DISTRICT EVENTS

#### **WEST BANK**

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

## • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

# <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

- Attack: At 20:50, Israeli troops positioned around Qalandiya checkpoint opened fire and injured 3 civilians, allegedly for throwing stones.
- Raid/Detentions/Physical Assaults: At 03:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Qatanna and searched 1 house after detaining residents. The Israeli army also beat 2 children and damaged the house furniture.

#### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

## • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- (iii) Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

# • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 12:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Bizzariya, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a Palestinian Customs Police officer.
- (ii) At 20:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 13:00, the Israeli army raided the area of Lifjan in the vicinity of the town of 'Aqraba and distributed notices for the demolition of 3 houses as well as a number of barracks, claiming that they had been built without the required construction licences. The Israeli army gave relevant civilians a respite of 48 hours to evacuate the houses and barracks.
- <u>Arrest</u>: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the entrance to the village of Bizzariya arrested Mohammed Sameer Rashed Mas'oud, a Palestinian Customs Police officer.

# • Settler Violence:

- (i) At h16:20, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat Arafat Amin Suwwan near the junction to the settlement of Yitzhar, leaving him with contusions. Consequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.
- (ii) At 17:30, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Yitzhar severely beat 65-year-old Hussein at Tillawi while he was present on his land near the settlement. As he sustained contusions, At Tillawi was transported to hospital for medical treatment.

HEBRON	Closure:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.  (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.  Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the

- entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

# • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area of Wadi Qabbun (at the northern entrance to the city of Hebron, which branches off Road # 35) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the towns of Tarqumiya and Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 10:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (ii) At 11:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (iii) At 01:45. The Israeli army raided the town of Dura and patrolled the area until 03:55.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

# **GAZA STRIP**

# ALL DISTRICTS

• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.

## • Violations of the Ceasefire:

- (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilians and property in the district of Central Gaza.
- (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired 10 mortars towards the Green Line.

# NORTHERN GAZA

• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.

	<ul> <li><u>Air Patrol</u>: On 06 January 2010, Israeli combat aircraft patrolled the skies over the district of Northern Gaza and dropped flyers on civilians residing along the Green Line, warning them that they should keep 300 metres away from the Border Fence.</li> </ul>
