# WEST BANK

Closure:  (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, only allowing access to civilians holding special permits.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.  Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.  Checkpoint: The Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designates a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.  Raid/Injuries: In the evening of 06 July 2011, the Israeli army raided Al 'Isawiya village. Meantime, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured two civilians, including Ahmed al Masri. The Israeli army also arrested three civilians, including an injured civilian.  Arrests: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. - (i) At 14:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Tulkarem city and Tulkarem refugee camp.
- (ii) At 02:45, the Israeli army raided Dahiyat Shuweika in Tulkarem city, searched two houses, and arrested a civilian.
- <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested Sameer Abdul Qader Saleh Omar in Dahiyat Shuweika in Tulkarem city.
- Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route continues in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.

### • Closure of Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.
- (ii) In addition to closing the iron gate installed since the outbreak the second *Intifada*, the Israeli army has continued to close since 03:10 on 01 July 2011 the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village with dirt barricades.

### • Raids:

- (i) At 10:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Jayyus town.
- (ii) At 11:10, the Israeli army raided 'Azzun town, searched a commercial premise, and served a summons on Mu'awiyah Abdul Latif Ahmed Radhwan to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 18:40, the Israeli army raided the town again and searched a house.
- (iii) At 15:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled 'Izbat at Tabib village.
- (iv) At 04:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Qalqiliya city.

### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

- (i) At 10:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Yasuf village and searched civilians and vehicles until 11:00.
- (ii) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Deir Istiya town and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army also detained Jamil Abdul Latif Suleiman and released him at 19:30 after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).
- Raids:
- (i) At 22:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Deir Ballut town.
- (ii) At 00:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Haris village.
- (iii) At 01:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Khirbet Qeis village.
- <u>Arrest</u>: At 19:20, Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Abed Nathmi 'Antar.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of Emmanuel settlement.
- <u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.
- Checkpoints:
- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district as well as to others holding access permits.
- <u>Flying Checkpoints</u>: At 20:45, and again at 07:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 00:10, the Israeli army raided 'Aqbat Jaber refugee camp in Jericho city, searched a number of houses, and arrested two civilians as well as a Palestinian security officer.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The Israeli army arrested two civilians and a Palestinian security officer in 'Aqbat Jaber refugee camp in Jericho city:
- (i) Ma'in Mohammed 'Adwan, a Palestinian General Intelligence officer;
- (ii) Hammoudeh Ahmed 'Assi Dhamrah; and
- (iii) Khalil Ahmed 'Assi Dhamrah.
- **Provocation of Palestinian Forces:** At 10:50, Israeli troops positioned at Al 'Auja checkpoint detained a Palestinian National Security vehicle and allowed it to cross after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).

### **JERICHO**

### • <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the southeastern area of the village.
- (ii) Beginning on 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has continued to prevent civilians from accessing or staying on 22 *dunums* of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 22:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Jannata town and searched civilians and vehicles.

### • Raids:

- (i) At 09:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al 'Ubeidiya town.
- (ii) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided Beit Jala city, Ad Doha town, and 'Ayda refugee camp. The Israeli army searched a house and withdrew at 11:45.
- (iii) At 12:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Harmala village.
- (iv) At 03:30, the Israeli army raided Husan village, searched a number of houses, and arrested three civilians, including a child.

### • Arrests:

(i) At 20:50, Israeli troops arrested Nidhal Mohammed 'Ubeid, a resident of Ad Duheisha refugee camp in Bethlehem city, while he was reporting to the Israeli Intelligence in Kfar 'Etzion settlement.

The Israeli army arrested three civilians in Husan village:

- (ii) Mohammed Ali 'Amer Sabatin, 17 years old;
- (iii) Abdul Hamid Sami Hamamreh; and
- (iv) Mohammed 'Adel 'Odeh Hamamreh.

### • Detentions:

- (i) At 10:00, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained four civilians and released them after serving summonses on two civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (ii) At 13:10, Israeli troops detained Mu'ath Ali Mohammed 'Odeh, a 17-year-old resident of Al Walaja village, while he was reporting to the Israeli Intelligence agency in Kfar 'Etzion settlement. Israeli troops released Mu'ath at 21:25.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: On 06 July 2011, Israeli settlers discharged truckloads of solid waste in Wadi Abu Shahin area near Efrat settlement in the vicinity of Artas village.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 11:00, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration on the square of the Nativity Church in Bethlehem city in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Protestors also demanded that all prisoners be released from Israeli jails.

### **BETHLEHEM**

	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.
	Closure:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.  (ii) Beginning on 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evacuated residents and denied civilian access to the area.

### **GAZA STRIP**

# At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011. Violation of the Ceasefire: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire on civilian houses and property in Khan Yunis and Rafah districts. The Israeli army opened fire from its location on the Green Line on Palestinian territory in Rafah district. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians

# **GAZA** intending to travel to Jordan through Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, (i) the Crossing has been effectively closed upon an Israeli unilateral **GAZA** decision (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. **CENTRAL** Incidents not reported. GAZA Raid/Attack/Land Levelling: At 06:00, the Israeli army, including several tanks, armoured vehicles, and two bulldozers, raided approximately 300 **KHAN YUNIS** metres into Palestinian territory east of 'Abasan al Kabira and Khuza'a towns. While levelling land, the Israeli army opened intensive fire on civilian houses and property. **Closure of Crossing Points:** (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to civilians arriving from Egypt (ii) **RAFAH** and to those departing the Gaza Strip. Five tons of medicine and medical supplies were also transported to the Gaza Strip through the Crossing. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.

- (iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for the transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, cooking gas, and construction cargo designated to internationally-funded projects.
- Attack: In the morning of 06 July 2011, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line on farmland on the outskirts of Ash Shoka town east of Rafah city.
- Raid/Attack/Land Levelling: In the morning of 06 July 2011, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers, raided Palestinian territory near Sufa Crossing northeast of Rafah city. While levelling land, the Israeli army opened fire intensively on civilian houses and property.
