WEST BANK

JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, only allowing access to civilians holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads:
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil town and Saffa village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. Flying Checkpoint: At 07:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Khirbet Abu Falah village and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 13:00, the Israeli army raided Bir Zeit town, searched a home, confiscated a computer, and withdrew at 13:20.

	 (ii) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided Beit Sira village, searched two homes, and served a summonses on Ibrahim Omar al Hajj to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. (iii) At 02:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kharbatha al Misbah village. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding 'Ofarim settlement and north of Al Lubban al Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of Dotan settlement. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting Kafr al Labad town to Shufa village as well as the road connecting Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa villages. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Checkpoint: At 10:55, the Israeli army intensified restrictions and impeded civilian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Flying Checkpoint: At 19:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Qaffin town and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route was suspended for the weekend in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. In addition to closing the iron gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army has continued to close since 03:10 on 01 July 2011 the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village with dirt barricades. Flying Checkpoint/Detention: At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Jinsafut village, searched civilians and vehicles, and detained Qays Mohammed Hasan al Qaddoumi, and released him at 18:35.

• Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:

- (i) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Immatin village.
- (ii) At 23:40, the Israeli army raided Jinsafut village and served a summons on Ahmed Mahmoud Bashir, a Palestinian Presidential Guard officer, to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 19:40, Israeli troops detained four children in Ar Razazi area east of Qalqiliya city and released them after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO):
- (i) Mohammed 'Adnan Ra'i, 15 years old;
- (ii) Anas Omar Ra'i, 16 years old;
- (iii) Husam Abdul Latif Mahmoud Ra'i, 17 years old; and
- (iv) Adham Abdul Latif Mahmoud Ra'i, 16 years old.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

NABLUS

	 Flying Checkpoints: At 15:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to 'Iraq Burin village and denied access to civilians other than the village residents. Raid: At dawn on 23 July 2011, the Israeli army raided Burqa village and served summonses on two civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency: Farouq Wael Mohammed Daghlas; and Mustafa Mohammed Sa'id Saleem Hajjeh. Settler Violence: At 16:20, a group of Israeli settlers raided Burin village and attempted to assault civilians, who confronted them. The Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area at a later time. Demonstration: At 17:25, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in 'Iraq Burin village in protest against confiscation of civilian land for construction of Israeli settlement projects. Having declared the area a closed military zone, the Israeli army intercepted the demonstration. Meanwhile, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which a number of participants sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland. Beginning on 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has continued to open the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Flying Checkpoint: At 14:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between Bruqin and Kafr ad Dik towns and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 12:20, the Israeli army raided Mas'ha village and patrolled it until 13:00. Arrest: At 11:25, Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Lama 'Uday, a female resident of Ramallah city. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of Emmanuel settlement.
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area.

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district as well as to others holding access permits.
 Flying Checkpoints: At 19:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint
- <u>Flying Checkpoints</u>: At 19:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city. At 06:55, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 08:00.
- Raid: At 08:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al 'Auja village.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) Beginning on 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has continued to prevent civilians from accessing or staying on 22 *dunums* of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.

• **Checkpoints**:

- (v) At 17:20, the Israeli army closed Gilo checkpoint on the Bethlehem-Hebron main road and reopened it at 17:40.
- (vi) At 22:00, the Israeli army intensified restrictions and impeded civilian access at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to Bethlehem city) and searched civilians and vehicles until 11:30.
- (ii) At 15:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Kfar 'Etzion settlement and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 00:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Marah Rabah village and searched civilians and vehicles until 01:00.

• Raids:

- (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al 'Ubeidiya town.
- (ii) At 23:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Nahhalin village.
- (iii) At 02:55, the Israeli army raided Bethlehem city and Ad Duheisha refugee camp. Meantime, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. The Israeli army also arrested two children in the refugee camp and withdrew at 05:10.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The Israeli army arrested two children Ad Duheisha refugee camp in Bethlehem city:
- (i) Mu'ath 'Issam Jaber, 16 years old; and

	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of
	Efrat settlement.
	• <u>Closure</u> :
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and
	Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the
	Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the
	fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market

	(ii) Beginning on 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close
	the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evacuated
	residents and denied civilian access to the area.

	(i) At 08:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in front of the

	(ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in Ruq'a area
	east of Yatta town and searched civilians and vehicles.
	• Attack/Detentions: At 23:35, Israeli troops positioned on the military
	watchtower erected at the entrance to Beit Ummar town opened fire and fired sound and tear gas grenades on civilians and adjacent homes
	after a gas barrel had exploded near the watchtower. The Israeli army
	also set up a checkpoint at the entrance and denied civilian access to or
	from the town. In addition to Ibrahim al 'Alami, a Palestinian
	Preventive Security officer, the Israeli army detained a number of civilians and released them after coordination with the Israeli
	authorities (through the DCO).
	• Raids/Attack:
	(i) At 09:50, the Israeli army raided Yatta town and patrolled it until
	11:00. (ii) At 22:40, the Israeli army raided Ar Remedia village and fired

- (iii) At 00:55, the Israeli army raided Ad Dhahiriya town and patrolled the area until 02:00.
- Demonstration/Physical Assaults/Detentions: At 15:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place on civilian land near Karmei Tzur settlement in Beit Ummar town in protest against Israeli settler violence. Protestors also demanded that Palestinian farmers be enabled to access and tend their land. Meantime, Israeli troops severely beat participants with batons and rifle butts, preventing them from accessing civilian land near the settlement. As a result, eight civilians sustained contusions. Furthermore, the Israeli army beat and detained two international peace activists.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.
