WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (iii) Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

JERUSALEM

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the

	vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. Raids: At 23:30, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Arura and patrolled the area until 05:00. At 23:35, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Abwein and the village of Jilijliya. The Israeli army also served a summons to a Palestinian Police officer, a resident of the village of Jilijliya, to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Sinjil. At dawn on 20 August 2009, the Israeli army raided the village of Bil'in, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. Arrests: At 03:00 on 19 August 2009, the Israeli army arrested Ahmed Adib as Seifi, a university student, during its raid into the town of Bir Zeit, in addition to those reported yesterday. The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Ibrahim Abu Rahmeh in the village of Bil'in. Demonstration/Attacks/Injuries: At 12:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil'in frequent Israeli army overnight raids and arrests, which attempt to curb residents from protesting against Wall construction. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Raids:

	 (i) At 09:45, and again at 21:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. (ii) At 22:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Zeita. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. At 19:00, the Israeli army closed with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Asla. Flying Checkpoint: At 10:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfe Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Till-Burin; Beit Furik-Salem; and the main road and eastern entrance to entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi. The Israeli army also continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Till and Madama; the southern entrances to the villages of Qaryut and Duma; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi; the western entrances to the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. Raids: At 13:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Sabastiya.

BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: In addition to detour roads east and south of the village of Al Walaja, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; Talita-Nazlat as Sidr in the city of Beit Jala; Al Wadi Rahhal-the settlement of Efrat; and a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. Checkpoint: At 14:45, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access. FIving Checkpoint: At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of An Nashash (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 09:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Za'tara and the village of Bureid'a. At 21:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Husan. At 21:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Husan. At 21:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur. Arrest: At 00:10, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint arrested Mahmoud al Qahwaji. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al
	Walaja.
HEBRON	• Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.

(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to open the iron gate on the Farsh Al Hawa junction to Road # 35, which leads to Tarqumiya Crossing, from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00.
- Flying Checkpoints: On 19 August 2009, the Israeli army set up several flying checkpoints and impeded civilian access on the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahim Mosques as well as on roads leading to the old city of Hebron.

• Raids

- (i) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (ii) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Kharas.
- (iii) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Idhna and arrested a Palestinian Police officer.
- (iv) At 02:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Surif and arrested 1 civilian.
- (v) At 02:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Khirbet Safa.
- (vi) At 04:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of Beit Ummar and Halhul.

• Arrests:

- (i) The Israeli army arrested Saleh Rasmi Abdul Rahman ash Shobaki, a Palestinian Police officer, in the town of Idhna.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested Mu'een Mohammed Amin Ghuneimat in the town of Surif.
- Attack on Religious Site: On 19 August 2009, the Israeli army closed the Ibrahim Mosque in the old city of Hebron, denied access to worshippers, and prevented calls to prayers, ostensibly to allow Israeli settlers to celebrate the Jewish holiday of the First of Elul.
- Palestinian Security Measure: At 15:10, Palestinian security forces handed

- over the Israeli authorities (through the DCO) an illegal truck located in the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal and in the area between southeast of the village of 'Arab ar Ramadin and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. ALL **Violation of the Ceasefire: DISTRICTS** The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory in the district of Central (i) Gaza and opened intensive fire, injuring an armed Palestinian individual. Israeli navy boats also opened intensive towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of the city of Rafah. (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals opened towards Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.	
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is partially open for transportation of wheat and animal feed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is partially open for transportation of fuel. 	
CENTRAL GAZA	 Raid/Atta/Injury: At dawn on 20 August 2009, the Israeli army, including several tanks and armoured vehicles, raided Palestinian territory east of the city of Deir al Balah. An armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals, during which the Israeli army injured 1 armed individual. Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack: At 08:30, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops positioned in the area surrounding Kissufim Gate on the Green Line. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory. 	
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.	
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. 	

- (ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed.
- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
- (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies and humanitarian aid.
- Attack: În the morning of 19 August 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of the city of Rafah.
