DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city.

Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.
- Raids: At 14:50, the Israeli army raided the Biddu town and Al Jib village.
- <u>Arrest</u>: At 14:50, the Israeli army arrested Murad Hasan Abu Hamdan in Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

JERUSALEM

	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.			
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. Raids/Attack: At 11:30, the Israeli army raided the village of An Nabi Salih and distributed notices for the demolition of 8 houses belonging to civilians from the family of At Tamimi. At 18:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bir Zeit and the village of Surda. At 19:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Mazra'a al Gharbiya and opened fire, while combing olive groves. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. 			
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flying Checkpoint: At 12:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of 'Arraba, arrested 1 civilian, and withdrew at 14:40. Raid: At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabatiya. While patrolling the area, Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on the junction to the town of 'Arraba arrested Ahmed Omar Jaber Abu Libdeh. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall. 			
TUBAS	Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas.			

TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Flving Checkpoints: At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of 'Anabta and the village of Bizzariya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 18:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Beit Lid and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Physical Assaults/Attack: At 17:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Far'un and severely beat Mohammed Mustafa Hijjawi and his son 12-year-old Qays, while they were present near the Wall section in the village. Due to contusions sustained, the father and son were transported to hospital for medical treatment. At 23:25, the Israeli army raided and combed the plain of the town of Zeita. Meanwhile, the Israeli army fired flares. At 03:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flving Checkpoints/Detentions: At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Jinsafut and searched civilians and vehicles. At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Immatin and searched civilians and vehicles. At 14:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Hajja and searched civilians and vehicles. At 20:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Al Funduq, searched civilians and vehicles, and detained 2 Palestinian National Security officers. Raids: At 09:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of 'Izbat Suleiman. At 13:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Azzun. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town again, searched 3 houses, and arrested a civilian to place pressure on his son to surrender himself to the Israeli authorities. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Fares Abdul Karim Shubeitah in the town of 'Azzun.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) Beginning on 12 May 2010, the Israeli army has continued to install an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. The Israeli army removed the wall gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya and only allows students to cross to their school outside the village through the Habla gate.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
- Raid/Attack: At 23:45, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and provided protection to Israeli settler, who visited Prophet Joseph's Shrine. Meantime, the Israeli army opened fire.
- Arrest: At 23:00 on 08 June 2010, the Israeli army arrested Sari Nassr Ahmed 'Azem during its raid into the village of Sabastiya, as was reported on 09 June 2010.
- <u>House Demolitions</u>: On 09 June 2010, the Israeli army distributed notices for the demolition of 7 houses in the village of Majdal Bani Fadil, claiming that they had been build without the required construction licences. The house belong to:
- (i) Ibrahim Ahmed Abdullah Zein ad Din;
- (ii) Omar Ahmed Abdullah Zein ad Din;
- (iii) Salah Mustafa Abdullah Zein ad Din;
- (iv) Mustafa Salah Zein ad Din;
- (v) Fares Nathmi Zein ad Din;

	 (vi) Abdul Haleem Suleiman Muhsen; and (vii) Husam Fawzi Zein ad Din. Settler Violence: At 06:50, Israeli settlers raided the town of 'Aqraba. Subsequently, the Israeli army raided the town, opened fire, and provided protection to settlers.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flving Checkpoint: At 06:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Ein ad Duyuk and searched civilians and vehicles. Destruction of Property: At 11:00, the Israeli army dismantled 5 vendor stalls along Road # 90 near the village of Marj Na'ja as well as severely beat and arrested 2 civilians (brothers). Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians near the village of Marj Na'ja:
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.

- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: At 10:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint, detained a number of civilians, and released them at a later time, after having served summonses on them to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 14:50, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained a civilian vehicle transporting 4 female civilians, who rejected physical searched by male troops. Female civilians were released at 16:00, after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).
- **Provocation of Palestinian Forces:** At 13:00, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained Ibrahim Hilmi Mohammed Abu Ghazi, a Palestinian Presidential Guard, and released him after serving him a summons to report to Israeli Intelligence.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades an entrance to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Al Fawwar refugee camp and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 17:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Physical Assaults:

- (i) At 08:00, Israeli troops severely beat Sakhr Hisham Abu Hashem near the town of Beit Ummar, leaving him with contusions. Consequently, Abu Hashem was transported to hospital for medical treatment.
- (ii) At 13:00, Israeli troops positioned at Al 'Arrub refugee camp severely beat 10-year-old Ahmed Ibrahim Jawabreh, who was transported to hospital for treatment of contusions sustained.

• Raids:

- (i) At dawn on 10 June 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of Kharsa and arrested 2 civilians.
- (ii) At dawn on 10 June 2010, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar, searched 3 houses, and arrested 2 civilians.
- (iii) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (iv) At 01:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul.
- (v) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Idhna and arrested 2 civilians.
- (vi) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ula and arrested 1
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the village of Kharsa:
- (i) Yousef 'Ayed ash Shahatit; and
- (ii) Is'haq Khalil Hussein Hantash.

The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Beit Ummar:

- (iii) Samir 'Amer Mohammed Abu Mariya; and
- (iv) 'Isa Kamel Mousa Bahar.

The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Idhna:

- (v) Iyad Yousef Abdullah Islimiyyeh; and
- (vi) Mahmoud Abdullah Mohammed Islimiyyeh.
- (vii) Jteh Israeli army arrested Raed Abdul 'Afu al 'Amleh in the town of Beit Ula.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 ALL February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the **DISTRICTS** ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. Violation of the Ceasefire: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property in the district of Central Gaza. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. **Deportation:** In the evening of 10 June 2010, the Israeli authorities deported Fayez 'Atiyyeh as Sawarkeh from his workplace in the city of Ilat inside the NORTHERN Green Line to the Gaza Strip. It should be noted that 'Atiyyeh is married to **GAZA** a Palestinian holding an Israeli-issued ID and lives with his family in the city of Bir as Sabe'. He was deported in accordance with Military Order # 1650 on deporting civilians, who do not hold permits to reside in the West Bank or those who hold Gaza-issued IDs or were born in the Gaza Strip. **Closure of Crossing Points:** (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. **GAZA** Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January (ii) 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: At 15:45, the Israeli army, including 5 armoured vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance **CENTRAL** aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of Al Maghazi refugee camp. **GAZA** While levelling agricultural land, the Israeli army opened intensive towards civilian houses and property. **KHAN YUNIS** Activities not reported. **Closure of Crossing Points:** (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow **RAFAH** (ii) 548 patients, students, and civilians holding visas to leave the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to 356 civilians and patients, who had

received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals.

- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
- (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.

GENERAL

POLITICAL PRISONERS

- <u>Death</u>: Political prisoner Mohammed Abdul Salam 'Abdeen, a resident of the town of Al 'Eizariya in the district of Jerusalem, died in prison after his health condition had deteriorated.
- <u>Sentence</u>: The military court in the Bir as Sabe' Prison sentenced 'Awadh Ghaleb Ramadan as Sultan, a resident of the town of Beit Lahiya in the district of Northern Gaza, to 8 years in prison.
