near "Qadumin" settlement on the Nablus –Qalqilya main road and detained a civilian
 Attacks: At 0:15, Israeli forces opened fire near Jabal Qara' near Kafer Qadum village and fired sound grenandes.
 <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces positioned at a flying checkpoint on the Nablus – Qalqilya main road detained the civilian, Awadallah Jamil Eshtaya.
• Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at
 the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in Kafr Laqef village north
of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.
• Closure of Main Roads:
(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.
• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.
(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
(iii) At 08:55, Israeli forces increased restriction on civilian movement on Huwara checkpoint, impeding the free flow of traffic.
• Flying checkpoints:
(i) At 08:35 and again at 18:30 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Salim village, searching civilians and vehicles.
(ii) At 19:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of Yatta village, searching civilians and vehicles.
(iii) At 19:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of Sura village, searching civilians and vehicles.
(iv) At 20:20 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Awarata village, searching civilians and vehicles.
 Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the

	northern entrance to Bruqin town.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
	(iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : At23:00, Israeli forces intensified restrictions on Zatara checkpoint, obstructing the free flow of traffic and detained 2 civilians.

	(i) At 09:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kifil Harris village.
	(ii) At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Deir Ballout village, searching civilians and vehicles.
	(iii) At 14:45 and again at 07:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qarawat Bani Hassan, searching civilians and vehicles.
	(iv) At 21:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the western entrance
	of Kafr Al Dik village, searching civilians and vehicles.
	Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
	Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between
	Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.
	• Checkpoints:
	(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up
	along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to
	23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding
	area.

	• Closure:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the
	exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of
	the village.
BETHLEHEM	(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from
	accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya
	area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
	• <u>Closure of Main Roads</u> : The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi ,Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to
	Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al
	Jab'a villages.
	• Flying Checkpoints: At 20:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-
	Nashash junction, near the southern entrance of Bethlehem, searching civilians and

	vehicles until 20:45.				
	Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.				
	• Closure:				
	 (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. 				
	• Closure of Main Roads:				
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.				
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.				
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.				
	(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.				
	• Flying Checkpoints:				
	(i) At 08:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Beit Ula and Turqumia villages.

	• <u>Settler Violance</u> : On the morning of August 17 th 2011, Israeli security guards from "Bat E'ien" Settlement opened fire towards Palestinian farmers.				
	Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011.
NORTHERN GAZA	• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u> : Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, International Organization staff, merchants, business people and civilians travelling to Jordan through Al-Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.

	Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed.
	• Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing was open to civilians departing from the Gaza Strip to Saudi Arabia to perform pilgrimage and to others arriving from Egypt.
	Sufa Crossing is closed.
RAFAH	 Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is. open for transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, and cooking gas. In addition to 20 vehicles imported by the private sector, construction cargo designated to internationally funded projects was transported to the Gaza strip through the crossing.
