	Closure: The Old City of Jerusalem remains closed to all civilians from all
	other districts. The Israeli authorities continue to intensify restrictions on
	the city.
JERUSALEM	• <u>Separation Wall Construction</u> : Construction of the separation wall
	continues in Al Eizariya, Abu Dis and Al Sawahira.
	Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 12 civilians including a girl. Murad
	Nimer Yaghi, 26 years, was identified among those arrested.
	• Palestinian Attack: At 08:35, a suicide bombing occurred in West
	Jerusalem killing 10 Israeli civilians and injuring more than 50.
	• Separation Wall Construction: Construction of the western portion of the
	separation wall continues in Budrus and Rantis.
	Occupying Private Property: At 18:15, the Israeli army occupied the roof
	of a civilian apartment compound in Ramallah City while detaining the
	residents.
	• Raids:
RAMALLAH	(i) At 10:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Ramallah, El Bireh and
&	the town of Beituniya and occupied several positions in these areas.
EL BIREH	The army withdrew at 19:45.
	(ii) At 02:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Silwad and the villages
	of Kobar and Abu Shukheidim and demolished 6 houses belonging to
	civilians currently in prison. The army destroyed water pipes,
	electricity grids and communications networks in the areas. The army
	then planted 2 unexploded ordnances in the village of Shukheidim.

	• Separation Wall Gates: Passage through the separation wall gates is
	restricted to civilians with special Israeli permits. The closure continues to

	• Separation Wall Construction: Construction of the separation wall
	continues in the northern valleys (Bardala and 'Ein al Beida) and east of
	Tubas (Al Mutilla, Al Mughayyir, Raba, and Al Buqei' plateau).

	(i) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Silat al Harithiya,
	surrounded a house and arrested 3 civilians.
	(ii) The Israeli army raided the town of Tubas, arrested a minor and 1
	female civilian.

	(i) The town of Al Walja remains closed.
	(ii) The main Beit Jala/Al Walaja road remains closed by dirt and rock
	mounds.
	(iii) The Israeli army closed all entrances to the city preventing civilians
	from entering or exiting the area.
	• <u>Incursions</u> :
	(i) At 03:50, a large Israeli force, including 20 armored personnel
	carriers, 20 jeeps and a number of trucks, raided the city from the west
	and south entrances. The army surrounded and raided Al Duheisha
	refugee camp, searched dozens of houses while detaining residents
	outside the premises. The army then raided the Al Doha
	neighborhood, searched a house and arrested 10 civilians including
BETHLEHEM	brothers from the refugee camp. The army withdrew at 06:30.
	(ii) At 04:20, the Israeli army, including 10 armored personnel carriers,
	raided 'Ayda refugee camp and imposed a curfew. The army then
	searched and demolished the house of the person who executed the
	suicide bombing in Jerusalem. The army searched several other
	houses in the refugee camp and arrested 2 brothers. The Israeli army
	remains present in the area as of 08:00 this morning.

	• Closure: The Israeli army closed Al Kafriyat checkpoint to civilians. This
	closure separates Tulkarem city from its southern villages and isolates the
	District of Tulkarem from other districts.
	• Separation Wall Gates: Passage through the separation wall gates is
	restricted to civilians with special Israeli permits. The closure continues to
	negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and
	impedes access to health facilities.
TULKAREM	• Raids:
	(i) At 24:00 and again at 00:40, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided
	the city of Tulkarem and occupied several positions.
	(ii) At 00:05, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided Nur Shams
	refugee camp.
	(iii) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the city and opened fire at several
	random locations. At 02:30, 3 Israeli jeeps occupied several positions
	in the city near the hospital and opened fire.
	• Air Patrols: At 12:00, an Israeli reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies
	over the city and refugee camps at low altitude.
	Closure: Nablus City remains a closed military area. Civilians are
	prohibited from leaving or entering the area.
	<ul> <li>Provocation of Palestinian Security Officers: At 07:45, an Israeli army jeep</li> </ul>
	carried out acts of provocation against a Palestinian security jeep as it was
	carrying out its duties of patrolling and maintaining order in the city. This
	comes despite the agreement reached between the Israeli and Palestinian
NABLUS	security services of allowing Palestinian security jeeps and uniformed
	security officers to carry out security duties without being confronted by
	the Israeli army.
	• Raids: The Israeli army raided Beit 'Ein al Ma refugee camp and arrested
	a minor.
	• Arrests:
	The Israeli army arrested 1 child in 'Ein Beit al Ma':

	a house and opened fire killing a father to 5 children.	
	(ii) The Israeli army raided the city and arrested 1 civilian.

	who is father to 5 children.	
	Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Bilal Ramadan Al Duweik, 21 years, a

GAZA	Dokeet and shelled the area near the Palestinian National Security
	Service, west of Beit Lahia, killing 2 security officers.
	• Killing: The Israeli army killed 2 members of the Palestinian National
	Security:
	(i) Muhammad Al Ashqar; and
	(ii) Muhammad Khalaf.
