- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
   Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
  (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
  - (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Furik town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Yitzhar settlement and prevented civilian vehicles from travelling along the road leading to the junction to Jit village in Qalqiliya district.
- (iii) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Salem village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Nablus city and 'Asira ash Shamaliya town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 02:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Deir Sharaf village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 23:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Deir Sharaf village.

#### • Settler Violence/Destruction of Property:

- (i) At 11:15, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat two civilians on the junction to Yitzhar settlement. Settlers also threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling along the main road near the junction.
- (ii) At 12:45, a group of Israeli settlers from Yitzhar settlement set fire to civilian farmland in Huwwara town and Burin village, damaging many olive trees.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

# (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town.

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland.
- (iii) Beginning on 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has continued to open the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Ash Shawawra village and searched civilians and vehicles until 14:30.
- (ii) At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Jala city and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:20.
- (iii) At 15:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to Beit Sahur city near Dar Salah village and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:35.
- (iv) At 22:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the western entrance to Husan village, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a child.
- Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the western entrance to Husan village arrested 16-year-old Ibrahim Sami 'Awadh Hamamreh.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) Beginning on 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evacuated residents and denied civilian access to the area.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Adh Dhahiriya and As Samoa' towns, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani and Al Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.

#### • Flying Checkpoints/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:

- (i) At 08:15, the Israeli army set up two flying checkpoints at the entrances to Beit 'Awwa town and Tarusa village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 12:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to An Nabi Yunis area on the Hebron-Bethlehem main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Yatta and As Samoa' towns and searched civilian vehicles.
- (iv) At 16:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Ash Shalala Street in the old city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### Hebron

- (v) At 07:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction, searched civilians and vehicles, detained a Palestinian National Security vehicle, and allowed it to cross after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).
- Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces/Attack:
- (i) At 08:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dura town.
- (ii) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Halhul and Sa'ir towns.
- (iii) At 14:50, the Israeli army raided Bab az Zawiya square in Hebron city and attempted to examine ID cards belonging to Palestinian Police officers while they were carrying out security duties. At 15:40, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- (iv) At 01:10, the Israeli army raided Surif town and fired flares while it was patrolling the area.
- <u>Arrest</u>: At 22:30, the Israeli army arrested 14-year-old Mohammed 'Adel Mousa Abu 'Ayyash in the old city of Hebron, allegedly for locating a knife in his possession.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 16:10 on 29 June 2011, a group of Israeli settlers beat Ramadan Abu al Kbash south of As Samoa' town. The Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area at a later time.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.

• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011.

#### Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, NORTHERN international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians **GAZA** intending to travel to Jordan through Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, (i) the Crossing has been effectively closed upon an Israeli unilateral **GAZA** decision. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January (ii) 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
