ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Closure: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, set up several checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and prevented civilians under 45 years of age from accessing Al Aqsa Mosque to perform Friday prayers. Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat Al Bared in the city of Jerusalem with barbed wire and has denied civilian access. The Israeli army completely closed with cement blocks the main road leading to Dahiyat al Bared checkpoint towards the town of Beit Hanina and the settlement of Neve Ya'akov. The Israeli army only allows access to vehicles belonging to civilian residents of Dahiyat al Bared who possess permits or hold Jerusalem IDs. To access Dahiyat al Bared checkpoint, civilians must first travel through the centre of Dahiyat al Bared, passing through Rosary Sisters' School. In addition, the Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the road connecting Dahiyat al Bared to the town of Ar Ram. The Israeli army continues to close the eastern entrance to Dahiyat Bir Nabala with cement slabs, thereby completing the Wall section in the area. Checkpoint: According to new measures implemented at Qalandiya checkpoint, which the Israeli army has converted into a "border crossing point", the Israeli army has designated a special crossing for civilians holding Jerusalem-issued IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army has allowed other civilians to access the main road leading to the junction to the village of Jaba', which branches off to other districts. Wall Gates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem-issued IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, near Al Quds

	<p>University, in the town of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raids/Confiscation of Property:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis, raided the office of the Palestinian Minister of Jerusalem Affairs, and confiscated files belonging to the Minister. The Israeli army also searched 1 house and arrested 1 civilian. (ii) The Israeli army raided the town of Dahiyat al Bareed, raided the offices of members of the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC) for the city of Jerusalem, and confiscated computers and files. • <u>Arrest:</u> The Israeli army arrested ‘Uthman Mohammed Halabiyeh in the town of Abu Dis. • <u>Expulsion:</u> After having arrested a number of PLC members as was reported on 29 June 2006, the Israeli Minister of Interior issued a decision to withdraw the Jerusalem ID cards from the Palestinian Minister of Jerusalem Affairs and 3 PLC members (thereby depriving them from their citizenship rights in the city of Jerusalem). As a result, the Minister and PLC members will be prohibited from entering the city and accessing their houses. The Minister and PLC members are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Khaled Abu ‘Arafeh, the Palestinian Minister of Jerusalem Affairs; (ii) Mohammed Abu Teir, a PLC member; (iii) Mohammed Totah, a PLC member; and (iv) Ahmed ‘Attoun, a PLC member. • <u>Settler Violence/Destruction of Property:</u> A group of Israeli settlers broke windshields of civilian vehicles in the old city of Jerusalem.
<p>RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of ‘Atara and to deny access to the city of Ramallah for civilians holding IDs issued in the northern districts of the West Bank. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the areas of Al Midya to Budrus, Al Midya to Ni’lin, Bil’in to Saffa, in the village of Beit Liqya, in the town of Beituniya, and west of the town of ‘Abud and the village of Beit Sira. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:00, Israeli Special Forces raided the town of Beit Rima, raided a mechanic’s workshop, and arrested 1 child. (ii) The Israeli army raided the village of Beit Liqya and arrested 1 university student. (iii) The Israeli army raided the village of Deir as Sudan and arrested 1 civilian. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:00, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of ‘Atara arrested Ala’ Hasan Khateeb, a member of the local council in the town of Beit Rima.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) The Israeli army arrested 17-year-old Islam Farah Taha in the town of Beit Rima. (iii) The Israeli army arrested Nadeem Mustafa 'Assi in the village of Beit Liqya. (iv) The Israeli army arrested Nizar Rizq Abu Dhuha in the village of Deir As Sudan. • Detention: At 19:50, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara detained Hani Abu Qare', a Palestinian security officer, and released him at a later time, after having served him a summons to report to the Israeli Intelligence Service. • Demonstration: A mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil'in in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured 3 civilians as well as 1 international peace activist.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. The Israeli army also continues to install a surveillance camera in order to observe the area surrounding the checkpoint. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • Flying Checkpoint: At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Az Zababida and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 01:00, the Israeli army, including 10 jeeps, raided the city of Jenin, searched 1 house, and withdrew at 02:00.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following roads: the road connecting Dahiyat Dhinnaba in the city of Tulkarem to the town of Kafr al Labad; the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa; the southern entrance to the town of Baqa ash Sharqiya; the Kafr Sur-Wadi at Tin road; and the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil plain. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the road connecting the town of Beit Lid to the village of Kur. (ii) At 19:10, the Israeli army closed with dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Saffarin. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus road and to impede civilian access.

