	(i) Since January 6 th 2012, the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.
	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a
	hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.
	• <u>Closure of Main Roads</u> :
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village.

• Flying checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:50, the Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Azzun village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:15, the Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Qalqilya city and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:30.
- (iii) At 16:40, the Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Qaddum village and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 11:40, Israeli forces raided Qalqilya and stormed a merchant shop.
- (ii) At 03:30, Israeli forces raided Jit village
- <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 12:00 Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Kafir Qaddum village to protest closures of the entrance gate leading to the village, during which Israeli forces fired teargas and stun grenades towards demonstrators as they neared towards the village entrance, and several demonstrators suffocated as a result of tear gas inhalation.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of RasAtiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.

• Checkpoints:

NABLUS

- (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00
- (ii) At 05:00Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00 and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
- (iii) At 11:40, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at "Shavi Shamron" settlement junction, impeded the free flow of traffic and seized a vehicle owned by Moayad Samar a resident of Qalqilya

• Flying checkpoints:

(i) At 14:55, the Israeli forces setup a checkpoint between Qabalan and Yatma,

• Raids: At 10:00, the Israeli forces raided Beit Sahur
• <u>Demonstrations:</u>
(i) At 12:40, Palestinian and international peace activists marched near Al-
Masara village to protest the construction of the wall; Israeli forces fired stun
and teargas grenades towards protesters.
(ii) On 15:50, Palestinian and international peace activists marched near
Cremesan area West of Beit Jala, a prayer took place by Christian community,

to protest the construction plan of the wall

• Wall Construction: Wall construction continued northwest of Beit Jala town.

Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
- (v) Since15. 10. 2011, Israeli forces closed two entrances lead to Beit Ummar town.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:30, the Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Hebron, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 08:30, the Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Ithna village, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 09:30, the Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Ummar.
- (iv) At 12:35, the Israeli forces set up a flyingcheckpoint at the entrance of Al Nabi Yunis.
- (v) At 16:00, the Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Hebron, physically assaulted Khalil Hamidan a Presidential guardleaving him hospitalised with contusions.

• Raids:

- (i) At 11:20 and again 18:00, the Israeli forces raided Hebron.
- (ii) At 15:30, the Israeli forces raided Al Tabaqa village and clashed with residents.

Hebron

- (iii) At 23:25, the Israeli forces raided Tarqumiya.
- <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 10:35, a group of Israeli settlers raided agricultural land and homes near Arqan Tarad village and withdrew under the protection of Israeli forces at 13:45.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark. Israeli forces broke the ceasefire by opening fire and firing artillery shells from positions at the Green Line towards Gaza.
