ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 31 May 2010, a general official mourning was declared and an order was given that Palestinian flags be lowered to half-staff and half-mast at official headquarters in all districts for 3 days to mourn killing and injuring many Arab and international activists after Israel navy forces intercepted and raided Gaza Freedom Flotilla at sea. In commemoration of those killed by Israel forces, a registry was created to accept condolences at the headquarters of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and houses of mourning were opened in the headquarters of all districts.

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Closure:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque. On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall. The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the villages of Biddu and Beit Ikka. <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram. <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem. As of 11 April 2010, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and prevent daily civilian traffic access from 23:00 until 05:00. The closure of the checkpoint will continue for a week and half under the pretext of maintenance and setting up an infrastructure between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp. <u>Arrests:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> On 30 May 2010, the Israeli army arrested in the neighborhood of Silwan in Jerusalem city the civilian Kayed Na'im Fataftah.

	<p>(ii) On 01 June 2010, the Israeli army arrested in the neighborhood of Silwan in Jerusalem city the civilian Zuhair Ar-Rajabi.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical Assault: At 21:20, the Israeli army severely beat in Jerusalem city the civilian Ammar Muhammad An-Najjar. As a result, he sustained contusions and evacuated to hospital for treatment. • Demonstration: At 11:30, a mass sit in demonstration took place in Ash Shaikh Jarrah neighborhood in Jerusalem city in protest and condemnation of intercepting and raiding Gaza Freedom Flotilla at sea by Israel navy forces. The Israeli army obstructed the demonstration and beat a number of demonstrators. As a result, a civilian woman sustained injuries and contusions. The Israeli army detained 2 civilian women and the Palestinian official in charge of Jerusalem file Hatem Abdulqader. The Israeli army released them at a later time. • Wall Gates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-‘Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu’fat refugee camp.
<p>RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village, Safa village and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued military order declaring the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni’lin and the village of Bil’in as closed military zones from 08:00 until 20:00 every Friday and for a period of 6 months. Civilian access is denied during the mentioned period without a special permit. • Arrest: At 03:10 on 01 June 2010, the Israeli army arrested during a raid on Silwad town, in addition to what was mentioned in the previous report, the civilian Bilal Hamad Abdulqader Hamed. • House Demolition: On 25 May 2010, the Israeli army served notices in the village of Deir Ibziq to demolish 6 houses under the pretext of not having construction licenses and because they are located in area (C), which falls under Israeli control. The houses belong to the civilians: Radi Muhammad At-Taweel; Riyadh Abed Al Majed; Tawfiq Shahin; Bader Mahmoud Omar; Haroun Hamdan; and Nidal Jodeh Ibrahim. • Demonstration: At 11:30, a mass demonstration took place in Ramallah city in protest and condemnation of intercepting and raiding Gaza Freedom Flotilla at sea by Israel navy forces.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the towns and villages of 'Abud and Bil'in, and in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to 'Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. • Detention: At 09:00, the Israeli army detained near the settlement of Movo Dotan the civilian Sameer Nayef Khader Atatrah and released him at 15:30 following DCO intervention. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, east of the city of Tubas, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Al Funduq village and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 12:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Hajja village, detained a Civil Defense vehicle and allowed it to pass at a later time following DCO intervention. (iii) At 21:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 19:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Al Funduq and Hajja and searched civilians and vehicles. (v) At 23:15, the Israeli army set up 4 flying checkpoints at the entrances to the town of Habla and the villages of Jinsafut, Jit and Immatin and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 18:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Jinsafut and Al Funduq. • Wall Gates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector.

	<p>(ii) On 12 May 2010, the Israeli army erected an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha (after removing the iron gate erected at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya), and prevented civilians from the village from passing through it. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through the iron gate # 109.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Tel-Burin, Beit Furik-Salem, and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; and with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Duma, the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya, the western entrances to the town of Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil, the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan, as well as the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to Alon Moreh settlement. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close by an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village, opposite Shavi Shomron settlement. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of Aqraba to the village of Osarin. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the side road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00. (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00.
<p style="text-align: center;">SALFIT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.
<p style="text-align: center;">JERICHO</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00.