	<p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) and to impede civilian access.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • Raid: At 01:00, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided Tulkarem refugee camp. An armed confrontation took place between armed Palestinian individuals and the Israeli army while it was patrolling the area. At 04:20, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. • Demonstration: At 13:00, a mass demonstration took place in the city of Tulkarem in protest against the Israeli army's arrests of a number of Palestinian Ministers and PLC members as well as in denunciation of the Israeli military attacks on the Gaza Strip.
QALQILIYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of 'Azzun. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib. • Wall Gates: (i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the village of Immatin and east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun. • Flying Checkpoint: At 11:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of An Nabi Elyas and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: (i) At 11:45, and again at 12:30, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided and patrolled the city of Qalqiliya. (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army, including 4 jeeps, raided the town of 'Azzun and delivered a notice to the chairman of the town's local council preventing civilians from approaching the Wall and warning that civilians would put their lives in danger if they fail to comply. • Demonstration: At 19:30, a mass demonstration took place in the city of Qalqiliya in protest against the Israeli army's arrests of a number of Palestinian Ministers and PLC members as well as in denunciation of the Israeli military attacks on the Gaza Strip.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus main road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron.

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades Al Badhan road, which is the north-eastern entrance to the city of Nablus.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting the city of Nablus to the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya.
- **Checkpoints:** The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
 - (i) Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. Access to civilians between 15 and 30 years of age as well as holders of IDs issued in the districts of Jenin and Tulkarem is also denied. .
 - (ii) Al Badhan checkpoint (set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Nablus) remains closed with dirt barricades.
 - (iii) Nablus-'Asira ash Shamaliya checkpoint (set up at the northern entrance to city) is open from 06:30 to 20:00.
 - (iv) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.
 - (v) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30.
- **Raid/Air Patrol/House Occupation/Destruction of Property:** Beginning at 01:40 on 30 June 2006, the Israeli army remained positioned in the city of Nablus as well as Balata refugee camp and continued to surround the eastern cemetery, whilst combat helicopters and 1 reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over the area. The Israeli army also continued to open fire and fire missile shells towards armed Palestinian individuals who took position inside the cemetery, killing 1 armed individual. In addition, the Israeli army arrested 3 other armed individuals, including 1 individual who was injured and surrounded inside the cemetery for over 20 hours. The Israeli army also caused damage to tombs and houses near the cemetery, occupied a number of buildings, converted them into military posts, and prevented medics from accessing the area. Additionally, the Israeli army detained Dr. Ghassan Hamdan, the Director of the Union of Palestinian Medical Relief Committees, for a period of time, after which it released him. Confrontations also took place between the Israeli army and civilians in the city of Nablus, during which the Israeli army critically injured 14-year-old Ya'qoub Mohammed ash Shakhshir. Other confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians in the area surrounding the eastern cemetery, during which the Israeli army injured 31 civilians, including 8 children and 80-year-old Mahmoud Taher Hmeidh, as well as 1 Palestinian Police officer. Moreover, the Israeli army searched 1 building in the city of Nablus and arrested 1 civilian. At 04:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- **Killing:** The Israeli army killed Mahmoud Yousef Zakari inside the eastern cemetery in the city of Nablus.
- **Arrests:** The Israeli army arrested 3 armed Palestinian individuals in the eastern cemetery in the city of Nablus:
 - (i) Waleed ash Shahrouri, an injured Palestinian individual;

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) Ya'qoub Shukwarah; and (iii) Khaled Jaber. (iv) The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Zuheir 'Innab in the city of Nablus.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising). (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrances to the towns of Bruqin and Deir Istiya and to the village of Marda. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to prevent civilians holding IDs issued in the districts of Jenin and Tulkarem from crossing towards the southern districts of the West Bank. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend near the Green Line in the town of Deir Ballut and the villages of Az Zawiya and Rafat, northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho-issued IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli-issued IDs. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Al Hamra checkpoint set up on the Jericho-Nablus road, denying civilian access, except for farmers holding Jericho-issued IDs. The Israeli army also continues to install a surveillance camera in order to observe the area surrounding the checkpoint. • <u>Confiscation of Property:</u> At 23:20, Israeli troops positioned at Al Hamra checkpoint confiscated 1 civilian vehicle.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. The Israeli army considers the civilians' residence in the village illegal because they hold West Bank identity cards while their village is located within the Israeli-defined municipal boundaries of Jerusalem. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.

