JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) Israeli forces continue to close the entrance to Shu’fat refugee camp with cement blocks, which obstructs the free flow of traffic in Ras Khamis, Ras Shihadeh and Salam neighbourhoods in Anata and Shu’fat refugee camp. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> At 21:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al Ram junction. • <u>Raids:</u> At 01:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Ram. • <u>Attack:</u> On the evening of December 3rd 2011, Israeli forces fired teargas grenades towards residents in Shufat Camp, alleging stones were hurled at them. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim for the Sabbath holiday.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. • Flying Checkpoints: At 14:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near the Attara bridge and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages for the Sabbath holiday.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Flying Checkpoints: At 06:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Zabuba village. • Raid: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> At 12:30, Israeli forces raided Deir Abu Dhaif and Um Al-Tut villages. At 21:50, Israeli forces raided Kafr Dan. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00. • Raids: At 14:20, Israeli forces raided Tubas and withdrew at 14:50.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village and the dirt road between Shufa and Saffarin villages. • Checkpoints: At 10:30 the Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic until 16:20. • Flying Checkpoints: At 20:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Qur and Kafr Sur. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates was restricted to civilians granted special permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the wall. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route was suspended in the area surrounding Jubara village According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village for the Jewish Sabbath holiday.

In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • Flying checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> At 09:20, Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint near Izbat Al-Tabib. At 09:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Hija village. At 11:00 and again at 18:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Kafr

(ii) At 00:35, Israeli forces raided Kafr Qaddoum village. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 16:55, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Palestinian vehicles travelling on the main road connecting Qalqilya and Nablus. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement and between Azzun Atma and Oriniet settlement for the Sabbath holiday.
<p style="text-align: center;">NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00 (ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 08:55, the Israeli army increased restrictions at Shavi Shamron checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Deir Sharaf and Qussin villages (ii) At 17:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint beneath Madma village bridge. (iii) At 18:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Deir Sharaf junction. (iv) At 20:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Deir Sharaf junction.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 01:00 on December 3rd 2011, Israeli forces raided Qabalan and summoned Amer Aqra' for questioning with Israeli intelligence. (ii) At 09:00, Israeli forces raided Salem village. (iii) At 09:40, Israeli forces raided Al-Masaken Al-Shaabiya area in eastern Nablus. (iv) At 12:50, Israeli forces raided Al-Bathan village. (v) At 19:55, Israeli forces raided Al-Ahya Al-Sharqiya in Nablus. (vi) At 01:00, Israeli forces raided Balata refugee camp in Nablus, searched 2 homes, detained a resident and withdrew at 02:10. • <u>Detention:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) In addition to those mentioned in the previous report, Israeli forces detained Mohammad Aziz and Maher Al Qarib during their raid into Nablus at 01:50 on December 2nd 2011 (ii) Israeli forces detained Mohammad Al-Badrasawi during their raid into Balata refugee camp in Nablus. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 14:50 and again at 20:00, a group of Israeli settlers stoned vehicles passing along Jit junction and Israeli forces impeded the free flow of traffic and prevented Palestinian vehicles from passing through until 17:30; they withdrew at a later time. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 15:25, residents and activists rallied in front of a hospital in Nablus city to protest the Israeli decision barring Amal Jumaa, a former detainee, from travelling to Jordan for medical treatment.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 08:30, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army increased its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrances of Burqin and Bidya. (ii) At 12:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the western entrance of Harres village. (iii) At 17:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Kafil Harres and Harres village. • <u>Raids:</u> At 00:30, Israeli forces raided Kafil Harres in order to protect a group of settlers visiting religious sites and withdrew at 01:30 • <u>Detention:</u> At 22:40, Israeli forces positioned at Za'tara junction detained Abdel Latif Al-Qadoumi, a police officer, and released him at 23:20 after security coordination. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement for the Sabbath holiday.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Oja village with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up

	<p>along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area.</p> <p>(ii) Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Flying Checkpoints: At 10:50 and again at 23:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho city.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • Checkpoint: At 10:45 Israeli army continues to restrict access at the "Container" checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Flying Checkpoint: At 14:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Dar Salah located at the eastern entrance of Beit Sahur. • Raids: At 19:25, Israeli forces raided Beit Jala. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued northwest of Beit Jala town.
Hebron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village (v) Since 15. 10. 2011, Israeli forces closed two entrances leading to Beit Ummar town. • Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 10:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Hebron's northern entrance . (ii) At 10:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint in the old city of Hebron.

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. • Israeli forces broke the cease fire agreement as Israeli forces opened fire towards the Green Line and Israeli naval vessels opening fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) is closed.
<p style="text-align: center;">GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAFAH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> • <u>Yasser 'Arafat International</u> Airport remains closed. • Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is open for patients, students and residents with special permits • Sufa Crossing is closed. • Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed. • <u>Attack:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On the evening of December 3rd 2011, Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah. (ii) On the evening of December 3rd 2011, Israeli forces positioned behind the Green Line open fire towards several residents and shepherds in Rafah.
