WEST BANK

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On July 27th 2012, the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages. • <u>Raid:</u> At 20:15, Israeli forces raided Kafr Ein village and detained 6 residents including 3 children. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Salah Yassin (12 years), Majd Kharm (15 years), Eyad Kharm (16 years), Jad Kharm, Ayman Kharm and Amr Kharm in Kafr Ein village. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:30, Palestinian and International peace activists demonstrated in

	<p>Bil'in and Ni'lin against land confiscation and against the legality of the wall; Israeli forces fired tear gas grenades leaving several demonstrators suffocating from tear gas inhalation.</p> <p>(ii) At 13:40, Palestinian and international activists demonstrated in Al-Nabi Saleh village against the construction of the separation wall; Israeli forces fired teargas towards the demonstrators, injured Mohamad Al-Tamimi (9 years) after being hit with a tear gas canister and leaving causing several cases of suffocation from teargas inhalation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Flying Checkpoint: At 15:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Zubaba village. • Raid: At 00:35, Israeli forces raided Al-Arqa village. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00. • Raid: At 04:15, Israeli forces raided Tubas.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. • Checkpoints: At 12:40, Israeli army continues their restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road until 14:00. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route continued in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of Azzun (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • Flying Checkpoint: At 16:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the north entrance of Azzun • Raid: At 16:45, Israeli forces raided Asala village and detained 2 residents including a child. • Demonstration: At 13:25, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Kafer Qaddum village to protest closures of the entrance gate leading to the village; Israeli forces fired teargas and stun grenades towards demonstrators as they approached the village entrance, injuring several demonstrators after firing rubber coated steel bullets and leaving several other suffocating from tear gas

	<p>inhalation and during which a tear gas grenade fired by Israeli forces set fire to agricultural land owned by Adnan Ali before fire fighters could put it out.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqif village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • <u>Raid:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 21:00, Israeli forces raided Tel and Sarah villages. (ii) At 21:55, Israeli forces raided Nablus, clashed with residents as they stormed several homes, injured Jihad Al-Balghi and Wael Sibyan and several others suffocated from tear gas inhalation. Israeli forces also detained 6 residents and damaged furniture owned by Abdallah Al-Kharouf. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Thaer Sbieh, Abdallah AL-Kharouf, Abdallah Al-Afour, Abdallah Sbieh, Shadi Hanoun and Hani Hanoun in Nablus.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) Since 15 April 2012, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to restrict access at Za’tara checkpoint and impede the free flow of traffic. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Oja village with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. (ii) Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho

	<p>District and others with access permits.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 18:35, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Al-Na'ouma village road. • <u>Raid:</u> At 20:00, Israeli forces raided Fasayil village.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. (ii) Since 14:30 on January 10th 2012, the Israeli army closed a road leading to Tuqu' with dirt mounds. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the north entrance of Beit Jala. (ii) At 11:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Al-Khadr village. (iii) At 17:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Al-Faradis village. (iv) At 20:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Al-Nashash junction. (v) At 05:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Za'tara checkpoint, temporarily seized and searched 2 Palestinian Security force buses until 06:40. • <u>Demonstration:</u> At 13:30, a demonstration took place in Maasra against the Israeli settlements and the separation wall; Israeli forces fired tear gas towards the participants, leaving several demonstrators suffocating from tear gas inhalation. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued northwest of Beit Jala town.
Hebron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuqz Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.

(ii) At 12:10 and again at 21:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Khursa village. (iii) At 17:50, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Wadi Sa'ir road. (iv) At 19:15, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of north Hebron. (v) At 21:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Al-Tabaqa village and fired tear gas grenades toward several children for alleged stoning. (vi) At 21:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint Beit Annun village junction. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:50, Israeli forces raided Hebron and set up a checkpoint. • <u>Detention:</u> At 17:40, Israeli forces positioned at Tel Al-Rumayda neighbourhood in Hebron detained Ibrahim I'biedo after he attempted to prevent Israeli settlers from assaulting his brother Mohammad I'biedo who was hospitalised with contusions. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town. |

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. • On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark. • Israeli forces broke the cease fire agreement by opening fire Palestinian fishing boats off the shores of Khan Yunis and Rafah. • Palestinian gunmen launched projectiles towards the Green Line.
NORTHERN GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists and international access.
GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
KHAN YUNIS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Palestinian Attack: On the evening July 27th 2012, Palestinian gunmen launched projectiles towards the Green Line.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: • Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. • Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is closed • Sufa Crossing is closed. • Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed.
