JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army, intensified their restrictions at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city and prevented worshipers under the age of 40 from conducting prayers at Al-Aqsa mosque compound. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) On September 19th 2012, Israeli forces closed Ras Khamis checkpoint near Shu’fat camp and impeded the free flow of traffic in order to construct the wall. • <u>Raid:</u> At dawn on June 11th 2015, Israeli forces raided Abu Dis and detained a resident. • <u>Detention:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On June 11th 2015, Israeli forces detained Attiya Owisat (A resident of Jabal Al-Mukabir neighbourhood) in Jerusalem. (ii) Israeli forces detained Ameer Awad in Abu Dis. • <u>Assault on Places of Worship:</u> At 09:45, Israeli settlers under the protection of Israeli Police stormed Al-Aqsa mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and provoked worshipers. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> On June 11th 2015, a group of Israeli settlers assaulted Sahadi Abd Rabbo (A resident of Jabal Al-Mukabir neighbourhood) as he was returning from work in West Jerusalem and as a result, left him hospitalised with contusions. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Slewahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at “Halamish” settlement junction until 10:00. (ii) At 14:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Surda village junction until 14:30. • <u>Raid:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 23:15, Israeli forces raided Um Safa village, stormed a home then withdrew at 00:40. (ii) At 01:20, Israeli forces raided Ni’lin. • <u>Attack:</u> At 19:00, Israeli forces positioned near “Pesagout” settlement located in the east area of Al-Bireh city fired stun and tear gas grenades towards several residents for alleged stoning.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. (ii) Since the evening of November 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the western entrance of Ya’bad. • <u>Raid:</u> At dawn on June 11th 2015, Israeli forces raided Kafrit village and detained a resident. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Hamam Awad in Kafrit village. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> Israeli forces continue too close the wall gate and only allow those holding special permits to enter through it.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Checkpoint:</u> At 08:10, Israeli forces closed Tayassir checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic then reopened it at 09:30.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Checkpoint:</u> At 14:40 and again at 19:00, Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at “Eniv” checkpoint located along the main road connecting Tulkarem and Nablus and impeded the free flow of traffic until 21:00. • <u>Raid:</u> At 10:15, Israeli forces raided Shwakiya neighbourhood in Tulkarem until 10:55.
QALQILIYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of Azzun town. (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second Intifada, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. (iii) Since 16:55 on December 18th 2014, Israeli forces closed an agricultural road leading to Far’ata village which is located near “Gillad” settlement with dirt mounds • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 15:00 and again at 23:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Qaddum. • <u>Raid:</u> At 01:05, Israeli forces raided Kafr Qaddum village, clashed with several residents then withdrew at 01:35. • <u>Attack:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 20:10, Israeli forces positioned near the wall gate leading to Wadi Rasha village fired stun grenades towards several residents for alleged stoning. (ii) At 21:10, Israeli forces positioned in the North area of Kafr Qaddum opened fire towards several children. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and impeded the free flow of traffic. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al- Rasha and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya, the

NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: Since December 17th 2013, Israeli forces ordered the closure 500 dunumes of land in Qusra village as a closed military area. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Til-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • Checkpoint: At 13:45, Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at Huwara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Flying Checkpoint: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:30, Israeli force set up a checkpoint between Nablus and Tel village until 11:15. (ii) At 15:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint in the area between Nablus and Assira Al-Shimaliya until 16:00. (iii) AT 17:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Dajjan village. (iv) At 18:15, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near the junction of the settlement “Shafa Shamron” until 19:45. (v) At 18:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Furiq until 20:00 • Raid: At 14:55, Israeli forces raided Assira Al-Qibliya village, occupied Mahmoud Salah’s home and converted its rooftop into a Military post then withdrew at 16:00.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) On 15.04.2012, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian, which was closed since the year 2000 and prevented access from 08:00 until 09:20. (iii) Since 11:00 on July 30th 2012, Israeli forces have closed two roads leading to Abu Nasar and Qatan Al-Jama’ located in western area of Deir Istiya with cement blocks. • Checkpoint: At 14:55, Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at Za’tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic until 15:10. • Flying Checkpoint: At 11:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Kafil Harris, impeded the free flow of traffic after closing the steel gate entrance then reopened it at 14:35. • Raid: At 21:00, Israeli forces raided Kafil Harris as they escorted a group of Israeli settlers then withdrew at 04:00. • Destruction of Property: At 13:00 on June 10th 2015, Israeli forces stormed Kafr Al-Dik and served a military order to halt construction on a road and served another military order for the demolition of a vehicle car wash owned by Hassan Salameh for allegedly being built without a licence because of its location in area C which is under Israeli Military and Administrative control. • Settler Violence: At 00:45, Israeli settlers stormed Kafr Al-Dik junction, stoned residents and vehicles then withdrew at 00:55.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: Israeli forces intensified its restrictions at Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus District.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 22:35, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the Dead Sea junction until 22:55. • <u>Raid:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:20, Israeli forces raided Jericho until 11:30. (ii) At 23:15, Israeli forces raided Al-Oja village stormed a home and summoned Hassan Nojom to report to Israeli Intelligence for questioning then withdrew at 23:50. • <u>Home Demolition:</u> At 09:10, Israeli forces stormed Wadi Qult area located in West Jericho and served Military orders for the demolition of three homes owned by Salah Nojom, Mohammad Shihdeh Nojom and Mohammad Qassim Nojom for allegedly being built without a licence because of their location on Area C, which is under Israeli Military and Administrative authority.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunumes of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road between Um Tuba and Al-Jass ; a road between Um Tuba and Khilat Nu'man; a road between Um Tuba and the wall; a road between Al-Khas village and the wall; the 2 by pass roads located south of Al-Walaja; a road between Talita Qumi and Nazlat Al-Sider in Beit Jala; the eastern road of Al-Khader; the road between Al-Khader and Beit Jala ; Wadi Rahal road near "Ifrat" settlement ,the road between Al-Khader and road #60 which lead to the eastern neighbourhoods of Bethlehem; a road leading to Wadi Rahal, and a road east of Beit Fajjar town with dirt mounds. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road leading to "Newe Daniyyel" settlement and agricultural land in Al-Khader; a road between Um Tuba and Wadi Al-Hums: Wadi Fukin, Al-Jaba, the Green Line; a road between Za'tara and a detour road, and a road between Taqou and Khirbet Al-Deir with cement blocks. (iii) Since August 2nd 2012, Israeli forces closed a road leading to Beit Jalla. (iv) Since May 8th 2013, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Carmisan area in Beit Jalla and Al-Walaja with a steel gate and barbed wires. (v) Since June 3rd 2013, the Israeli army closed the road connecting Nihalin and road 60 with dirt mounds. (vi) Since 13:20 on September 29th 2013, the Israeli army closed a road leading to 50 acres of agricultural land in Wadi Salem area in Al-Khadr with dirt mounds. (vii) Israeli forces closed the main road connecting Surif and Al-Jub'a village with dirt mounds. (viii) On January 28th 2014, Israeli forces closed the steel gate at the entrance of Nihalin { replacing the dirt mounds placed at the entrance since the year 2002 } and placed time schedule for opening the gate from 06:00 until 14:00 on a daily bases. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:35, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Al-Khadr until 16:50. (ii) At 16:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Beit Ta'mar village until 17:15. (iii) At 20:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Nihalin village until 22:00.

<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to e to Al-Simiya village, the southern entrance of Al-Samou' and the entrance of Beit Annun with cement blocks. (v) Since July 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Safa and Al-Dirat and closed the entrance of south Yatta with cement blocks. • Flying Checkpoint: At 20:00 on June 10th 2015, Israeli forces set setup a checkpoint along road (60) located near Halhul and temporarily detained Eyad Al-Tumayzi (A resident of Ithna) then released him later. • Raid: At 18:40, Israeli forces raided Sa'ir village, temporarily detained the child Diya Jarradat (13 years old) then released him later. • Detention: At 08:30, Israeli forces positioned at "Mitar" crossing point located along the Green Line in South Al-Thahriya detained Imad Abu Raya (A National Security Force officer) as he was travelling to visit his brother detained in Israeli Prisons.

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 19:00 on August 26th 2014, Palestinian Gunmen and the Israeli military agreed to a cease fire agreement (brokered by the Arab Republic of Egypt) which includes the opening of border crossings to allow the entry of emergency supplies and humanitarian goods as well as construction material and agreed to increase the fishing limit to 6 nautical miles with possibility of increase to 12 nautical miles by the end of the year and to decrease the Military area to 100 meters, allow freedom of movement and a halt to targeted killings and assassinations and negotiations will be held for discussion on rebuilding the sea port and airports in the coming month. • Israeli force broke the cease-fire agreement by raiding and opening fire towards Khan Yunis.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for the passage of critical patients, journalists, NGO staff, businesspersons and passengers travelling abroad through Al-Karama crossing with previous coordination. • Detention: At 14:30 on June 6th 2015, Israeli forces positioned at Hanun (Erez) crossing detained Yasser Al-Hattab {a University student interning with a NGO} as he was attempting to cross Erez crossing despite having prior coordination to attend a workshop in Nablus city in the West Bank.

GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
KHAN YUNIS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raid:</u> At 06:30 on June 10th 2015, Israeli forces escorting several Military bulldozers stormed 100m into the vicinity of east Khaz'a and opened fire as they levelled a plot of agricultural land then withdrew at 08:40.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points :</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is closed. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the entry of tourist and foreign diplomats and the entry of Humanitarian assistance and construction material funded by UNRWA.