	<p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-‘Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those possessing permits.</p>
<p>BETHLEHEM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu’man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian access to an area that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem.</p> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, the sideway east of Beit Fajjar town and the agricultural road that is located between the town of Taqu’a and the village of Khirbet Al Baq’a. • Flying Checkpoint: At 17:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Fajjar and searched civilians and vehicles. • Arrest: At 22:30, the Israeli army arrested at As Sawahira Ash Sharqiya (the ‘Container’) checkpoint 17-year-old child Sami Emad Abu Haykal. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.
<p>HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada’ Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the area located near the Green Line, south of Yatta town, evacuating the area of those inside it and denying them access to it.</p> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa’; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab’a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-‘Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from</p>

	<p>traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.</p> <p>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <p>(i) At 09:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the towns of Tarqumiya and Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(ii) At 17:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Al Fawwar refugee camp and arrested a civilian under the pretext of finding a knife in his car.</p> <p>(iii) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iv) At 23:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> • <u>Raids:</u> <p>(i) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided Al Arrub refugee camp, occupied the roof of a house and converted it into a military post and patrolled the area.</p> <p>(ii) At 13:50, the Israeli army raided the area of Bab Az-Zawiya in Hebron city where confrontations took place with civilians. The Israeli army occupied the roof of a building and converted it into a military post.</p> • <u>Arrests:</u> <p>(i) At 14:40, the Israeli army arrested in the old city of Hebron the civilian Diya' Abdulkareem Abdallah Al Haddad.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army arrested near Al Fawwar refugee camp the civilian Yaser Othman Salman Abu 'Aram.</p> • <u>Physical Assaults:</u> <p>(i) At 11:00, the Israeli army severely beat near As-Samoa' town the civilian Shareef Nawwaf Al Badareen. As a result, he sustained contusions and evacuated to hospital for treatment.</p> <p>(ii) At 06:30, an Israeli army jeep driving on the main road near the entrance to the area of Al Fahs, south of Hebron city, ran over the civilian Mazen Radwan Al Jamal. As a result, he sustained serious injuries and evacuated to an Israeli hospital for treatment</p> • <u>Demonstration:</u> On 01 June 2010, a mass sit in demonstration took place in Hebron city opposite the ICRC in protest and condemnation of intercepting and raiding Gaza Freedom Flotilla at sea by Israel navy forces. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the Israeli army declared a unilateral ceasefire. In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a one-week-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period. • The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory, opening fire intensively in Khan Yunis district, opening fire intensively and firing 2 tank shells from its locations on the Green Line in the districts of Gaza, Central Gaza and Khan Yunis. An Israeli reconnaissance aircraft also launched a missile airstrike towards armed Palestinian individuals killing 3 of them in the district of Northern Gaza. • Armed Palestinian groups breached the ceasefire by opening fire and firing 2 mortars towards the Green Line.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. • <u>Air Attack:</u> At 14:00, an Israeli reconnaissance aircraft fired a missile targeting armed Palestinian individuals in the area of Ash Shayma' in the town of Beit Lahiya killing 3 of them. • <u>Killings:</u> The Israeli army killed in Ash Shayma' area in Beit Lahiya town civilians: Arafat Eid; Ala' Ghannam; and Hayel Hasan Al Qadi. • <u>Expulsion:</u> On 01 June 2010, the Israeli authorities expelled the civilian Naser Al Jarushiya, a resident of Bi'r As-Sabe' city in Israel, to Gaza Strip (although he is married to a Palestinian woman holding Israeli ID, have children and reside in Bi'r As-Sabe' city). His expulsion comes in the context of implementing military order # 1650 expelling civilians who do not hold residence permit in the West Bank, hold Gaza Strip ID or were born in Gaza. • <u>Palestinian Attack:</u> In the afternoon of 01 June 2010, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
<p style="text-align: center;">GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. (ii) Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing for fuel transport is closed since 04 January 2010 by an Israeli unilateral decision. • <u>Attack:</u> In the evening of 01 June 2010, the Israeli army opened fire intensively from its locations on the Green Line towards agricultural land and houses belonging to civilians east of Al-Shuja'iya neighborhood that is located east of Gaza city. • <u>Air Patrol:</u> In the evening of 01 June 2010, Israeli F-16 warplanes overflew Gaza city and conducted mock air raids.

<p style="text-align: center;">CENTRAL GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Palestinian Attack:</u> At 13:50, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards the Israeli army in the periphery of Kissufim gate near the Green Line. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory northeast of Al-Qarara town.
<p style="text-align: center;">KHAN YOUNIS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raid:</u> In the afternoon of 01 June 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided the area of Al Wad, east of Al Qarara town, and opened fire intensively towards agricultural land and civilian houses. • <u>Palestinian Attack:</u> In the afternoon of 01 June 2010, armed Palestinian individuals fired anti armored mortar towards the Israeli army near the Green Line. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively and fired 2 tank shells towards Palestinian territory east of Abasan Al Kabira town destroying a deserted house. • <u>House Demolition:</u> The Israeli army destroyed in Abasan Al Kabira town a house belonging to a civilian from Ad Dughma family.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAFAH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open on exceptional basis for the entry of 82 patients who received treatment at Egyptian hospitals. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the transport of food, humanitarian assistance, a quantity of industrial diesel for the electricity plant and cooking gas.
