	(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians
	from other districts from entering the city, only allowing access to
	civilians holding special permits.
	(i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order #
	S/02/09 on the closure of the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the
	area surrounding Jerusalem city. Access would be restricted to residents
	of the area as well as to civilians holding permits through crossings and
	gates defined in the military order.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian
	access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.
	<u>Closure of Main Roads</u> :
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.

	settlers opened fire on civilians in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem city, allegedly for throwing stones.

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in
	Abu Dis town.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall
	gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash
	Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians
	holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough
	searches using electronic devices.

	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction continues in the area north of Qalandiya village; in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp; south of Az Za'ayyem village; in Wadi al 'Eizariya; and east of Ma'ale Adumim settlement.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil town and Saffa village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. <u>Raids</u>: (i) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Deir Ghassana town. (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kharbatha al Misbah village. (iii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided An Nabi Salih village. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 02:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the village. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding 'Ofarim settlement and north of Al Lubban al Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	 <u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of Dotan settlement. <u>Raids</u>: At 10:20, the Israeli army raided Az Zababida town and Raba village and patrolled these areas until 13:00. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Bardala village and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Attack</u>: At 22:00, Israeli troops positioned at Tayasir checkpoint opened indiscriminate fire on the area surrounding the checkpoint.
TULKAREM	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting Kafr al Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. <u>Flying Checkpoints</u>: (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to 'Azzun town and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Jit village and searched civilians and vehicles.

• <u>Raid</u>: At 10:00, the Israeli army raided 'Azzun town and patrolled the area
until 11:50.
• <u>Wall Gates</u> :
(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
 (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate # 109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.
<u>Closure of Main Roads</u> :
 (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
(iii) At 21:50, the Israeli army reopened and allowed civilian access along a detour road leading to 'Awarta village near an Israeli military camp, installed in the vicinity of Huwwara town. It should be noted that the detour road had been closed since 2000.

 (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

(i) At 16:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to
Qaryut village and searched civilians and vehicles.(ii) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to

At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the Dead Sea and searched civilians and vehicles. Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # S/02/07, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order T/31/07. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village. Flying Checkpoint: At 15:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to An Nashash area and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; in the area surrounding Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.
HEBRON	 <u>Closure:</u> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates. ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold. <u>Violations of the Ceasefire:</u> The Israeli navy opened fire on Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the Rafah district's beach. Armed Palestinian individuals fired two mortars towards the Green Line.

GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. 		
CENTRAL GAZA	• <u>Palestinian Attack</u> : At 20:00, two mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
