<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Since January 13<sup>th</sup> 2012, the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces continue to close the entrance to the Shofat refugee camp with cement blocks, which will impede the free flow of traffic in Ras Khamis, Ras Shihadeh and Salam neighbourhood in Anata and Shofat refugee camp in Jerusalem.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) On the morning of January 19<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Mikhmas village and detained 2 residents, including a university student.</li> <li>(ii) On January 19<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Al-Isawiya village, clashed with residents, injuring 3 residents, and briefly detained 2 minors.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 20:50, Israeli forces positioned at Jab’a checkpoint detained Member of Legislative Council Aziz Dweik.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces detained Mansour Abu Ali and Yousef Abu Ali</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of</li> </ul>

<b>RAMALLAH &amp; AL BIREH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continued in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.</li> </ul>
<b>JENIN</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Road:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Zabuba village junction until 09:30.</li> <li>(ii) At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jab'a junction until 09:30.</li> <li>(iii) At 13:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Arraba village junction.</li> <li>(iv) At 16:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Ya'bad and Kafriyat.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 10:30, Israeli forces raided Jalqamus village and served Samer Adry, Suliman AlKarm and Mahmoud Al Karm.</li> <li>(ii) At 10:45, Israeli forces raided Sanour village until 11:20.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>
<b>TUBAS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.</li> </ul>
<b>TULKAREM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</li> <li>(ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 14:40 Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> <li>• <b>Detention:</b> On January 16<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces detained Samer Mir'i for alleged stoning in Zeita.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>
<b>QALQILYA</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of Azzun</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Flying checkpoints:</b> On January 19<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces set up 6 flying checkpoints at the entrances of Azzun, Kafer Qaddum, Al-Funduq and Al-Nabi Eliyas villages.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of RasAtiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.</li> </ul>
<b>NABLUS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00</li> <li>(ii) At 05:00Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00 and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying checkpoints:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 10:45, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint at Beit Furik junction.</li> <li>(ii) At 11:30 and again at 18:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Deir Sharaf junction.</li> <li>(iii) At 14:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qabalan.</li> <li>(iv) At 18:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Madama and Burin villages.</li> <li>(v) At 19:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Salem village junction</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> At 00:55, Israeli forces raided Rujeib village, detained 2 residents and withdrew at 01:10.</li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> Israeli forces detained Ahmad Dweikat and Fuad Dweikat.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 13:45, a group of Israeli settlers raided agricultural land and chased several farmers and sheep herders from their land between Orif and Asira Al-Qibliya.</li> <li>(ii) At 00:40, a group of Israeli settlers stoned vehicles passing through Huwara checkpoint.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
<b>SALFIT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.</li> <li>(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

	<p>traffic.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 14:20 the Israeli army increased their restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 12:15, Israeli forces raided Hares village, occupied the rooftop of Baseem Odeh's home and withdrew at 13:00.</li> <li>(ii) At 22:45, Israeli forces raided Kafr Al Dik, detained and interrogated several residents and released them at a later time.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Home Demolition:</b> On January 18<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces served Fahed Daoud a demolition order to demolish 3 barracks in Hares village.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continued in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.</li> </ul>
<b>JERICHO</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Road:</b> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Oja village with cement blocks.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> At 19:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jiftlik village junction.</li> <li>• <b>Detention:</b> On the evening of January 18<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces positioned at Allenby Bridge detained Obay Hamadna a University student from Nablus as he was returning from Jordan.</li> </ul>
<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>(ii) Since 14:30 on January 10<sup>th</sup> 2012, the Israeli army closed a road leading to Taqou with dirt mounds.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Raid:</b> At 01:30, Israeli forces raided Za'tara, searched a home, detained the deputy of Parliament, and confiscated a computer and a cellular phone.</li> <li>• <b>Detention: Israeli forces</b> detained Deputy of Parliament Khalid Thowieb</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continued northwest of Beit Jala town.</li> </ul>

<b>Hebron</b>	<p>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.</li> <li>(v) Since 15. 10. 2011, Israeli forces closed two entrances lead to Beit Ummar town.</li> <li>(vi) Since 09:40 on January 10<sup>th</sup> 2012, the Israeli army closed the entrance to Beit Ammar village with cement blocks.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 10:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Ithna junction.</li> <li>(ii) At 11:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint Zif village junction.</li> <li>(iii) At 20:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Ramadhin village until 22:10.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:25 and again at 22:35, Israeli forces raided Hebron.</li> <li>(ii) On January 19<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces raided Qalqas village south of Hebron and served Nidal Abu Sneineh a military order to halt construction of his home.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.</li> </ul>

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00.</li> <li>• On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark.</li> <li>• Israeli forces broke the ceasefire by opening fire and firing artillery shells from positions at the Green Line towards Gaza.</li> <li>• Israeli forces positioned behind the Green Line broke the ceasefire agreement by firing tank shells towards North Gaza.</li> <li>• Palestinian gunmen launched projectiles towards the Green Line.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NORTHERN GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Point:</b> Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists and international access.</li> <li>• <b>Attack:</b> At 11:00, Israeli forces fired tank shells towards agricultural land in Beit Hanoun.</li> <li>• <b>Detention:</b> On January 19<sup>th</sup> 2012, Israeli forces positioned at Erez crossing detained Bassim Rehan a resident of Jabalia as he was returning from treatment inside Israel.</li> <li>• <b>Palestinian Attack:</b> At 19:55 launched projectiles towards the Green Line.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Points:</b></li> <li>(i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.</li> <li>(ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>RAFAH</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Points:</b></li> <li>• Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed.</li> <li>• Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is closed</li> <li>• Sufa Crossing is closed.</li> <li>• Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the entry of humanitarian supplies, cooking gas, 43 truckloads of livestock feed and construction material for internationally-funded projects.</li> <li>• Al Awda crossing – Rafah was open for the exit of patients, students and passengers with permits.</li> </ul>
