| ALL DISTRICTS | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank. |

| JERUSALEM | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <p>Closure: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, set up several checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and prevented civilians from accessing the mosque to perform Friday prayers, only allowing access to female civilians and civilians holding Israeli-issued IDs who are above 45 years of age. This Israeli measure aims to prevent civilian demonstrations against the Israeli army's levelling of Bab al Maghariba old road, which leads to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. As a result, civilians were forced to perform Friday prayers along main streets, roads, and in the area surrounding the old city of Jerusalem. Confrontations also took place between the Israeli army and civilians in the area surrounding Al Aqsa Mosque compound.</p> <p>Closure of Main Roads:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. <p>Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.</p> <p>Wall Gates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. <p>Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from</p> |

| | <p>the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raids/Attack/Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army raided the town of ‘Anata, opened fire, and fired tear gas grenades. (ii) The Israeli army raided the village of Biddu, searched a number of houses, and detained 5 children. • <u>Arrest:</u> The Israeli army arrested Yousef Khameer, a civilian resident of Shu’fat refugee camp, in the city of Jerusalem. • <u>Attack on Religious Site/Attack/Injuries/Physical Assaults:</u> Claiming that civilians threw stones at the Israeli army following Friday prayers, Israeli troops raided the yards of Al Aqsa Mosque compound, fired tear gas and sound grenades towards civilians, and beat a number of civilians with clubs. As a result, 20 civilians sustained various injuries. The Israeli army also denied access to ambulances to evacuate injured civilians. • <u>Demonstration/Attack/Injuries:</u> At 12:30, a mass demonstration took place in Qalandiya refugee camp in protest against the Israeli army’s land levelling near Bab al Maghariba leading to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors near Qalandiya checkpoint, during which the Israeli army injured 15 civilians. |
| <p style="text-align: center;">RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of ‘Atara and to impede access to the city of Ramallah for civilians holding IDs issued in the northern districts of the West Bank. The Israeli army has also installed surveillance cameras at the checkpoint. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area west of the town of ‘Abud, in the areas of Al Midya to Ni’lin, Ni’lin to Deir Qaddis, and in the town of Beituniya. • <u>Attack:</u> At 18:00, the Israeli army opened indiscriminate fire, while patrolling the settler bypass road near the town of Beituniya. • <u>Raids/Attacks/Injury/Destruction of Property:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Budrus. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 1 civilian. (ii) At 01:45, the Israeli army, including 11 jeeps, raided the city of Ramallah and Al Am’ari refugee camp in the city of El Bireh as well as searched 1 building, after surrounding it and destroying its doors. In addition, the Israeli army fired tear gas and sound grenades and searched 1 house in Al Am’ari refugee camp. At 04:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. |

| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Provocation of Palestinian Forces:</u> At 17:30, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of ‘Atara detained 4 Palestinian Police officers along with their vehicle. Israeli troops arrested 1 Palestinian Police officer and released the others at 18:30. • <u>Arrest:</u> Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of ‘Atara arrested Omar Jamal Abu M’eiliq, a Palestinian Police officer. • <u>Demonstration/Attack/Injuries/Physical Assault:</u> A mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil’in in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army fired rubber-coated steel bullets as well as sound and tear gas grenades. As a result, 2 civilian protestors and 1 international peace activist sustained injuries. In addition, the Israeli army beat a number of civilians with clubs, leaving 5 civilians, including 2 children, with contusions. |
| JENIN | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan as well as the road connecting the town of Qabatiya to the village of Misliya. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army set up 3 flying checkpoints, 2 at the entrances to the towns of Az Zababida and Tammun and 1 in the area between the villages of Az Zawiya and ‘Anza, and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 04:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and Jenin refugee camp and patrolled the area until 06:00. (ii) The Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Fahma. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:00, a mass demonstration took place in the city of Jenin in protest against the Israeli army’s land levelling near Bab al Maghariba leading to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. (ii) At 13:00, a mass demonstration took place in the village of ‘Aqqaba in protest against the Israeli army’s land levelling near Bab al Maghariba leading to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. |
| TULKAREM | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal’a road, the entrance to the village of Saffarin, the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to ‘Attil plain, and the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. |

(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Land levelling for Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and ‘Azzun. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to the town of ‘Azzun, searched civilians and vehicles, and denied civilian access in both directions. (ii) The Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints, one at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and the other on the junction to the village of Jit, and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Demonstration/Raid:</u> At 10:30, a mass demonstration took place in the town of ‘Azzun in protest against the Israeli army’s land levelling near Bab al Maghariba leading to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians at the northern entrance to the town. The Israeli army subsequently raided the town and arrested 2 civilians. • <u>Arrests:</u> The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of ‘Azzun: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Zeid Husan Saleem; and (ii) ‘Amr Ali Abu Haniyyeh. |

| <p style="text-align: center;">NABLUS</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to cross these checkpoints. The Israeli army also searches civilians using metal detectors at Beit Iba checkpoint, thereby impeding their access. (ii) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only. (iii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30. (iv) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases. (v) At 06:50, Israeli troops positioned at checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus prevented civilians, between 16 and 25 years of age who hold Nablus-issued IDs, from leaving the city of Nablus. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the town of Jamma'in, searched civilians and vehicles, and denied civilian access in both directions. (ii) The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Ijnisinya and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Burqa. (ii) At 00:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus as well as the area surrounding Balata refugee camp and patrolled the area until 04:40. • <u>Demonstration:</u> At 12:50, a mass demonstration took place in the city of Nablus in protest against the Israeli army's land levelling near Bab al Maghariba leading to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. |

(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik. |

| JERICHO | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. • <u>Raids/House Occupation:</u> At 11:30, an Israeli army patrol raided the village of Al 'Auja and patrolled the area. At 19:35, the Israeli army raided the village again, occupied the roof of a civilian house, and converted it into a military post. |
| BETHLEHEM | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr, northwest of the city of Beit Jala, and in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 07:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Jannata and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Physical Assault:</u> At 18:30, the Israeli army severely beat Mohammed Shihadeh Salah along Road # 60, leaving him with contusions. Salah was then transported to hospital for medical treatment. • <u>Raid:</u> At 24:00, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Beit Jala and patrolled the area. • <u>Demonstration/Attack/Injury:</u> At 13:20, a mass demonstration took place in the city of Bethlehem in protest against the Israeli army's land levelling near Bab al Maghariba leading to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. |

| <p>HEBRON</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp. (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta. • <u>Flying Checkpoint/Attack:</u> At 07:35, and claiming that a number of children threw stones at Israeli troops, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp and opened fire towards civilians, thereby preventing them from leaving the refugee camp. • <u>Raids/Medical Obstruction/Attack/Injuries:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up checkpoints in several neighbourhoods, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:00, the Israeli army raided the city again and surrounded <i>Al Ahli</i> Hospital. (ii) At 17:35, the Israeli army raided Al Fawwar refugee camp. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 4 civilians, including 1 child. |

| NORTHERN GAZA | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open only to foreign nationals, VIPs, and humanitarian cases. |
| GAZA | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. |
| CENTRAL GAZA | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities not reported. |
| KHAN YUNIS | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Attack:</u> At 15:30, the Israeli army opened fire from the area near Point 147 on the Green Line towards a number of shepherds at a distance of 300 metres from the border fence east of the area of Al Qarara, thereby violating the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement. |
