JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque. (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order #S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram. (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem. Raid: At 03:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Ar-Ram and patrolled the area. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued military order declaring the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin

	and the village of Bil'in as closed military zones from 08:00 until 20:00 every Friday and for a period of 6 months. Civilian access is denied during the mentioned period without a special permit in order to prevent the weekly demonstrations against the Wall. • Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 23:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the town of At-Tayba (on Ramallah – Jericho main road) and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 23:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Deir Abu Mash'al and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Rima and patrolled the area. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the towns and villages of 'Abud and Bil'in, and in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to 'Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. Raids: At 10:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al Yamun town. At 10:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of As-Silat Al Harithiya. At 15:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Az-Zababida until 16:30. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	 Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, east of the city of Tubas, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00. Raid: At 23:05, the Israeli army raided Al Far'a village and patrolled the area.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road. Raid: At 03:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of 'Anabta and Bal'a. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Azzun. Again at 18:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 17:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Hajja and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Habla and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 21:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to Qalqiliya city.
- (v) At 21:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Jinsafut.

• Raids:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Habla town.
- (ii) At 18:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Hajja and searched a number of deserted houses.
- (iii) At 23:55, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya, searched 4 houses after destroying the doors of 3 houses, took photographs for the houses from inside and withdrew at 06:00.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) On 12 May 2010, the Israeli army erected an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha (after removing the iron gate erected at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya), and prevented civilians from the village from passing through it. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through gate # 109.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement.

NABLUS

• Checkpoints:

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00.
- (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00.

	 Raids: At 00:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Furik. At 02:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Nablus until 06:10.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrances of 2 side roads between the village of Marda and its agricultural land. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access. Flying Checkpoint: At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Qarawat Bani Hassan and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 14:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddya and searched a number of commercial shops. At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Bruqin town. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: At 21:05, the Israeli army closed all entrances to Jericho city, set up flying checkpoints at its entrances, prevented the departure of civilians traveling to Jordan and only allowed those coming from Jordan to enter Jericho city. Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those possessing permits. Flying Checkpoints: At 21:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Az-Zubeidat and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city. At 21:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Ein Ad Duyuk (the northern entrance to Jericho city) and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 13:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Khursa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of At-Tabaqa and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hebron city.
- (ii) At 15:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dura town.
- (iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Adh Dhahiriya town.
- (iv) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided Ar-Rihiya village, searched 9 houses and served summons to 4 civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (v) At 02:05, the Israeli army raided the town of Sa'ir and fired stun grenades while searching a house.
- Attack: At 17:00, the Israeli army in front of Al Arrub refugee camp fired tear gas bombs towards civilians at the entrance to the refugee camp under the pretext of throwing stones.
- Arrests: On 11 July 2010, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians at a checkpoint in the periphery of Hebron city. The 2 civilians who come from Jenin refugee camp are Taysir Ali Hasan Jabr and Qutayba Ibrahim Jabr.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 09:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Kiryat Arba', located in the old city of Hebron, severely beat 65-year-old civilian Jadallah Mahmoud Jadallah. As a result, he sustained injuries and contusions and evacuated to hospital for treatment.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the Israeli army declared a unilateral ceasefire. In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a oneweek-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period.

	The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory, opening fire in Northern Gaza district and opening fire from its locations on the Green Line in the district of Khan Yunis. As a result, an armed Palestinian individual was injured.
NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. Raid: In the evening of 12 July 2010, the Israeli army, including 5 armored vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided Palestinian territory north of Beit Lahiya town and opened fire intensively towards civilian agricultural land and houses while leveling an area of land.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is partially open for the transport of wheat and fodder. (ii) Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing for fuel transport is closed since 04 January 2010 by an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YOUNIS	• Attack: In the afternoon of 12 July 2010, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations in the periphery of Kissufim Gate that is located on the Green Line towards armed Palestinian individuals in the periphery of the gate northeast of Al Qarara town. As a result, 1 armed Palestinian individual was injured.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open. It allows the departure of civilian patients, students and visa holders, and the entry of civilians and patients who received treatment at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the transport of food, humanitarian assistance, a quantity of industrial diesel for the electricity plant and cooking gas.

Prison Sentences: The Israeli military court at Salem Military Camp passed

- 6) Nidal Jameel Najjar to 7 months in prison and a fine of 5000 shekel (equivalent to \$1295).
- 7) As'ad Hasan Shbeitah to 4 months and 10 days in prison and a fine of 1500 shekel (equivalent to \$383).
- 8) Darweesh Al Bustami to 6 months in prison and a fine of 10000 shekel (equivalent to \$2590).

The court postponed for varied periods the trials of 8 political prisoners and extended orders of administrative detention for varying periods against 10 other prisoners.
