JERUSALEM	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (ii) The three civilians arrested in the town of Izariyeh are Daoud Ahsraf Abu Reesh, Imad Omar Qawasmi and Daoud Walid Sadi. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayayh road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Shayahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. - (ii) At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Jeet and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the village of Jinasaphotand searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 17:25 and at 21:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 20:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Jinasaphot 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- i) At 00:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jayyous.
- ii) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun, searched 1 civilian home and arrested 1 child.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The child arrested in the town of 'Azzun is called Abdallah Ahmad Hawari, 17.

Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

- (iii) At 15:05, the Israeli army intensified restrictions on Huwara checkpoint and impeded the flow of traffic.
- (iv) At 17:10, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at Shave Shomron checkpoint and impeded traffic.

• Flying checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al-Badhan Road (northern entrance to Nablus) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Agraba and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 21:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the town of Bita, fired sound bombs at children under the pretext of stone throwing.
- (iv) At 00:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the town of the village of Deir Sharaf and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- (i) At 08:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of AL-Badhan.
- (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabalan, arrested 1 civilian under the pretext of throwing as Molotov at an Israeli military jeep, The Israeli army withdrew at 17:30.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The civilian arrested in the town of Qabalan is called Khaled Jad Mohammad Hassan.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) At 12:10, a group of settlers fron Shilo settlement attacked land in the village of Qaryout and kicked Palestinian farmers out from their agricultural land.
- (ii) At 13:30, a group of settlers from Yitzhar settlement attacked land in the village of Aseera Al-Qabaliya and assaulted several civilian homes. The Israeli army interfered and fired tear gas bomb, injuring 14 civilians, including 3 children and 7 female civilians.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
- (ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continued its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.

• Raids:

- (i) At 20:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Yassouf, clashed with civilians, arrested 1 civilian and withdrew at 20:50.
- (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Deir Istiyya and arrested 2 civilians, including 1 child, and withdrew at 23:50.

• Arrests:

- (i) The civilian arrested in the village of Yassouf is called Za'ed Ahmad Abel Hamid.
- (ii) The two civilians arrested in the village of Deir Istiyya are called Yassr Rafiq Awad, 26, and Jihad Nihadallah.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.

- (iii) At 22:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bani Na'im.

The Israeli assaulted protestors and fired tear gas bombs and injured several demonstrators

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark. Israeli forces broke the ceasefire by firing from the Green Line towards the Gaza Strip. Armed Palestinian groups broke the ceasefire by firing 3 projectiles towards the Green Line.

GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
