### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandia checkpoint.
- <u>Checkpoints:</u> Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.

### • Raids:

- (i) At 01:30, Israeli forces raided Mikhmas village until 02:30.
- (ii) At 02:30, Israeli forces raided Kafr Aqab and areas surrounding Samir Amis in Jerusalem, clashed with residents and withdrew at 06:30.
- **<u>Detention:</u>** On the evening of August 28<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces detained Lu'ay Nasser Al-Din in the old city of Jerusalem after storming his commercial store and confiscated a computer.
- Obstruction of Places of Worship: On August 28<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli settlers raided Al-Aqsa Mosque compound under the protection of Israeli forces and proved worshipers.

### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma 'ale Adumim.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.
- Raid: At 01:40 on August 28<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Al-Jalazun camp and detained 4 residents including 2 children.
- <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Mutaz Gazawi (17 years), Mohammad Issa (17 years), Hamdi Al-Atrash and Muntasir Al-Atrash in Al-Jalazun camp.
- <u>Confiscation of Property:</u> At 21:10, Israeli forces confiscated a barracks (used as a fruit juice stand) owned by Khalil Ayad in Beituniya.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 03:45, Israeli settlers raided Al-Jalazun camp, set fire to a vehicle owned by Nur Sbuh and wrote racist graffiti in Hebrew.

## RAMALLAH & AL BIREH

### Demonstrations:

- (i) At 11:00, demonstration took place in front of the International Red Cross headquarters in Al-Bireh in solidarity with Palestinian detainees and demanding their release from Israeli prisons.
- (ii) At 12:40, a demonstration took place in front of Ofar prison in Beituniya in solidarity with Palestinian detainees demanding their release from Israeli prisons; during which Israeli forces fires rubber coated steel bullets, stun and tear gas grenades towards demonstrators leaving several of them suffocating rom tear gas inhalation.
- <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.

QALQILYA	Flying Checkpoint:      (i) At 09:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the eastern entrance of Qalqiliya.

(ii) At 21:50, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the north entrance of Azzun. (iii) At 21:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint between Azzun and Al-Nabi Saleh village. **Raid:** At 10:00, Israeli forces raided the north area of Kafr Oaddum village **Detention:** (i) At 17:45, Israeli forces detained Arqama Dahbour, a resident of Azzun as he was reporting to Israeli intelligence for questioning. (ii) At 18:50, Israeli forces detained Othman Rube' at his work place near "Karni Shomron" settlement. **Destruction of Property:** On the morning of August 29<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces served demolition notice for a public service building financed by the Palestinian government for allegedly being built without proper licencing and gave 3 days for the demolition to take effect. **Settler Violence:** At 21:40, Israeli settlers stoned several vehicles along the road connecting Qalqiliya and Nablus damaging Mohammad Shahwans vehicle. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to (i) search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the (ii) village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Immanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma 'ale Shomron settlement. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Til-Burin and Beit Furik-(i) Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Checkpoint: At 23:40, Israeli forces closed Huwwara checkpoint, impeded the free flow of traffic before opening it at 03:00. Flying Checkpoint: At 10:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at "Shave Shomron" settlement junction until 11:30. Raid: (i) At 09:50, Israeli forces raid Khirbet Taweel area near Agraba, stormed 2 barracks (used as livestock shelters) which are owned by Zahi Jabir. (ii) At 22:10, Israeli forces raided Sabastiva, clashed with residents as they **NABLUS** stormed several homes, temporarily detained and interrogated several residents then withdrew at 23:30. **Settler Violence:** At 09:00, Israeli settlers under the protection of Israeli forces raided Al-Laban Al-Sharqiya village, attacked Khalid Daraghma'a home, assaulted his wife and his children 9 year old Nur (Broken hand), 13 year old Ma'moun (broken leg). Israeli forces also detained 2 residents as they were attempting to prevent the settler attack then withdrew at 13:20. Detention: Israeli forces detained Khalid Darghma and Jamal Daraghma in Al-Laban Al-Sharqiya village. **Closure of Main Roads: SALFIT**

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village, the southern entrance of Al-Samou' and the entrance of Beit Annun with cement blocks.
- (v) On July 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Safa and Al-Dirat and also closed the entrance of south Yatta with cement blocks.

### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 14:05, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Ithna.
- (ii) At 22:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint along Al-Shalala road in the old city of Hebron.

### • Raid:

- (i) At 02:30 on August 28<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Al-Burj village and detained a resident.
- (ii) At 08:20, Israeli forces raided Khirbit Zuwana village located south of Al-Thahriya, demolished 2 residential tents owned by Mohammad MuGhanam and demolished 5 water wells owned by Oda Abu Sharkh, Ad'is Abu Sharkh, Nabil Samara and Khalid Samara.
- (iii) At 11:45, Israeli forces raided Al-Ramadin village and demolished 2 barracks owned by Shihada Al-Za'arna and Salama Al-Jabarna.
- (iv) At 14:15, Israeli forces raided Al-Sa'ir and clashed with residents.
- (v) At 23:30. Israeli forces raided Halhul.
- (vi) At 01:10, Israeli forces raided Al-Thahriya.
- (vii)At dawn on August 29<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Beit Ummar, stormed and searched several homes, detained 3 residents including a child and summoned Wael Akhlil to report to Israeli intelligence for questioning.

### • <u>Detention:</u>

- (i) Israeli forces detained Fadi Al-Fuqiya in Al-Burj village.
- (ii) Israeli forces detained Mohammad Akhlil (17 years), Khulid Akhlil and Yusef Awwad in Beit Ummar.
- <u>Settler Violence:</u> On August 28<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli settlers raided agricultural land in Beit Ummar and damaged several crops owned by Mohammad Awwad.
- <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.
