| JERUSALEM | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On 25 February 2011, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city, set up many flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and denied access to civilians from other districts to perform Friday prayers at the Al Aqsa Mosque. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba’. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • Checkpoint: The Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designates a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. • Deportation: On 25 February 2011, an Israeli court entered a decision on the deportation of Nasser Qous from his house in the old city of Jerusalem for a period of 15 days. It should be noted that Qous had been arrested by the Israeli army, as was reported yesterday. • Demonstration/Injuries: At 12:30, civilians performed Friday prayers in the sit-in tent erected in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem city in protest against the eviction of civilian homes for construction of Israeli settlement projects. After the prayers, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured a civilian. A number of civilians also sustained wounds as a result of tear gas inhalation. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area north of Qalandiya village; south of Az Za’ayyem village; and in Wadi al ‘Eizariya west of Ma’ale Adumim settlement. |

- **Closure of Main Roads:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil town and Saffa village and the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.
 - (ii) Although it removed the dirt barricade, the Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to An Nabi Salih village.
- **Flying Checkpoints/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:**
 - (i) At 09:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to An Nabi Salih village and searched civilians and vehicles. Having also and closed the iron gate at the entrance, the Israeli army denied civilian access to or from the village. In addition, Israeli troops prevented two Palestinian Police officers from accessing their station in the village.
 - (ii) At 14:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al Mughayyir village and searched civilians and vehicles.
 - (iii) At 21:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Turmus'ayya town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- **Raid:** At 01:40, the Israeli army raided 'Abwein town, raided two houses, and served summonses on two civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency:
 - (i) Ahmed Khalil Suhweil; and
 - (ii) Saher Subhi Suhweil.
 At 02:20, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- **Arrests:** At 15:15, the Israeli army arrested two civilians (brothers) after raiding Bedouin premises in Al Mu'arrajat area east of At Tayba town:
 - (i) Mohammed Ali Muleihat; and
 - (ii) Hamzeh Ali Muleihat.
- **Settler Violence:** At 14:50, a group of Israeli settlers sprayed a chemical material (using a tractor) on civilian land cultivated with wheat crops, damaging the whole wheat harvest.
- **Demonstrations/Attacks/Injuries/Detentions:**
 - (i) At 13:00, a mass demonstration, including international and Israeli peace activists, took place in Bil'in village in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured a child. Several protestors also sustained injuries due to tear gas inhalation.
 - (ii) At 13:20, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in An Nabi Salih village in protest against Israeli settler violence and confiscation of civilian land for the expansion of Halamish settlement. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which a number of civilians, including 3-year-old Samer Bilal at Tamimi, were wounded as a result of tear gas inhalation.
 - (iii) At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international and Israeli peace activists, took place in Ni'lin town in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which a number of protestors sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation.

| TULKAREM | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting Kafr al Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and ‘Izbat Shufa villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Raid: At 17:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Far’un village. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. |
| QALQILYA | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Hajja village and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 11:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to ‘Azzun town and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 15:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Qalqiliya city and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 19:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint underneath the overpass to ‘Azzun town on the Qalqiliya-Tulkarem road, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested two civilians. (v) At 20:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Immatin village and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Jit village. (ii) At 12:25, and again at 19:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled ‘Azzun town. (iii) At 02:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kafr Thulth town as well as ‘Izbat al Ashqar village. • Arrests: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:10, the Israeli army arrested Baha’ Sameer Radhwan near ‘Azzun town, ostensibly because he had thrown stones at Israeli settler vehicles travelling along the main road north of the town. |

The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</p> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement. |
| NABLUS | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.</p> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <p>(i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.</p> <p>(ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</p> <p>(iii) At 14:10, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at the Shavei Shomron checkpoint on the Nablus-Jenin main road and impeded civilian access until 17:15.</p> • Flying Checkpoints: <p>(i) At 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between ‘Asira ash Shamaliya town and Talluza village and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> |

(ii) At 04:30, a group of Israeli settlers from Bracha settlement raided Burin village, attacked a house belonging to Bashir Hamzeh, and set fire to his vehicle. Israeli settlers also splashed benzene and attempted to set fire to the house, but civilians prevented settlers from doing so. Later, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area. |
| SALFIT | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland. (iii) The Israeli army continues to open the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Kafr ad Dik town and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Yasuf village and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> At 17:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kafr ad Dik town. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of Emmanuel settlement. |

Israeli troops only allowed access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area. |

At 00:10, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint, denied civilian access, and reopened it at a later time. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 21:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Yitav settlement east of Al 'Auja village and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Physical Assault:</u> At 13:00, Israeli troops severely beat Mohammed Idrees Abdullah Hammoudeh, a resident of Al Qibya village in Jerusalem district, on the junction to the Dead Sea, leaving him with contusions. • <u>Raid:</u> At 12:15, the Israeli army raided the area west of Jericho city and patrolled it until 13:25. |
| BETHLEHEM | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # S/02/07, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order T/31/07. (iii) Beginning on 20 January 2011, the Israeli army has continued to close the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village. • <u>Flying Checkpoints/Physical Assaults:</u> (i) At 20:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Efrat settlement and searched civilians and vehicles. Israeli troops also stopped a civilian vehicle and beat passengers. (ii) At 20:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to Beit Sahur city near Dar Salah village and searched civilians and vehicles until 00:10. • <u>Raids:</u> (i) At 14:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Khirbet ad Deir village. (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided Husan village and searched a number of commercial premises. • <u>Demonstration/Attack:</u> At 12:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Al Ma'sara village in protest against Wall construction. Israeli troops fired tear gas grenades on protestors and prevented them from accessing civilian land under the threat of confiscation for construction of the Wall. A number of participants sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation. |

In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates. (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S on the closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road between Al Karmil and At Tuwani villages; all roads leading to Road # 60; and the road connecting Surif town to Al Jab'a village. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 09:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to An Nabi Yunis area east of Halhul town on the Hebron-Bethlehem main road and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 10:00, and again at 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Sa'ir town and searched civilians and vehicles. (v) At 10:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles. (vi) At 11:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Kharsa village and searched civilians and vehicles. • Attack: At 17:20, the Israeli army fired rubber-coated steel bullets as well as tear gas grenades on a number of children in Az Zahed area in the old city of Hebron, allegedly for throwing stones. • Raids/House Occupation: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided Hebron city, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the city again, occupied the roof of a building in Bab az Zawiyah square, and converted it into a military post. |

Also, 10 protestors sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation. In addition to arresting a civilian, Israeli troops detained two civilians and four international peace activists and released them at a later time. • Arrest: Israeli troops arrested Nael Naji ‘Amr in the old city of Hebron. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town. |
