DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) On 10 June 2011, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city, set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and prevented civilians from other districts from accessing the mosque and performing Friday prayers.
- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designates a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.
- Attack on Religious Site: At 14:00, Israeli troops raided the grounds of the Al Aqsa Mosque compound and fired sound and tear gas grenades on worshippers following Friday prayers. Israeli troops also arrested three civilians, allegedly for throwing stones.
- <u>Arrests</u>: Israeli troops arrested three unidentified civilians on the grounds of the Al Agsa Mosque compound.
- <u>Demonstration/Attack</u>: At 13:00, residents of Beit Ijza village held a sitin demonstration in front of the Wall gate near the village in protest against the Israeli army, who has prevented civilians from accessing or tending their farmland behind the Wall. The Israeli army fired tear gas grenades, injuring several civilians as a result of tear gas inhalation.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area north of Qalandiya village; south of Az Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi al 'Eizariya west of Ma'ale Adumim settlement.

JERUSALEM

• <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil town and Saffa village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al Mughayyir village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 21:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to An Nabi Salih village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 23:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Kharbatha Bani Harith village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 22:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al Mughayyir village.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) At 11:55, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to a civilian farmland in Al Qila' area near Al Mughayyir village. Furthermore, the Israeli army fired tear gas grenades on civilians, who attempted to extinguish the fire and confront settlers. At 17:30, the Israeli settlers and troops withdrew from the area.
- (ii) At 23:15, a group of Israeli settlers from Beit II settlement threw stones at civilian houses near the settlement.
- Provocation of Palestinian Forces: At 09:00, and despite prior coordination, Israeli troops positioned at the 'Court' checkpoint north of El Bireh city detained a Palestinian Police vehicle, while it was transporting Palestinian criminal detainees to Bethlehem and Hebron cities. At 16:00, Israeli troops detained the same Police vehicle once more while it was returning to Ramallah city. In both incidents, Israeli troops released the vehicle after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).

• Demonstrations/Attacks/Raid/House Occupations/Injuries:

- (i) At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Ni'lin town in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army wounded a number of participants as a result of tear gas inhalation.
- (ii) At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Bil'in village in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured a number of participants as a result of tear gas inhalation.
- (iii) At 13:40, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in An Nabi Salih village in protest against Israeli settler violence and confiscation of civilian land for the expansion of Halamish settlement. Meantime, the Israeli army raided the village, occupied the roofs of two houses, and converted them into military posts. The Israeli army fired tear gas grenades, wounding a number of civilians and protestors as a result of tear gas

• Raids/Detentions:

- (i) At 23:35, the Israeli army raided Qalqiliya city and searched a house.
- (ii) At 23:35, the Israeli army raided Kafr Thulth town. While patrolling the area, the Israeli army detained a number of civilians and released them after interrogation.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 20:10, a group of Israeli settlers gained access and set fire to civilian land in Far'ata village. Civilians extinguished the fire.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Kafr Laqif village north
 of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel
 settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays.

Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area. The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set (ii) up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district as well as to others holding access permits. **Flying Checkpoints:** At 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction (i) to Al 'Auja village and searched civilians and vehicles. At 20:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near 'Ein ad (ii) Duyuk village (the northern entrance to Jericho city) and searched civilians and vehicles. At 22:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the main (iii) road in the centre of Al 'Auja village and searched civilian vehicles. Raids: At 16:10, and again at 02:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al 'Auja village. **Closure:** The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, (i) with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the southeastern area of the village. Beginning on 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has continued to (ii) prevent civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-**BETHLEHEM** Wadi Ahmad road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. Flying Checkpoint: At 05:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction and searched civilians and vehicles. **Demonstration:** At 13:15, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Al Ma'sara village in protest against Wall construction. Israeli troops intercepted the demonstration and prevented protestors from accessing civilian land under the threat of confiscation. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; around Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement. Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. Hebron In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.

(ii) Beginning on 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evacuated residents and denied civilian access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Adh Dhahiriya and As Samoa' towns, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani and Al Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Kharsa village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 16:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Bani Na'im town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 20:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Idhna town, searched civilian vehicles, and arrested a civilian.
- (iv) At 22:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Ummar town and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 15:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Halhul town.
- (ii) At 20:50, the Israeli army raided Hebron city, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on the junction to Idhna town arrested Abdul Majid Hussein 'Odeh.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 11:20, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to an area near Beit 'Amra village. The Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area at a later time.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 13:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place near At Tuwani village east of Yatta town in protest against Israeli settler violence and land confiscation. The Israeli army intercepted the demonstration, fired sound and tear gas grenades, and detained as well as severely beat a number of protestors, leaving Qasem Ahmed Abu 'Iram with contusions. Tear gas grenades hit and injured another two civilians:
- (i) Fadhel Ahmed Dababseh; and
- (ii) Adham Mohammed Shawahin.

In addition, a number of civilians sustained wounds as a result of tear gas inhalation. The Israeli army also detained an Israeli peace activist.

• <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.
