WEST BANK

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque. (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram. (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem. (ii) As of 11 April 2010, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and prevent daily civilian traffic access from 23:00 until 05:00. The closure of the checkpoint will continue for a week and half under the pretext of maintenance and setting up an infrastructure between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddu, positioned troops opposite the town's police station and photographed those inside it while under detention. (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided Ar-Ram town, stormed a house and a bakery shop and photographed those inside them while under detention. (iii) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided Abu Dis town, stormed Al Quds University and searched its laboratories, arrested an employee of the university working in its laboratories, after searching his house, and took him with them, confiscated a computer and withdrew at 03:50. • <u>Arrest:</u> The Israeli army arrested in Abu Dis town the civilian Ziyad Salih Ibrahim Ash-Shaikh.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Gates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-‘Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu’fat refugee camp.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village, Safa village and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued military order declaring the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni’lin and the village of Bil’in as closed military zones from 08:00 until 20:00 every Friday and for a period of 6 months. Civilian access is denied during the mentioned period without a special permit in order to prevent the weekly demonstrations against the Wall. • Flying Checkpoint: At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Atara town. Again at 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and arrested a civilian. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Bireh. (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Sinjil where confrontations took place with civilians while patrolling the area. (iii) At 02:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Deir Ghassana. • Arrest: The Israeli army arrested on the overpass leading to Atara town the civilian Sameh Shawkat Samha. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the towns and villages of ‘Abud and Bil’in, and in the areas of al-Midya to Ni’lin and Ni’lin to Deir Qaddis.
<p style="text-align: center;">JENIN</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to ‘Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Arraba. (ii) At 10:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Deir Abu Da’if. (iii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Ajja. (iv) At 13:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Meithalun until 14:20.

	<p>(v) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Dan and took photographs for a number of houses while patrolling the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, east of the city of Tubas, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00. • Raid: At 03:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tubas until 03:45.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbet Shofeh. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road. • Flying Checkpoint: At 17:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Kafriyat Road (which connects the districts of Tulkarm and Qalqiliya) and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 03:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarm. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Azzun. Again at 22:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 13:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Izbet Tabib. (iii) At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Hajja and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 22:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Azzun. (ii) At 00:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Qalqiliya until 03:00. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. (ii) On 12 May 2010, the Israeli army erected an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha (after removing the iron gate erected at

	<p>the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya), and prevented civilians from the village from passing through it. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through the iron gate # 109.</p>
<p>NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Tel-Burin, Beit Furik-Salem, and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; and with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Duma, the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya, the western entrances to the town of Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil, the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan, as well as the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to Alon Moreh settlement. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close by an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village, opposite Shavi Shomron settlement. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of Aqraba to the village of Osarin. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the side road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00. (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00. • <u>Raid:</u> At 23:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus to protect a group of Israeli settlers visiting Yousef tomb and withdrew at 05:00. • <u>Arrest:</u> At 21:10 on 12 June 2010, the Israeli army arrested during a raid on the village of Talluza, in addition to what has been mentioned in the previous report, the civilian Jibril Mu'tasem Darawsheh.
<p>SALFIT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 23:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Az-Zawiya and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:55, the Israeli army raided the town of Bidhya. Again at 07:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area. (ii) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Salfit and took

	<p>photographs for all security headquarters, the building of the governorate and the municipality building while patrolling the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.
<p style="text-align: center;">JERICHO</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-‘Auja with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-‘Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those possessing permits. • Raid: At 08:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Jericho to protect a group of Israeli settlers visiting Shahwan Synagogue and withdrew at 11:00.
<p style="text-align: center;">BETHLEHEM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu’man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian access to an area that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, the sideway east of Beit Fajjar town and the agricultural road that is located between the town of Taqu’a and the village of Khirbet Al Baq’a. • Flying Checkpoint: At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Janata and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:55, the Israeli army raided the town of Za’tara, detained the Palestinian National Security officer Ahmad Allan Al Wahsh and released him at a later time after fining him 1000 shekel (equivalent to \$260). (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Beit Sahur. • Demonstration: At 11:30, a mass demonstration, with the participation of international activists, set about in the area of Al Kreimzan, northwest of Beit Jala city, against leveling civilian land for completing Wall construction. Confrontations took place with the Israeli army causing suffocation to 3 demonstrators as a result of tear gas inhalation. In addition, 2 civilians sustained contusions from severe beating. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.

HEBRON

- **Closure:**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the area located near the Green Line, south of Yatta town, evacuating the area of those inside it and denying them access to it.

- **Closure of Main Roads:**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades one of the entrances to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

- **Flying Checkpoints:**

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Zif and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to the town of Halhul. Again at 19:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 07:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and prevented civilian access in both directions (after unknown individuals opened fire towards an Israeli police patrol).

- **Raids:**

- (i) At 09:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul.
- (ii) At 11:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Khirbet Safa.
- (iii) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Kurza, took

	<p>photographs for the village Civil Police station and patrolled the area.</p> <p>(iv) At 19:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar where confrontations took place with civilians while patrolling the area.</p> <p>(v) At 00:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of As Samoa’.</p> <p>(vi) At 01:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Idhna, searched a house and arrested a child.</p> <p>(vii) At 07:30, the Israeli army raided the towns of Dura and Adh Dhahiriya and set up a number of checkpoints at their entrances (after unknown individuals opened fire towards an Israeli police patrol near Al Fawwar junction).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attack: At 21:30, the Israeli army at the entrance to Al Arrub refugee camp fired rubber coated steel bullets and tear gas bombs towards a number of civilians who allegedly threw stones. • Arrest: The Israeli army arrested in the town of Idhna 17-year-old Muhammad Mousa Al Masri. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the Israeli army declared a unilateral ceasefire. In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a one-week-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period. • The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory and opening fire intensively in Khan Yunis district. • Armed Palestinian groups breached the ceasefire by opening fire towards the Israeli army near the Green Line.
NORTHERN GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.
GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. (ii) Al-Shuja’iya (Nahal ‘Oz) Crossing for fuel transport is closed since 04 January 2010 by an Israeli unilateral decision. • Palestinian Attack: In the afternoon on 13 June 2010, armed Palestinian

	<p>individuals opened fire towards an Israeli army patrol, near the Green Line, east of Gaza city. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory.</p>
CENTRAL GAZA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities not reported.
KHAN YOUNIS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raid:</u> In the morning of 14 June 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and 3 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided Palestinian territory east of Al Qarara town and opened fire intensively towards civilian agricultural land and houses while leveling an area of agricultural land.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open for the departure of 416 patients, students and visa holders, and for the entry of 261 civilians and patients who received treatment at Egyptian hospitals. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the transport of food, humanitarian assistance, a quantity of industrial diesel for the electricity plant and cooking gas.
