JERUSALEM	 <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound. On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Barced from the town of Ar Ram. On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem. IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. <u>Maid</u>: At 01:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Ar Ram. <u>Wall Castes</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the t

RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. <u>Arrests</u>: At 02:40 on 15 July 2010, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians during its raid into the village of Qarawat Bani Zeid, as was reported yesterday:
JENIN	 <u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. <u>Raids</u>: (i) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of As Suweitat in the city of Jenin. (ii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Barta'a, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, and searched civilians and vehicles. While searching 2 houses, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 03:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 20:40, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to the evacuated settlement of Sanur and withdrew at a later time. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. <u>Raid</u>: On 15 July 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of Yarza and delivered a notice to the Projects Committee on cessation of the construction of a mosque in the village. <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested Ahmed Sa'id Ahmed Bisharat in the town of Tammun.

TULKAREM	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. <u>Raids</u>: At 02:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp, took photographs of 2 gates of the Al Muqata'a (complex of Palestinian security forces), and searched a house. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. 	
QALQILYA	 <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. <u>Flving Checkpoints</u>: At 09:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Immatin and searched civilians and vehicles. At 11:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles. At 15:15, and again at 21:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Raids</u>: At 10:05, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun and patrolled the area until 10:40. At 13:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Qalqiliya. At 10:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Habla. At 00:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Jit. <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 19:50, an Israeli settler vehicle ran over a herd of sheep on the main road in the centre of the AI Funduq village. Subsequently, the Israeli army arrested the sheep tender, ostensibly because he had damaged the Israeli settler's vehicle. <u>Arrests</u>:	

	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
	 At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
NABLUS	 (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
	 Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 11:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Qabalan, searched civilians and vehicles, arrested a civilian, and withdrew at 13:55. (ii) At 10:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between

	 (i) At 13:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of 'Urif. (ii) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and patrolled the area until 03:00. Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the
	 <u>Arrest</u>: Israell troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the entrance to the town of Qabalan arrested Walid Yousef Ali Abu Ziyadeh. <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 13:50, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Migdalim set fire to agricultural land in the village of Qusra, damaging olive trees cultivated on a 5-dunum (1.235-acre) area of land.
SALFIT	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin.

	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to 2 detour roads connecting the village of Marda to respective agricultural land.
	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.

	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks.

 (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Fasayil and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Arrest</u>: At 20:30, Israeli troops positioned on Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge arrested Sa'id Mohammed 'Amleh, a resident of the town of Qabalan in the district of Nablus, while he was travelling to Jordan.
 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. Flving Checkpoint: At 22:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Destruction of Property: At 10:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Bethlehem and patrolled the area until 10:45. At 12:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Artas. Destruction of Property: At 10:00, the Israeli army demolished a greenhouse belonging to Mousa Salem Salah in the vicinity of the town of Al Khadr. Settler Violence: At 21:45, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur and withdrew at a later time.
 <u>Closure</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the

	 entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.
	<u>Closure of Main Roads:</u>
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
	Flying Checkpoints/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:
	(i) At 08:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the Abu Sneina area in the old city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
	(ii) At 10:20, and again at 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.
	(iii) At 13:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Bani Na'im and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:10, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint, detained at gunpoint a Palestinian Police vehicle, transporting 3 Police officers, and released them at 22:45 after coordination with the Israeli authorities through the DCO).
	• <u>Raids</u> :
	i) At 10:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Abu al 'Irqan near the settlement of 'Otniel and demolished 2 civilian houses, claiming that they had been built without the required construction licences. During confrontations, civilians prevented the Israeli army from demolishing another house belonging to Rawhi Khalil Mustafa ash Shawamreh.
(ii) At 10:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
	iii) At 13:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Surif.
	iv) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tarqumiya.
	v) At 17:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of Huneina in the town of Dura.
	vi) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and arrested a civilian. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians.

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire towards civilian houses and property in the districts of Gaza and Khan Yunis.

NORTHERN GAZA	<u>Closure of Crossing Point</u> : Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.		
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. <u>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack</u>: In the evening of 15 July 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory near Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing east of Gaza city. The Israeli army opened fire intensively towards civilian houses. 		
CENTRAL GAZA	Incidents not reported.		
KHAN YUNIS	 <u>Raids/Air Patrols/Attacks/Land Levelling</u>: In the morning of 15 July 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and 3 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of the area of Al Farahin. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled land. In the evening of 15 July 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided approximately 150 metres into Palestinian territory east of the towards civilian houses and property and levelled land. 		

	<u>Closure of Crossing Points</u> :
