JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On 09 July 2010, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, set up several flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and denied access to civilians to perform Friday prayers at the mosque. (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. • <u>Demonstrations/Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:30, civilians performed Friday prayers in front of offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in Ash Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem in protest against the Israeli deportation policy and in solidarity with 3 Jerusalemite members of the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC) as well as a former Palestinian minister, who the Israeli authorities threaten to revoke their ID cards and deport them from the city. (ii) At 17:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Ash Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem in protest against Israeli settlement enterprises and Israeli settlers' seizure of civilian houses. Israeli troops blocked the demonstration and detained 3 Israeli peace activists. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.

	<p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
<p>RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya.</p> <p>(ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Flying Checkpoint: At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of 'Atara, searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded civilian access until 15:00. • Demonstrations/Attacks/Injuries/Detentions: <p>(i) At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the town of Ni'lin against Wall construction on the 6th anniversary of the ICJ Advisory Opinion on <i>Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory</i>. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army a number of participants also sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation.</p> <p>(ii) At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil'in against Wall construction on the 6th anniversary of the International Court of Justice (ICJ) Advisory Opinion on <i>Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory</i>. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured 2 civilians. A number of participants also sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation. The Israeli army also detained 2 international peace activists.</p> <p>(iii) At 13:30, a mass demonstration took place in the village of An Nabi Salih against Israeli settler violence and confiscation of civilian land for expansion of the settlement of Halamish. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which</p>

	<p>the Israeli army injured a number of participations as a result of tear gas inhalation. The Israeli army also arrested a civilian and detained 2 Israeli peace activists.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Naji at Tamimi in the village of An Nabi Salih. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of ‘Abud; in the village of Bil’in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni’lin and Ni’lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. • Flying Checkpoint: At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the town of ‘Arraba and searched civilians and vehicles. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and ‘Izbat Shufa. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Flying Checkpoint: At 20:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Kafriyat road connecting the districts of Tulkarem and Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 20:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem. (ii) At 00:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Jarushiya. (iii) At 00:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Lid. (iv) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Deir al Ghusun. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints/Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of ‘Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. At 20:20, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 20:45. (ii) At 17:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of ‘Azzun and the village of ‘Izbat at Tabib, searched civilians and vehicles, detained family members, and released them after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO). (iii) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the settlement of Kedumim on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main and searched civilians and vehicles until 20:00. • <u>Flying Checkpoints/Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:00, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to farmland in the area of Al Muntar in the town of ‘Azzun. (ii) At 20:40, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Emanuel threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling along the Wadi Qana road connecting the districts of Qalqiliya and Salfit, breaking windshields of 3 vehicles. Subsequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.

	<p>(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</p> <p>(iii) At 17:25, the Israeli army closed Beit Furik checkpoint and reopened it at 18:30.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <p>(i) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Qusin and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(ii) At 14:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Iraq Burin and searched s and vehicles until 15:00.</p> <p>(iii) At 15:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and the village of Ijnisiya and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iv) At 17:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Burqa and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> • <u>Raids:</u> <p>(i) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Rujeib.</p> <p>(ii) At 21:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area between the villages of 'Asira al Qibliya and Madama.</p>
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin.</p> <p>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to 2 detour roads connecting the village of Marda to respective agricultural land.</p> • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Az Zubeidat and searched civilians and vehicles.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Ash Shawawra and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 10:20, a group of Israeli settlers protected by the Israeli army gained access to the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur and withdrew at 15:20. • <u>Demonstrations/Attacks/Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:20, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Artas in protest against the Israeli army for preventing civilians from constructing a road leading to their farmland. (ii) At 13:10, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Ma'sara against Wall construction on the 6th anniversary of the ICJ Advisory Opinion on <i>Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory</i>. Israeli troops blocked the demonstration and prevented participants from accessing land under the threat of confiscation. (iii) At 13:10, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Wadi Rahhal against Wall construction on the 6th anniversary of the ICJ Advisory Opinion on <i>Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory</i>. Israeli troops blocked the demonstration and prevented participants from accessing land under the threat of confiscation. (iv) At 13:10, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Walaja against Wall construction on the 6th anniversary of the ICJ Advisory Opinion on <i>Legal Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory</i>.

<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Kurza, searched civilian vehicles, and arrested 2 civilians. • Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura, patrolled the area, and took position in front of a Palestinian Preventive Security office. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 12:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. (ii) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided Al 'Arrub refugee camp, searched a number of houses, and withdrew at 19:20. • Arrests: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the entrance to the village of Kurza arrested 2 civilians: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Majed Mohammed Quteit; and

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) Abdul Qader Mustafa Abdul Qader. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of ‘Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.
NORTHERN GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.
GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (ii) Ash Shuja’iya (Nahal ‘Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Incidents not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Incidents not reported.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser ‘Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (Al ‘Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow patients, students, and students holding visas to leave the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed.
