

## WEST BANK

JERUSALEM	Closure:  (i) On 08 July 2011, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city, set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and prevented civilians from other districts from accessing the mosque and performing Friday prayers.  (i) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.  Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.  Checkpoint: The Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designates a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.  Wall Gates:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.  Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Az Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi al 'Eizariya west of Ma'ale Adumim settlement.

Closure of Main Roads:  The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting Kafr al Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages.  The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.  Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.  Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted
wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route continues in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
Closure of Roads:  The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.  In addition to closing the iron gate installed since the outbreak the second Intifada, the Israeli army has continued to close since 03:10 on 01 July 2011 the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village with dirt barricades.  Flying Checkpoints/Detention:  At 09:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Kafr Qaddum village and denied access to civilian vehicles to or from the village. Israeli troops also detained lhab Mu'ayyad Ishteiwi and released him after serving a summons to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.  At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Hajja and Kafr Qaddum villages and searched civilians.  At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Qalqiliya city and searched civilians and vehicles.  Demonstration: At 13:20, a mass demonstration took place in Kafr Qaddum village in protest against the closure of the village's eastern entrance as well as against Israeli settler violence and confiscation of civilian land. Meanwhile, Israeli troops intercepted the demonstration and prevented protestors from accessing the closed gate.  Wall Gates:  The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.  The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 15:25, and again at 00:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to Bethlehem city) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:40, and again at 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Husan village and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 13:45, the Israeli army raided Harasa area east of Beit Sahur city and delivered a notice for the demolition of a house belonging to Mohammed Sa'id al Barmil, allegedly because it had been built without the required construction licence.
- (ii) At 15:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al Khadr town.
- (iii) At 19:05, the Israeli army raided Husan village and patrolled it until 20:30.

#### • Arrests:

- (i) At 09:30, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoints arrested 'Adel Yousef Naji al Jubour.
- (ii) At 13:40, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoints arrested Saed Abdul Ra'ouf Yaseen.

#### • Demonstrations/Physical Assaults:

- (i) At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Al Ma'sara village in protest against Wall construction on the seventh anniversary of the International Court of Justice (ICJ) Advisory Opinion on the *Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory*. Israeli troops severely beat participants, preventing them from accessing the Wall construction site. Consequently, four protestors, including Mohammed Ahmed Bureijiyyeh sustained contusions.
- (ii) At 18:00, a mass demonstration, including peace activists, took place on the square of the Nativity Church, in protest against denial of access to international peace activists to the Palestinian territory.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

## • <u>Closure</u>:

## Hebron

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) Beginning on 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evacuated residents and denied civilian access to the area.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Adh Dhahiriya and As Samoa' towns, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani and Al Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades a detour road leading to the entrance to As Simiya village.
- Flying Checkpoint: At 01:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Ummar town and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 17:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hebron city.
- (ii) At 18:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dura town.
- (iii) At 19:25, the Israeli army raided Yatta town and searched a number of commercial premises of vehicle spare parts.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.

#### **GAZA STRIP**

#### ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011.
- <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army fired tank shells from its location on the Green Line on Palestinian territory in Northern Gaza district

#### NORTHERN GAZA

- Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through *Al Karama* (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank.
- <u>Attack</u>: In the morning of 08 July 2011, the Israeli army fired a number of tank shells from its location on the Green Line on agricultural land east of Jabalya town.
