<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Since January 6<sup>th</sup> 2012, the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> On the morning of January 31<sup>st</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Al-Eisawiya, clashed with residents as they stormed several homes, and fired teargas grenades, causing several cases of suffocation among residents; soldiers also detained</li> </ul>

	<p>residents for alleged stoning.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> Israeli forces detained Ayoub Obied during their raid into Al-Eisawiya.</li> <li>• <b><u>Temporary Detention:</u></b> On January 31<sup>st</sup> 2012, Israeli forces served the journalist Rasim Abidat, a resident of Jerusalem, a summon to report for questioning in a Jerusalem security centre, where he was banned from entering the West Bank for a period of 7 months, starting from January 11<sup>th</sup>2012.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim.</li> </ul>

According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>
<b>QALQILYA</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of Azzun</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoint:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 17:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Azzun Atma.</li> <li>(ii) At 18:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance of Qalqilya and impeded the free flow of traffic until 19:00.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 15:10, Israeli forces raided Asala village.</li> <li>(ii) At 22:00, Israeli forces raided Jit village and fired stun grenades towards several residents.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karne Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.</li> </ul>

The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to restrict access at the Za'tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 19:30, Israeli forces raided Yasuf village until 19:50.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.</li> </ul>

<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>(ii) Since 14:30 on 10.01.2012, Israeli forces continue to close the road leading to Kharba Baqa and the road between Wadi Fukin and Jaba villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Raid:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) On the morning of January 31<sup>st</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Husan village and detained a resident.</li> <li>(ii) At 11:20, Israeli forces raided Beit Jala, stormed a carpentry shop and withdrew at 13:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Detention:</b> Israeli forces detained Jihad Hamamreh during their raid into Husan village.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction was resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.</li> </ul>
<b>Hebron</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. 	<p>detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.</p> <p>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.</p> <p>(v) Since 09:40 on 10.01.2012, Israeli forces continued closing the entrance of Beit Amra with concrete blocks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:30, Israeli forces set up 3 flying checkpoints at the entrances of Farsh Al-Hawa area in north Hebron, Ithna junction and Al-Thahiriya.</li> <li>(ii) At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Samou.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 01:45 on January 31<sup>st</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Dura and detained a prisoner released in the recent prisoner swap deal.</li> <li>(ii) At 12:00, Israeli forces raided Yatta, served a demolition order for a solar panel used to generate electricity for several homes in the village and 4 barracks owned by Ibrahim Nawaj'a, Khalil Nawaj'a, Abdel Muhsen Irsheid and Taleb Nawaj'a.</li> <li>(iii) At 15:30, Israeli forces raided Ithna and detained 2 residents near the Wall.</li> <li>(iv) At 17:55, Israeli forces raided Hebron.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 20:50, Israeli forces detained Sami Abu Irmeila as they stormed his home in the Old City of Hebron.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces detained Ayman Shawarna , who was released in the recent prisoner exchange deal with Israel, during their raid into Dura.</li> <li>(iii) Israeli forces detained Mahmoud Abu Turki and Taher Abu Turki during their raid into Ithna.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 15:20, a group of Israeli settlers assaulted several residents in Hebron city.</li> <li>• <b><u>Demonstration:</u></b> At 12:20, Palestinian and international peace activists marched towards agricultural land in Beit Ummar to protest settler violence and the prevention of Palestinian farmers from accessing their land. Israeli forces fired teargas and stun grenades towards demonstrators; several demonstrators suffocated from teargas inhalation. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00.</li> <li>• On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against passing beyond the mark.</li> <li>• Israeli forces broke the ceasefire agreement by firing towards Central Gaza and Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards several Palestinian fishing boats off the shores of North Gaza and injured a Gaza resident.</li> <li>• Palestinian gunmen launched projectiles towards the Green Line.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NORTHERN GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Point:</b> Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for the passage of critical patients, journalists, NGO staff, businessmen and passengers travelling abroad through Al-Karama crossing with previous coordination.</li> <li>• <b>Attack:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 21:00 on January 30<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishing boats off the shores of Beit Lahia.</li> <li>(ii) At 11:35 on January 31<sup>st</sup> 2012, Israeli forces from their positions behind the Green Line opened fire towards Palestinian and international peace activists protesting against Israeli closures and the prevention of farmers from reaching their agricultural land.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Palestinian Attack:</b> On the evening of January 31<sup>st</sup> 2012 Palestinian gunmen launched projectiles towards the Green Line.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Points:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.</li> <li>(ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed.
