ALL DISTRICT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At 24:00 on April 24th 2012, the Israeli military closed all crossings leading into West Bank (For the 64th Anniversary of the establishment of the state of Israel). Prevented citizens and employees; including those with entry permits from entering Jerusalem and Israeli; with the exception of diplomatic and International missions with prior security coordination until 24:00 on April 26th 2012.

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Closure: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beitlksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beitlksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: <p>Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</p> Raid: At 22:15, Israeli forces raided Kafr Aqab village until 00:20. Detention: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> On June 7th 2012, Israeli force detained Mohammad Al-Qawasmi, a resident of Silwan as he was attending his brother Mohanad Al-Qaba’s court hearing in an Israeli prison. On the evening of June 7th 2012 Israeli forces detained Ahmad Damiri after

	<p>storming factory in Silwan neighbourhood.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Home Demolition: As mentioned in the previous report at 22:30, on June 6th 2012, Israeli forces demolished 5 barracks in Anata. • Settlement Activity: On June 7th 2012, Israeli authorities approved the construction of 2500 settlement units in "Gilo" settlement located on land occupied in 1967 in Jerusalem. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'aleAdumim.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. • Raid: At 00:45, Israeli forces raided Al-Nabi Saleh village. • Settler Violence: At 20:15, Israeli settlers stoned vehicles passing along the road between Silwad and Ein Yabrud village then withdrew at 21:15. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Raid: At 21:30, Israeli forces raided Jalbun village. • Destruction of Property: At 08:00, Israeli forces demolished 6 water wells owned by Abed Daraghma, Miqdad Al-Fadi, IsamYassin, Mahmoud Yassin, Mashour Hisnawi and Ahmad Al-Qad in Jenin. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00. • Confiscation of Property: On June 7th 2012 confiscated a water tank and fined its owner 1700 NIS approximately \$440.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to increase their restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarm-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Raid: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 01:45, Israeli forces raided Al-Shwikiya neighbourhood in Tulkarem, searched several homes and withdrew at 04:00.

	<p>(ii) At 02:30, Israeli forces raided Far'un village, stormed Mohammad Al-Shufany's home, destroyed surveillance cameras outside his home then withdrew at 03:30.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route continued in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of Azzun. (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to KafrQaddum village. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Jinsafut village. (ii) At 16:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint between Jinsafut village and Kafr Laqif. • Raid: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:55, Israeli forces raided Qalqiliya until 16:50. (ii) At 20:40, Israeli forces raided Jit village. (iii) At 23:30, Israeli forces raided Ras Atiya. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of RasAtiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in KafrLaqif village north of KarneiShomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Immanuel settlement; and east of KafrThulth town near Ma 'aleShomron settlement.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of AlonMoreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • Flying Checkpoint: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Al-Naqura village junction until 11:05. (ii) At 13:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Furik until 14:45.

	<p>(iii) At 18:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Deir Sharaf junction until 19:30. (iv) At 21:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Beita junction. (v) At 21:35, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Yitsahar settlement junction until 23:00.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raid:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 01:15, Israeli forces raided Tel village. (ii) At 03:00, Israeli forces raided Nablus, stormed several homes then withdrew at 03:55. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 13:25, Israeli settlers stoned vehicles near Huwara until 23:55
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) Since April 15th 2012, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses and Ambulances only. The entrance had been closed since the year 2000. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Za'tara checkpoint, detained a resident and impede the free flow of traffic. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 07:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint between Al-Zawiya and Rafat village. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area north of DeirIstiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Oja village with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area and at 17:40 Israeli forces closed the checkpoint as they detained 2 residents for allegedly carrying explosives. (ii) Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Oja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:10 and again at 07:30 on June 8th 2012, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho. (ii) At 19:25, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the Dead sea junction until 19:40.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in BeitSahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of BeitFajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting WadiFukin and Al Jab'a villages.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) Since 14:30 on January 10th 2012, the Israeli army closed a road leading to Taqou with dirt mounds. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 22:25, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Wadi Fuqin until 00:25. • <u>Raid:</u> At 21:00, Israeli forces raided Taqou, summoned Ammar Jabbarin and Wahbi Jabbarin to report to Israeli intelligence for questioning. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 10:35, Israeli settlers raided Al-Khadr, uprooted several trees owned by Mohammad Saleh, during which Israeli forces temporarily detained Malik Al-Asa, Hammam Al-Shiekh, Ahmad Hamieda and Mahmoud Saleh realising them at 12:00. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued northwest of BeitJala town.
<p style="text-align: center;">Hebron</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading between Bani Na'im and Zif village to the entrance to Al-Simiyavillage access to the area. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of North Hebron. (ii) At 13:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint between Yatta and Al-Samou. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, Israeli forces raided Hebron. (ii) At 12:45, Israeli forces raided Beit Awwa, served demolition orders for 7 homes owned by Abdel Rasoul Al-Seyoutawi, Issa Al-Seyoutawi, Awni Al-Seyoutawi, Majdi Al-Seyoutawi, Ismail Al-Seyoutawi and Issa Mahmoud Al-Seyoutawi in Beit Awwa. (iii) At 01:00, Israeli forces raided Dura, stormed a home and detained a resident. (iv) At 03:10, Israeli forces raided Ithna until 07:00. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the

ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 13 March 2012 at 01:00. • On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against pass beyond the mark. • Israeli forces broke the ceasefire agreement by opening fire towards Khan Yunis.
NORTHERN GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists and international access.
GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Detention: Israeli forces detained Ahmad Al-Shana.
KHAN YUNIS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attack: On the evening of June 7th 2012, Israeli forces opened fire towards agricultural land in Abbsan Al-Kabira and as a result set fire to wheat crops.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. • Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is open for the exit of patients, students and passengers with permits. • Sufa Crossing is closed. • Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the entry of humanitarian supplies, cooking gas, 35 truckloads of wheat and Livestock feed, fuel supplies and construction material for internationally funded projects.