	<p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Beit Fajjar to the village of Marah Rabah.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the “Container”) checkpoint and to deny access to civilian vehicles, except for those possessing access permits. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend north of ‘Ayda refugee camp and in the Everest area, northwest of the city of Beit Jala. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:30, and again at 24:00, the Israeli army, including 4 jeeps, raided and patrolled the town of Al Khadr. (ii) At 21:40, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided and patrolled the city of Beit Jala. (iii) At 03:15, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem. • Demonstration: At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the town of Al Khadr in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors.
<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada’ Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the closure of civilian commercial shops on both sides of the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba’ to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron. Civilian vehicles continue to be prohibited from travelling along the road unless they possess access permits. Only Israeli settler vehicles are allowed unrestricted access on the road. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the entrance to the village of Beit ‘Einun; Al Baq’a junction south of the town of Beit ‘Awwa; and the entrance to the village of ‘Arab ar Ramadin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron with cement blocks. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend west of the towns of Surif and Beit Ula, south of the towns of Adh Dhahiriya and As Samoa’, and southeast of the town of Yatta. The Israeli army has

	<p>also completed construction of most sections of the Wall in the town of Idhna, from the village of Deir Samit to the town of Beit 'Awwa, from Beit 'Awwa to the village of Al Burj, and in the village of Ar Ramadin.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) The Israeli army set up 3 flying checkpoints: on the overpass to the town of Halhul; on Al Fawwar junction; and at the entrance to the village of Al Majd. Israeli troops positioned at these flying checkpoints searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids/Confiscation of Property:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar, raided the offices of 1 charitable association where it confiscated computers and a number of files, and raided 1 kindergarten. (ii) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Yatta. (iii) The Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.

GAZA STRIP

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Beginning on 16 December 2005, the Israeli army has continued to impose a complete closure on the Gaza Strip ostensibly due to Palestinian individuals' firing of mortars towards the Green Line. • Beginning on 25 June 2006, and following the arrest of an Israeli soldier during the Palestinian attack on the Israeli army military post near Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing, the Israeli army has continued to reinforce the concentration of its armed forces along the northern and eastern borders of the Gaza Strip. In addition, the Israeli army has carried out a limited incursion into the eastern Rafah district and imposed a sea blockade that has prevented Palestinian fishing boats from sailing. • Within the past 24 hours, Israeli army F16 combat aircrafts patrolled the skies over the Gaza Strip districts, carried out over 40 diversionary air raids, and broke the sound barrier.

<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> Beginning at 18:00 on 28 December 2005, the Israeli army has continued to impose a buffer zone (through open fire as well as artillery and air attacks) in the area near the Green Line, including the area of the debris of evacuated settlements. • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open only to foreign nationals as well as critically-ill civilians. • <u>Air Attacks/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 00:55, an Israeli army F16 combat aircraft fired 1 missile towards Palestinian territory in the area of Al Waha northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) At 01:15, an Israeli army F16 combat aircraft fired 1 missile towards Palestinian territory near 1 Palestinian National Security location northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya. (iii) At 03:00, Israeli army F16 combat aircrafts fired 2 missiles towards Palestinian territory north of the overpass to the town of Beit Hanun. • <u>Attacks/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:</u> Between 08:00 and 21:00, the Israeli army fired 157 artillery shells from its locations inside the Green Line towards Palestinian territory: 61 artillery shells landed near Palestinian National Security locations north and northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya; 95 shells landed near the Palestinian National Security Headquarters as well as other Palestinian National Security locations in the area surrounding the town of Beit Hanun; and 1 shell landed at the entrance to Beit Hanun (Erez) Industrial Zone. • <u>Palestinian Attacks:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:20, 2 unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line, of which 1 mortar landed on Palestinian territory. (ii) At 16:30, 2 unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line. (iii) At 21:00, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
