DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Raids:

- (i) At 13:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddu, raided a commercial premise, and arrested a civilian.
- (ii) In the evening of 22 July 2010, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Anata and searched a number of houses and commercial premises.
- Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Khaled Abdul Nasser 'Ubeid Taha in the town of Biddu.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

JERUSALEM

	Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. Flying Checkpoint: At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of 'Atara, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a civilian. Raids: At 01:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Mazra'a al Gharbiya and patrolled the area until 02:30. At 02:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Bir Zeit and the village of Abu Qash and patrolled these areas until 03:15. Settler Violence/Destruction of Property: On 22 July 2010, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to agricultural land in the village of Saffa, damaging many olive trees. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Detentions: At 18:35, Israeli troops positioned at the Wall Gate # 300 detained 2 children (brothers), tied their hands with plastic handcuffs, and released them at a later time. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas.
TULKAREM	Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa.

• <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 19:000, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Kafriyat road and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- (i) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem.
- (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the towns of Baqa ash Sharqiya and 'Attil
- <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

• <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.

• Flying Checkpoints/Detention:

- (i) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up 3 flying checkpoints, including two at the entrances to the town of 'Azzun and the village of Immatin and one on the junction to the village of Jinsafut. Israeli troops searched security and vehicles.
- (ii) At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:45, the Israeli army set up another flying checkpoint and detained Rabee' Ahmed Farkh, a Palestinian National Security officer, allegedly for locating a knife in his possession. Israeli troops released Farkh on bail after having served a summons on him to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iii) At 14:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iv) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles.

(v) At 21:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Hajja and Al Funduq and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Qalqiliya. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 12:15, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- (ii) At 20:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Far'ata.

Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.

Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Oabalan and the village of Osarin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed (i) on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. **NABLUS Flying Checkpoints:** At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to (i) the town of Beita and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:15. At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between (ii) the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya. At 15:00, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:15. At 19:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to (iii) the village of Yatma and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:00. Raids/Attack: At 01:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Nablus. The (i) Israeli army also opened indiscriminate fire and withdrew at 06:00. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Talluza. (ii) **Settler Violence:** (i) At 09:30, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Itamar assaulted farmers while they were tending their land near the settlement. The Israeli army also forced farmers to leave their land. Israeli peace activists were in company with Palestinian farmers. (ii) At 15:15, a group of Israeli settlers took position in the area between the town of Beita and the village of Osarin and withdrew at 16:00. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern (i) **SALFIT** entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern (ii)entrance to the town of Brugin.

	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to 2 detour roads connecting the village of Marda to respective				
	agricultural land.				
	<u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.				
	• Raid: At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Salfit and patrolled the area until 04:30.				
	 Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel. 				
	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks.				
	 Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. 				
JERICHO	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flying Checkpoint: At 05:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Ein ad Duyuk and searched civilians and vehicles. 				
	• Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of				
	An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.				
	(ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.				
BETHLEHEM	• Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a.				
	• Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 11:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles until 12:10.				
	(ii) At 12:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Tuqu' and denied civilian access in both directions, allegedly for throwing stones. At 13:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.				

- Raids: At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Al 'Ubeidiya and the village of Dar Salah.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

Closure

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Kharas and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in Az Zahed area in the old city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Attack: At 18:10, Israeli troops positioned near Al 'Arrub refugee camp fired sound and tear gas grenades towards civilians at the entrance to the refugee camp, ostensibly for throwing stones.

• Raids/House Occupations:

- (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Dura.
- (ii) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron. at 14:35, the Israeli army raided the city again, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. At 18:40, the Israeli army raided the

- city for the third time, occupied house roofs in the Ash Shi'aba area, converted them into military posts, and withdrew at 19:00.
- (iii) At 15:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Sa'Israeli army, searched a house belonging to Lafi Ahmed Jabarin, a Palestinian National Security officer, and served him a summons to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iv) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Surif and patrolled the area until 20:30.
- (v) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Ummar.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) At 15:00, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat Ziyad Mohammed Younes Makhamreh near the settlement of Beit Yattir southeast of the town of Yatta. Israeli troops also arrested Makhamreh.
- (ii) At 19:00, a group of Israeli settlers assaulted civilians taking part in a funeral procession of Khamis Jaddou' al 'Uweiwi near Al Karantina area in the old city of Hebron and attempted to prevent them from burying the dead body in the cemetery in the area. Subsequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.

• Arrests:

- (i) At 14:00, Israeli troops positioned in the area surrounding the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron arrested Mahmoud Musbah 'Ayyad, a resident of the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya in the district of Nablus.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested Ziyad Mohammed Younes Makhamreh near the settlement of Beit Yattir.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.

GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.

RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow patients, students, and students holding visas to leave the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals. In addition, a truck transporting medicines crossed to the Gaza Strip through the Crossing. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
