DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other districts from entering the city, only allowing access to civilians holding special permits.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city. Access would be restricted to residents of the area as well as to civilians holding permits through crossings and gates defined in the military order.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.

• <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli authorities continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designates a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.

- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 12:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Duqqu village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 16:40, the Israeli army raided Abu Dis town and patrolled the area until 18:00.
- <u>Destruction of Property</u>: On 10 January 2011, the Israeli army demolished a horse barn in the area between At Tur and Wadi al Joz neighbourhoods, as well as a barracks built of zinc and wood in As Suwwana area in Jerusalem city. The Israeli authorities claimed that the affected structures had been installed without the required construction licences.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area north of Qalandiya village; south of Az Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi al 'Eizariya west of Ma'ale Adumim settlement.

JERUSALEM

Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil town and Saffa village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya Although it removed the dirt barricade, the Israeli army continues to (ii) close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to An Nabi Salih village. **Flying Checkpoints:** At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to (i) 'Atara town and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Bir Zeit University and searched civilians and vehicles until 18:20. Attack: At 11:00, Israeli troops fired rubber-coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades on a number of children near the settler bypass road in the vicinity of Beituniya town, ostensibly for throwing stones. Raids/Attack/Injury: At 16:00, the Israeli army raided Beit Liqua town. Confrontations (i) RAMALLAH took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which & Israeli troops injured 16-year-old Dhirar Husni 'Assi. Israeli troops EL BIREH also distributed notices for the demolition of three barracks, allegedly because they had been built without the required construction licences. The barracks belonged to: Mohammed Hasan Hamad Dar Mousa; (i) (ii) Mohammed Shukri 'Assi; and (iii) Fadhel 'Assi. At 01:25, the Israeli army raided El Bireh city, arrested a civilian, (ii) and withdrew at 03:35. At 03:50, the Israeli army raided Ramallah city and patrolled the (iii) area until 06:15. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Bara' al Qadhi in El Bireh city. **Settler Violence:** At 20:05, a group of Israeli settlers, protected by the Israeli army, gathered near the junction to Halamish settlement, provoked civilians travelling along the main road, and withdrew at 21:30. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding 'Ofarim settlement and north of Al Lubban al Gharbi and Rantis villages. Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of Dotan settlement. **Flying Checkpoints:** At 11:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to (i) **JENIN** Fahma village, served a summons on Mujahed Abdullah Diyab to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency, and withdrew at 13:00. At 11:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to (ii) Kafr Ra'i town and searched civilians and vehicles until 13:15. Raid: At 11:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled 'Arraba town.

	Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. Arrests: At 07:10 on 10 January 2011, the Israeli army arrested four civilians, including two brothers, while they were tending sheep near Pequot settlement: Raed Anees Abdullah Bani 'Odeh; Salah Suleiman Abu Rihan; Suleiman Salah Abu Rihan; and Mash'hour Salah Abu Rihan.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting Kafr al Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages. Checkpoint: At 08:30, the Israeli army intensified restrictions and impeded civilian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Flying Checkpoint: At 13:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Bal'a town and Al 'Attara village and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Confiscation of Property: At 20:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area between Dahiyat Dhinnaba in Tulkarem city and Kafr al Labad town. At 01:40, the Israeli army raided Nur Shams refugee camp and Tulkarem city. In the refugee camp, Israeli troops searched a house and confiscated a military uniform belonging to Mohammed Ahmed Shabrawi, a Palestinian National Security officer, as well as a cellular telephone belonging to Subhi Shabrawi, a Palestinian Police officer. Having also seized a personal computer, Israeli troops arrested a civilian and Palestinian security officer. Arrests: Israeli troops arrested a civilian and Palestinian security officer in Nur Shams refugee camp in Tulkarem city: Mohammed Ahmed Shabrawi, a Palestinian National Security officer; and Mahdi Mohammed Fayyad Yousef. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 11:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Jinsafut village and searched civilians and vehicles. At 18:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Hajja and Baqat al Hatab villages and searched civilians and vehicles.

- (iii) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Habla town and Ras 'Ativa village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 20:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Jayyus town and Kafr Jammal village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 23:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near An Nabi Elyas village and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/Detentions:

- (i) At 09:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area between 'Azzun town and 'Izbat at Tabib village.
- (ii) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled 'Azzun town.
- (iii) At 10:10, the Israeli army raided Sanniriya village, searched a house, detained Amin Ahmed Sa'id Younes, and released him at a later time.
- (iv) At 15:55, the Israeli army raided Hajja village, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, detained a number of civilians as well as Ziyad al Battah, a Palestinian National Security officer, and released them at a later time.
- (v) At 19:35, the Israeli army raided Jayyus town, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- <u>Arrest</u>: At 18:40, the Israeli army arrested Fadi Ali Hussein Taha, a resident of 'Azzun 'Atma village, while he was present inside the Green Line.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north
 of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel
 settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

NABLUS

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
 (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
- (iii) At 19:00, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at Huwwara checkpoint and impeded civilian access.

Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Nablus city and 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:40.
- (ii) At 23:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Qusin village and searched civilians and vehicles until 24:00.

Raids

- (i) At 13:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Qabalan town.
- (ii) At 18:30, the Israeli army raided Burqa village, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area until 19:40.
- (iii) At 19:20, the Israeli army raided Burin village. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 20:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the village.
- <u>Land Levelling</u>: In the morning of 10 January 2011, the Israeli army levelled civilian land near Yitzhar settlement in Madama village.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Brugin town.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to open the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: At 09:00, and again at 19:15, and at 19:45, the Israeli army intensified restrictions and impeded civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.
- Flying Checkpoint: At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Ari'el settlement and searched civilians and vehicles until 11:20.

• Raids/Detention/Confiscation of Property:

- (i) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided Qarawat Bani Hassan town. While patrolling the area, Israeli troops detained 13-year-old Bara' Saed Sadeq Abu 'Ilavva and released him at a later time.
- (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Biddya town.

SALFIT

	(iii) At 01:10, the Israeli army raided Salfit city, searched a house, arrested a member of the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC), and confiscated a personal computer and cellular telephone from his house. At 03:20, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

- <u>Detentions</u>: At 08:00, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained a bus transporting a number of Palestinian security officers, while they were travelling on a leave to Jericho city. Following coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO), Israeli troops allowed the bus to cross at 08:50.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S on the closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani village.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road between Al Karmil and At Tuwani villages; all roads leading to Road # 60; and the road connecting Surif town to Al Jab'a village.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in Wadi Qabbun area north of Hebron city and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Ummar town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 10:25, and again at 18:25, and at 22:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles
- (iv) At 12:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Sa'ir town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to An Nabi Yunis area on the Hebron-Bethlehem main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles at the northern entrance to Hebron city along Road #35.

HEBRON

(vii) At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Zif village and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- (i) At 09:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Tarqumiya town.
- (ii) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Idhna town.
- (iii) At 10:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hebron city.
- (iv) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dura town and Deir Samit village.
- (v) At 18:25, the Israeli army raided Yatta town, set up a checkpoint in the town's centre, and searched civilians and vehicles. Meantime, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. The Israeli army also searched a house, arrested a civilian, and withdrew at 21:20.
- (vi) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Adh Dhahiriya town.
- Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Ziyad Abu Humeid in Yatta town.
- <u>House Demolitions</u>: On 10 January 2011, the Israeli army distributed notices for the demolition of five houses in Ar Ramadin village, claiming that they had been build without the required construction licences. The houses belonged to:
- (i) Milhem Abdullah Hawarin;
- (ii) Mousa Salman Hawarin;
- (iii) Ibrahim Isma'il Hawarin;
- (iv) Khalil 'Amr Hawarin; and
- (v) Shihdeh Hasan.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold. Violations of the Ceasefire: (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire on civilian houses and property in Central Gaza, Khan Yunis, and Rafah. The

- (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire on civilian houses and property in Central Gaza, Khan Yunis, and Rafah. The Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line on Palestinian territory in Northern Gaza and Rafah. Israeli attacks resulted in the killing of an elderly Palestinian farmer in Northern Gaza.
- (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired four mortars towards the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank. Attack: In the evening of 10 January 2011, the Israeli army opened fire from its location in the area surrounding Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing on the Green Line on agricultural land north of Beit Hanun town, killing an elderly farmer. Killing: The Israeli army killed 65-year-old Sha'ban Shakir Qarmout north of Beit Hanun town. Palestinian Attack: In the evening of 10 January 2011, three unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing was partially open for transportation of 27 truckloads of wheat, 33 truckloads of animal feed, and 14 truckloads of construction cargo designated for internationally-funded projects. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Raid/Air Patrol/Attack: At noon on 10 January 2011, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of Khuza'a town. Meantime, the Israeli army opened intensive fire on agricultural land and civilian houses.
KHAN YUNIS	 <u>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling</u>: In the afternoon of 10 January 2011, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided 200 metres into Palestinian territory east of Khuza'a town. While levelling land, the Israeli army opened fire intensively on farmland and civilian houses. <u>Palestinian Attack</u>: In the evening of 10 January 2011, an unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to allow civilians, patients, and civilians holding visas to depart the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to civilians and patients, who had received medical attention at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed.

(iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for Gaza Electricity Generation Plant, and cooking gas. In addition to 20 vehicles imported by the private sector, two truckloads of strawberries and flowers were exported through the Crossing.

• Attacks:

- (i) In the morning of 10 January 2011, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location in the area surrounding Sufa Crossing on the Green Line on agricultural land in the areas of Karm Abu Mu'ammar and Al Fakhari northeast of Rafah city.
- (ii) In the morning of 10 January 2011, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line on agricultural land and civilian houses near Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing east of Rafah city.
- Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling/Destruction of Property: At dawn on 10 January 2011, the Israeli army, including a tank, armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of Ash Shoka town east of Rafah city. While levelling land, the Israeli army opened fire on farmland and civilian houses. Israeli bulldozers also uprooted a number of trees.
