WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city.

• **Checkpoints**:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.

• Raids/Confiscation of Property:

- (i) At 15:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of Samir Amis north of the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) At 20:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddu. While searching a house, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. Israeli troops also confiscated a box containing jewellery and arrested a civilian.

Arrests:

(i) At 20:20, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up near the village of An Nabi Samwil arrested Mohammed Abdul Rahman Mansour.

JERUSALEM

	(ii) The Israeli army arrested Qadri Yoused Ni'man ash Sheikh in the town of Biddu.
	• <u>Demonstration</u> : In the morning of 01 July 2010, a mass demonstration took place in front of the American Consulate and International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in protest against Israeli deportation policy. The demonstration also held in solidarity with 3 members of the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC) and a former Palestinian minister, who the Israeli authorities threaten to revoke their Jerusalemite ID cards and deport them from the city of Jerusalem.
	• Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
	Closure of Main Roads:
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. Flying Checkpoint: At 20:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of 'Atara, searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded civilian access. Raid: At 02:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Bir Zeit and patrolled the area until 03:25. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.

	 Raid: At 19:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Zububa. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 20:10, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. Raids/Destruction of Property: At dawn on 01 July 2010, the Israeli army raided the villages of 'Ein al Beida and Bardala and arrested 2 civilians. At 09:50, the Israeli army raided the area of Ar Ras al Ahmar in the Northern Jordan Valley. To force them to evacuate, the Israeli army demolished makeshift houses and sheep pens belonging to 9 families. At 11:20, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. At 15:00, the Israeli army raided the Tayasir village plain and arrested 7 civilians. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the village of 'Ein al Beida and Bardala: Saed Hasan Abu Shaddad; and Fares Khaled Khudeirat. The Israeli army arrested 7 civilians in the Tayasir village plain: Jihad Abdul Razeq Dabak; Mu'ath Isma'il Dabak; Mu'ath Isma'il Dabak; Diham Fayez Mohammed Dabak; Jiman'ah Khaled 'Amer; and Fayez Ahmed Dabak. Detention: At 19:25, the Israeli army arrested Fat'hiyyah Ibrahim Amin Sawaftah, a female resident of the city of Tubas, while she was visiting her imprisoned son in Galoa' Prison. Having interrogated her, the Israeli army released Fa'hiyyah at 22:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Raid: At 16:40, the Israeli army raided Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem and searched a mechanic's workshop. At 23:05, the Israeli army raided the village of Shufa, searched a house under construction, and withdrew at 00:45. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

NABLUS	checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
	(i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed
	on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all
	other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only
	between 07:00 and 02:00.
	(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross
	between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays.
	All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but

SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to 2 detour roads connecting the village of Marda to respective agricultural land. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flying Checkpoint: At 10:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Destruction of Property: At 21:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Az Zubeidat. At 01:15, the Israeli army raided 'Aqbat Jaber refugee camp, searched a house, damaged furniture, and withdrew at 03:35.
BETHLEHEM	• Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.

- (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.
- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Bag'a.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) At 17:30, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab and left at a later time.
- (ii) At 23:30, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to wheel tyres at the entrance to the village of Ash Shawawra.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades an entrance to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

HEBRON

(v) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the city of Hebron to the town of Adh Dhahiriya; the road to the town of As Samoa'; the entrance to the village of 'Abda; and the road between the town of Dura and the village of Wadi ash Shajina.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Ummar and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 19:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Dura and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 23:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 01:00, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints at the entrances to the towns of Adh Dhahiriya and As Samoa' and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 08:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Idhna.
- (ii) At 11:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Wadi ash Shajina.
- (iii) At 14:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the city again, raided the Ash Shar'iya School, and examined computers.
- (iv) At 16:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kurza.
- (v) At 18:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians.
- Arrest: At 01:05 on 01 July 2010, the Israeli army arrested Basem Hasan al Masalmeh during its raid into the town of Beit 'Awwa, in addition to those reported yesterday.
- <u>Destruction of Property</u>: At 11:20, the Israeli army removed vendor stalls on both sides of Road # 60 near the town of Beit Ummar.

• <u>Settler Violence</u>:

- (i) At 17:10, a group of Israeli settlers cut down and damaged a number of olive trees with electric saws in Tal Rumeida neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron.
- (ii) At 04:00, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to 2 vehicles in Tal Rumeida neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron. The vehicles belonged to:
 - (i) Hana' Abu Heikal: and
 - (ii) Yihya Abu Zeina.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ALL ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. **DISTRICTS Violations of the Ceasefire:** The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire (i) from its location on the Green Line towards civilian houses and property in the district of Khan Yunis. Armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops along (ii) the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u> : Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Incidents not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	 Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: In the morning of 01 July 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of the village of 'Abasan as Saghira. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled agricultural land. Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack: In the evening of 01 July 2010, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops along the Green Line east of the town of 'Abasan al Kabira. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow 480 patients, students, and students holding visas to leave the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to 604 civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals.

- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
- (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
- <u>Air Attack/Destruction of Property</u>: At dawn on 01 July 2010, Israeli F16 combat aircraft fired a missile on an already destroyed building at Yasser Arafat International Airport.

GENERAL

POLITICAL PRISONERS

• <u>Sentence</u>: The Israeli military court at 'Ofar Detention and Interrogation Centre sentenced Mohammed Isma'il Salameh 'Ubayyat, a resident of the city of Bethlehem, to 14 years in prison.
