DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) On 26. 08. 2011 the Israeli occupation forces tightened their restrictions on the checkpoints in the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, and established many checkpoints in the intersections of main roads and the entrances to the Aqsa Mosque, and prevented citizens (with the exception to men over the age of 50 years and women over the age of 45 years and permit holders of men aged 45 years and 50 years old and women between the ages between 30 years and 45 years old) from entering the city in the first Friday prayers of Ramadan at Al Aqsa Mosque. Also flow a zeppelin with a camera a helicopter above the al-Aqsa Mosque to monitor the worshipers.
- (ii) Since August 21st 2011the Israeli army restricted access at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.

<u>Checkpoints</u>: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.

• Fire Arms:

At 10:00, Israeli forces stationed in Qalandia checkpoint, fired rubber-coated steel bullets and teargas canisters towards Palestinians to stop worshipers from passing through to reach Al Aqsa Mosque; five cases of teargas inhalation were reported.

Physical Assault: At 13:00, Israeli forces stationed at Qalandia checkpoint, detained and severely beat Ibrahim Ashraf Abu Rahma. He was admitted to hospital for treatment after his release at 01:20.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the areas north and south of

	Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.
	• <u>Checkpoints:</u> At 17:00, Israeli forces further restricted access at the checkpoint near the settlement of "Beit Eil", north of Al-Bireh city, impeding the free flow of

	• <u>Settlers Attacks:</u> At 19:15, a group of settlers entered the evacuated Homesh settlement set fire to several forest trees.
	• Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted
	special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
	Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the
TUBAS	Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.
	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.

	residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at
	the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students
	to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.

	Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement;

	accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya
BETHLEHEM	area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
	• Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi
	Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al
	Jab'a villages.
	• Flying Checkpoint: At 10:35, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint at the Al-Nashash
	junction (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem); this was, repeated from
	14:45 to 16:00.
	• Fire Arms: At 14:35, Israeli forces stationed at the Gilo checkpoint north of
	Bethlehem, fired teargas canisters towards citizens and detained two sisters
	allegedly for trying to steal soldiers' weapons. Rana and Sama Omar Muamar,

	from Batir village, were later released at 17:30. Four teargas inhalation cases were
	also treated.
	• Demonstrations: At 13:00, Palestinian and international peace activists
	demonstrated in Al-Masara village against the construction of the separation wall.
	Israeli forces prevented and beat the demonstrators, injuring 2 demonstrators,
	including 9 year-old Khaled Zawahra.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.
	• Closure:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq
	Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition
	to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues
	to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables
	market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
	(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the
	Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall
	construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them
	access to the area.
	(iii) On 26. 08. 2011, Israeli forces tightened their restrictions at the checkpoints,
	and metal gates at the entrances of the old city of Hebron, and setup
	checkpoints for inspections, hindering the access of citizens to perform the
	last Friday prayers of the month of Ramadan in the Ibrahimi Mosque.
	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-
Hebron	Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil
Hebron	villages.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling
	along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as
	detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
	(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to
	the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
	• Flying Checkpoints:
	(i) At 21:15, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint in Al-Shalala Street in the Old City,
	searching cars and people until 22:30.
	(ii) At 23:55 am, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Ummar,
	searching vehicles and people,
	• Raids:
	(iv)At 22:00 pm, Israeli forces raided Beit Ummar until 00:35.
	(v) At 01:20, Israeli forces raided Deir Al-Assal Al-Tahta.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the
	illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on at 21:00 on August 21st 2011. Ceasefire violations: Armed Palestinians launched 3 projectiles towards the Green Line.
