DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (iii) Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

Closure of Main Roads:

JERUSALEM

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Raids:

- (i) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Abu Dis.
- (ii) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Biddu.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) On 11 June 2009, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to a piece of land 7 *dunums* (1.729 acres) in Az Zaytun Mount neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem in an attempt to seize control of and annex ti the settlement of Orot.
- (ii) On 11 June 20009, an Israeli settler harassed a Palestinian female civilian in At Tur Mount neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem. Having confronted the settler, a confrontation took place between Israeli settlers and civilians, during which the Israeli settlers injured a number of civilians.

Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu (i) Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall (ii) gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. **Flying Checkpoints:** At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance (i) to the town of Beit Rima and searched civilians and vehicles. At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass (ii) to the town of 'Atara, searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded civilian access. Raids: At dawn on 11 June 2009, the Israeli army raided the village of (i) RAMALLAH Kafr Ni'ma and arrested 2 civilians. & At dawn on 11 June 20009, the Israeli army raided the town of (ii) **EL BIREH** Ni'lin, searched 2 houses, and arrested 2 civilians. At 01:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Bireh. (iii) Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the village of Kafr Ni'ma: (i) Ala' Mohammed Bahhour; and (ii) Zeid Mohammed ad Dik. The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Ni'lin: Mohammed Wa'd al Khawaja; and (iii) (iv) Mohammed Rateb al Khawaja. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midva to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Oaddis. Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of **JENIN** Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas. <u>Raid</u>: At 02:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Far'a and patrolled the area until 02:40.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Raids: At 10:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bal'a. At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Baqa ash Sharqiya. At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Attil. Arrest: On 11 June 2009, Israeli troops positioned at 'Einav checkpoint arrested As'ad Ziyad Shadid. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Raid: At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of An Nabi Elyas. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Sarra-Jit; Till-Burin; Beit Furik-Salem; the road between the town of 'Aqraba and the main road; and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya. The Israeli army also continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Til and Madama; the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; the western entrance to the town of 'Aqraba; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the western entrance to the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

	 (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At Huwwara checkpoint, access to civilians is allowed between 05:00 and 24:00 and to civilian vehicles around the clock. (iii) At Beit Furik checkpoint, civilian access is allowed between 05:00 and 23:00.
	(iv) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (v) At 14:30, the Israeli army closed Huwwara checkpoint, denied
	civilian access, and reopened it at a later time.
	• Flying Checkpoints:
	(i) On 11 June 2009, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of As Sawiya along the Nablus-Ramallah main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
	(ii) At 16:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Beita and the village of Odala and searched civilians and vehicles.
	• Raid: At 24:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Asira
	 <u>Settler Violence/Destruction of Property</u>: On 11 June 2009, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to 8 <i>dunums</i> (1.976 acres) of agricultural land in the area between the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Yanun, destroying crops.
	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.
	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and
	impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.
SALFIT	• Flying Checkpoint: At 19:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint
57112111	at the entrance to the town of Kifl Haris and searched civilian vehicles.
	• Raids/Destruction of Property:
	(i) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddya and patrolled
	the area until 10:00.
	(ii) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Kifl Haris and
	provided protection to a group of Israeli settlers while they visited the Thu al Kifl Shrine. Israeli settlers also threw stones at a number
	of civilian houses, breaking glass windows of a house. At 04:00,

Israeli settlers and troops withdrew from the area.

	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Haris north
	of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. <u>Checkpoints</u>:
	 (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint
	set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. • <u>Destruction of Property</u> : At 18:30, the Israeli army destroyed 2 vendors' stalls on the main near the village of Az Zubeidat.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: In addition to 2 side roads east and south of the village of Al Walaja, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; Talita-Nazlat as Sidr in the city of Beit Jala; Al Khadr -Road # 60; Al Khadr -Beit Jala Housing Project; Wadi Rahhal-Efrat; and the side road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. Checkpoint: At 15:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access. Flving Checkpoint: At 16:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the town of Beit Fajjar and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Attack: (i) At 11:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur. (ii) At 14:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Al Khadr.

- (iii) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Fajjar and opened indiscriminate fire while patrolling the area.
- (iv) At 20:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:30.
- (v) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Husan.
- **Demonstration:** At 11:30, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the city of Bethlehem in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Protestors also demanded that political prisoners be released from Israeli prisons.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

(iv) The Israeli army continues to open the iron gate on the Farsh Al Hawa junction to Road # 35, which leads to Tarqumiya Crossing, from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Beit Kahil and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles along the detour road along Road # 35 in the area of Wadi Qabbun leading to the northern quarter of the city of Hebron.
- (iii) At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 16:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Surif.
- (ii) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, searched 3 houses as well as a number of commercial shops, and served a summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iii) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Yatta and arrested 1 civilian
- <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Hasan Shreiteh in the town of Yatta.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal and in the area between southeast of the village of 'Arab ar Ramadin and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.
- Violations of the Ceasefire:
- (i) The Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory. Israeli navy boats also opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea.
- (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops along the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA

- <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.
- Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack: In the evening of 11 June 2009, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards an Israeli army patrol along the Green Line east of the town of Beit Hanun. Consequently, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory.

GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is partially open for transportation of wheat and animal feed. Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is partially open for transportation of fuel. Attacks: In the evening of 11 June 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of Gaza city. In the morning of 12 June 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of the area of Ash Sheikh 'Ijlin south of Gaza city. 		
CENTRAL GAZA	 Attacks: In the morning of 12 June 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of the area of An Nuseirat. In the morning of 12 June 2009, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards agricultural land and civilian houses in the eastern Central Gaza district. Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack: In the morning of 12 June 2009, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards an Israeli army patrol along the Green Line east of Al Bureij refugee camp. Consequently, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory. 		
KHAN YUNIS	Attacks: (i) At 17:00, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards agricultural land and civilian houses in the area of Al Farahin in the eastern Khan Yunis district. (ii) In the evening of 11 June 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of the city of Khan Yunis. (iv) In the morning of 12 June 2009, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards agricultural land and civilian houses in the eastern Khan Yunis district.		
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open an exceptional basis to allow access to 29 ill civilians, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals, as well as a delegation of 3 journalist from the Egyptian TV station. The Secretary General of the Qatari Red Crescent Society was also allowed to leave the Gaza Strip through Rafah Crossing. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed.
