## WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.</li> </ul>

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li> <p><b>Closure:</b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also closed the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and prevented civilians from accessing the mosque, only allowing access to female civilians and civilians holding Israeli-issued IDs who are above 45 years of age. This Israeli measure aims to prevent any demonstration against the Israeli authorities' intention to carry out excavations near Bab al Maghariba.</p> </li> <li> <p><b>Closure of Main Roads:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.</li> </ul> </li> <li> <p><b>Checkpoint:</b> The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.</p> </li> <li> <p><b>Wall Gates:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li> <p><b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction was resumed in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.</p> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Curfew/Attack/Injury/Confiscation of Property:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 03:40, the Israeli army raided Qalandiya refugee camp and imposed curfew. While searching 2 houses, the Israeli army opened fire, injuring 1 Palestinian Preventive Security officer. The Israeli army also arrested the injured officer.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army raided the town of Al 'Eizariya, arrested 1 civilian, and detained his vehicle.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army raided the town of Bir Nabala, raided the office of the town's local council, and confiscated its contents.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Ahmed Shihadeh, an injured Palestinian Preventive Security officer, in Qalandiya refugee camp.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army arrested 'Isa Hussein al Khatib in the town of Al 'Eizariya.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>RAMALLAH &amp; EL BIREH</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede access to the city of Ramallah for civilians holding IDs issued in the northern districts of the West Bank.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was resumed in the area west of the town of 'Abud, in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin, Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis, and in the town of Beituniya.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Surda along the Ramallah-Bir Zeit road and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Attack:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At dawn on 03 February 2007, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit Liqya and arrested 4 civilians.</li> <li>(ii) At 20:20, the Israeli army raided the city of El Bireh. At 02:35, the Israeli army, including 9 jeeps, raided the city again, set up several checkpoints, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area until 03:20.</li> <li>(iii) At 24:00, the Israeli army, including 4 jeeps, raided the town of Beituniya. While patrolling the area, the Israeli army opened indiscriminate fire. At 01:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(iv) At 04:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Ramallah and patrolled the area until 06:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> The Israeli army arrested 4 civilians in the village of Beit Liqya: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Younes Sa'eed Mousa;</li> <li>(ii) Israr Ibrahim 'Assi;</li> <li>(iii) Rafeeq Sufyan Mafarjeh; and</li> <li>(iv) Saleem Mohammed 'Assi.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<b>JENIN</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan as well as the road connecting the town of Qabatiya to the village of Misliya.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints/Detentions:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of ‘Arraba and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jenin and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 12:30, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints, one at the entrance to the town of Az Zababida and the other on the junction to the town of ‘Arraba, and searched civilians and vehicles. Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoints also detained 2 buses (one transporting 18 civilians and the other 50) and took them to the settlement of Move Dotan. Israeli troops also arrested 2 civilians, including a bus driver.</li> <li>(iv) At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of ‘Arraba along the Jenin-Nablus main road, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested 1 Palestinian Police officer. Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint also detained 1 Palestinian National Security officer and released him at 20:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Attacks/Detentions:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 01:00, the Israeli army, including 7 jeeps, raided the city of Jenin, opened fire, and fired sound grenades, while searching a number of houses. At 03:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army raided the town of Birqin. While surrounding and searching a number of houses, the Israeli army opened fire, fired sound grenades, and detained members of a family outside their house for several hours.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoints set up at the entrance to the town of Az Zababida and on the junction to the town of ‘Arraba arrested 2 civilians: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Waleed Nazzal; and</li> <li>(ii) ‘Abed Hashash.</li> <li>(iii) Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on the junction to the town of ‘Arraba along the Jenin-Nablus main road arrested Mohammed ‘Atallah Sabbah, a Palestinian Police officer.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>TULKAREM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district.</li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal’a road, the entrance to the village of</li> </ul>

	<p>Saffarin, the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to ‘Attil plain, and the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city) and Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city).</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Deir al Ghusun and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 15:10, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints, one on the junction to the town of Baqa ash Sharqiya and the other in the area between the towns of ‘Attil and ‘Illar, and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of ‘Illar and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Physical Assault:</b> At 19:50, Israeli troops positioned at Jubara checkpoint beat Muhyi ad Din Mas’oud.</li> </ul>
<b>QALQILIYA</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Land levelling for Wall construction was resumed in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and ‘Azzun.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoint:</b> At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul>
<b>NABLUS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to cross these checkpoints.</li> <li>(ii) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(iii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30.</li> <li>(iv) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.</li> <li>(v) The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Al Badhan checkpoint and impeded civilian access. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> At 11:00, the Israeli army set up 3 flying checkpoints in the area between: the villages of Al Badhan and Far'a; the villages of Talluza and Al Badhan; and the villages of An Nassariya and Far'a. Israeli troops positioned at these flying checkpoints searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 04:10, the Israeli army, accompanied by a bulldozer, raided the city of Nablus and patrolled the area until 06:30.</li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> At dawn on 03 February 2007, the Israeli army arrested Ayyoub Habibiyyeh during its raid into the city of Nablus.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>SALFIT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising).</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to impede civilian access.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> At 13:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Bruqin and the village of Qarawat Bani Zeid and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:00.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 17:00, the Israeli army, including 4 jeeps, raided the city of Salfit, searched 1 house, and withdrew at 17:30.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Marda.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> At dawn on 01 February 2007, the Israeli army arrested Mohammed Majeed Mar'i, a Palestinian Police officer, during its raid into the village of Qarawat Bani Hassan, in addition to those reported on 02 February 2007.</li> </ul>
<b>JERICHO</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land,</li> </ul>

	<p>forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. The Israeli army has also installed computers at the 2 checkpoints to examine civilians' IDs, thereby impeding civilian access.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the DCO checkpoint set up at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho and to prevent civilians from leaving the city, only allowing those holding Jericho- and Jerusalem-issued IDs to cross.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Arrests:</b> At 16:15, Israeli troops positioned at the DCO checkpoint set up at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho arrested 2 unidentified civilians.</li> </ul>
<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr, northwest of the city of Beit Jala, and in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:10, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Beit Jala and patrolled the area.</li> <li>(ii) At 12:10, an Israeli army patrol raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles until 13:10.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>HEBRON</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh.</li> <li>(ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<p>al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp.</p> <p>(ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction was resumed in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoint:</b> At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b>Raid:</b> At 17:00, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint near Hebron University, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. At 23:20, the Israeli army raided the city again, set up a checkpoint in the area of Az Zahid, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.</li> </ul>
