#### WEST BANK

# ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

#### Closure:

- (i) At dawn on 30 July 2009, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and set up several flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem, around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and on roads leading to the Western Wall to provide protection to Israeli settlers, who performed Jewish religious rituals on the occasion of the so-called Destruction of the Temple.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

# **JERUSALEM**

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: On 29 July 2009, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to yard of the Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and perform Jewish religious rituals under protection of the Israeli army.

#### • Wall Gates:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.

	<ul> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> <li>• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.</li> </ul>
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya.</li> <li>Flying Checkpoint: At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the overpass to the town of Deir Dibwan and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Raids: <ol> <li>At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the cities of Ramallah and El Bireh.</li> <li>At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Deir Ghassana.</li> <li>At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Rammun.</li> <li>Demonstration/Attack: At 24:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil'in in protest against Israeli overnight raids and arrests, which aim to prevent demonstrations against Wall construction. Israeli troops disrupted the demonstration, fired tear gas grenades towards protestors, and fired flares over the village.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
JENIN	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.</li> <li>Raid: At 10:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of As Suweitat in the city of Jenin.</li> <li>Settler Violence: At 01:30, a group of Israeli settlers gained access into the evacuated settlement of Sanur. Consequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.</li> <li>Demonstration: At 11:30, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the city of Jenin in solidarity with prisoners. Protestors also demanded that political prisoners be released from Israeli prisons.</li> </ul>

	Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul> <li>Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas.</li> <li>Raids: <ol> <li>At 11:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tubas, the town of Tammun, and the village of Tayasir.</li> <li>At 20:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Bardala.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
TULKAREM	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Roads: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa.</li> <li>Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> <li>Raids: <ol> <li>At 08:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kafr al Labad.</li> <li>At 09:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem, the town of Deir al Ghusun, and the village of Al Jarushiya.</li> <li>At 09:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem and the town of Bal'a.</li> <li>Demonstration: At 11:000, families of killed Palestinian civilians held a sit-in demonstration in front of the ICRC offices in the city of Tulkarem, demanding that corpses of their dead relatives be restored. The Israeli army continues to seize 23 corpses of killed civilians from the district of Tulkarem in the so-called "tombs of figures" as well as in mortuaries.</li> <li>Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> </ol> </li> </ol></li></ul>
QALQILYA	<ul> <li>Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li>Flying Checkpoint: At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of 'Azzun and the village of 'Asla and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Raids: <ol> <li>At 18:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Wadi ar Rasha, detained 'Imad 'Adnan Abdul Rahman 'Odeh, and released him at 22:30.</li> <li>At 01:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya, searched 5 houses, and arrested 2 civilians.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

	• Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement

SALFIT	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern
	entrance to the city of Salfit.

	<ul> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.</li> <li>• Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.</li> <li>• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.</li> </ul>
JERICHO	<ul> <li>Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.</li> <li>Checkpoints:         <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
BETHLEHEM	<ul> <li>Closure: <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.</li> <li>Closure of Main Roads: In addition to detour roads east and south of the village of Al Walaja, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; Talita-Nazlat as Sidr in the city of Beit Jala; Al Wadi Rahhal-the settlement of Efrat; and a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar.</li> <li>Checkpoint: At 18:20, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access.</li> <li>Flying Checkpoints: <ul> <li>(i) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Jannata and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 10:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northwestern entrance to the city of Beit Jala and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> </ul></li></ul>

(111)	At 21:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance
	to the town of Beit Fajjar and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 09:25, the Israeli army raided the city of Beit Sahur and patrolled the area until 13:30.
- (ii) At 12:05, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 05:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Al Khadr.
- <u>Detention</u>: At 11:00, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained Hamed 'Assem Hamed Shantar, a Palestinian Police officer, and released him at a later time.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 21:10, a group of Israeli settlers gained access into the area of the Al Fureidis Mount. Consequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area at 21:40.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

#### Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

### • Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.

#### **HEBRON**

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to open the iron gate on the Farsh Al Hawa junction to Road # 35, which leads to Tarqumiya Crossing, from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00.
- **Flying Checkpoint:** At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raids:
- (i) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Sa'ir.
- (ii) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit 'Awwa, searched several houses, and arrested 3 s.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the town of Beit 'Awwa:
- (i) Wajdi Ahmed Yaseen as Suweiti;
- (ii) Mu'ath Hafeth Salem as Suweiti; and
- (iii) Dhiya' Bassam Ali as Suweiti.
- Attack on Religious Site: Beginning on 28 July 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron, deny civilian access to perform prayers, and prevent the call to prayers, claiming to be carrying out maintenance works.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal and in the area between southeast of the village of 'Arab ar Ramadin and the village of Imneizil.

## **GAZA STRIP**

# ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.
- <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory.
   Israeli armoured vehicles and Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line also opened fire towards Palestinian territory in the district of Khan Yunis.

The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards agricultural land and civilian houses as well as levelled land. In addition, an armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
