WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) As of 11 April 2010, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and prevent daily civilian traffic access from 23:00 until 05:00. The closure of the checkpoint will continue for a week and half under the pretext of maintenance and setting up an infrastructure between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.
- <u>Raid</u>: At 23:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis, set up a flying checkpoint and patrolled the area.
- Attack: At 14:45, the Israeli army in the periphery of the checkpoint near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in occupied East Jerusalem fired rubber coated steel bullets and tear gas bombs towards civilians at the entrance to the refugee camp under the pretext of throwing stones.

• <u>Destruction of Property</u>:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army demolished in Ath-Thawri neighborhood in occupied East Jerusalem a garage, which is an extension of a house belonging to the civilian Kamal Ahmad Ash-Shobaki.
- (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army demolished in Silwan neighborhood in occupied East Jerusalem 3 shacks used for raising livestock and poultry under the pretext of not having licenses. The Israeli army also confiscated a container.

JERUSALEM

	 Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp. 		
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village, Safa village and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued military order declaring the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in as closed military zones from 08:00 until 20:00 every Friday and for a period of 6 months. Civilian access is denied during the mentioned period without a special permit in order to prevent the weekly demonstrations against the Wall. Raid: At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Kober, searched a house and withdrew at 03:30. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the towns and villages of 'Abud and Bil'in, and in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. 		
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba, east of the settlement of Dotan. Flying Checkpoint: At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the bypass road east of Jenin city and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall. 		
TOUBAS	<u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, east of the city of Tubas, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00.		
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road. 		

• Raids:

- (i) At 09:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Far'un, set up a flying checkpoint and patrolled the area.
- (ii) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bal'a.
- Arrest: At 02:10 on 15 June 2010, the Israeli army arrested during a raid on Anabta town, in addition to what was mentioned in the previous report, the civilian Ezz Amjad Muhammad Twam.
- <u>Detention</u>: At 16:00, the Israeli army at At-Tayba checkpoint, which is set up on the Green Line, detained the civilian woman Linda Muhammad Ahmad Al Karmi who was travelling to Israel to visit her relatives. The Israeli army released her at a later time.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 11:30, a sit in demonstration by families of political prisoners took place in the city of Tulkarm opposite the ICRC in solidarity with their children in Israeli jails and demanding their release.
- <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
- <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Immatin and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Azzun and the village of Izbat At-Tabib.
- (iv) At 18:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint under the overpass leading to Azzun town (on Qalqiliya Tulkarm main road) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Al Funduq village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 21:30, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Qadumim hurled stones towards civilian vehicles traveling on Qalqiliya Nablus main road.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) On 12 May 2010, the Israeli army erected an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha (after removing the iron gate erected at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya), and prevented civilians from the village from passing through it. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through gate # 109.

QALQILYA

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Tel-Burin, Beit Furik-Salem, and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; and with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Duma, the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya, the western entrances to the town of Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil, the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan, as well as the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to Alon Moreh settlement.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close by an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village, opposite Shavi Shomron settlement.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of Agraba to the village of Osarin.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the side road between the town of Oabalan and the village of Osarin.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00.
- (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00.
- (iii) At 15:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Huwwara checkpoint and impeded civilian access until 16:40.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 17:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of Asira Ash-Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 19:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction leading to Burin village and searched civilians and vehicles until 20:30.
- (iii) At 21:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Furik town.
- (iv) At 22:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Qabalan and searched civilians and vehicles until 23:50.
- Raid: At 13:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Nablus city.
- Arrest: At 16:25 on 14 June 2010, it was found out that the Israeli army arrested at Huwwara checkpoint (under the pretext of finding an explosive device in his possession, as mentioned in the previous report and his name was not known at the time) the civilian Muhammad Majed Ahmad.
- <u>House Demolition</u>: On 14 June 2010, the Israeli army served notice in the village of Khirbet Tana for demolishing a house belonging to the civilian Radwan Qasem Salman Khatatbeh under the pretext of not having a construction license.

NABLUS

SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access. Flving Checkpoints: At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Iskaka. The Israeli army detained police officer Emad Muhammad Al Hashash, conducted field interrogation with him and released him following DCO intervention. At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Farkha and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Salfit city until 10:35. At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Qira village. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Deir Istiya. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those possessing permits. Flying Checkpoints: At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction leading to Road # 90 in the middle of Al Auja village. At 22:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the main road in the middle of Al Auja village.
ветніенем	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian access to an area that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, the sideway east of

- Beit Fajjar town and the agricultural road that is located between the town of Taqu'a and the village of Khirbet Al Baq'a.
- <u>Detention</u>: At 22:50, the Israeli army at As Sawahira Ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained the civilian Majdi Mahmoud Nassar and released him at a later time after serving him with a notice to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 11:00, a mass demonstration, with the participation of international peace activists, set about in Al Walaja in protest at leveling work for completing Wall construction. The Israeli army obstructed the demonstration and severely beat a number of demonstrators.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the area located near the Green Line, south of Yatta town, evacuating the area of those inside it and denying them access to it.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades one of the entrances to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

HEBRON

(v) As of 14 June 2010, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the city of Hebron to the town of Adh Dhahiriya, the road leading to the town of As-Samoa', the entrance to the village of Abda and the road between the town of Dura and the village of Wadi Ash Shajina.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the western entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Khursa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 12:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of As-Samoa' and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 13:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the area of Hanina south of Dura town.
- (v) At 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Yatta and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 22:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.


• Raids:

- (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided Hebron city and patrolled the area. Again at 20:10, the Israeli army raided the area and arrested a civilian.
- (ii) At 11:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Adh Dhahiriya and searched 2 houses.
- (iii) At 21:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Tarqumiya town.
- (iv) At 21:50, the Israeli army raided Al Arrub refugee camp where confrontations took place with civilians while patrolling the area.
- (v) At 22:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled At Tabaqa village.
- (vi) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided Yatta town and searched a house.
- (vii) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar, fired stun grenades and tear gas bombs towards civilians and arrested 2 civilians.

• Arrests:

- (i) The Israeli army arrested in Hebron city the civilian Fahd Majed Ibrahim Abu Sbaih.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested in the town of Beit Ummar the civilians Ala' Issa Safi Slaibi and Muhammad Sameer Abu Mariya.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 04:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Kiryat Arba' in the old city of Hebron destroyed agricultural crop and an irrigation network in land belonging to the civilian Rashed Hamed Az-Zarou At-Tamimi.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP



- (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
- (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the transport of food, humanitarian assistance, a quantity of industrial diesel for the electricity plant and cooking gas.

• Raids:

- (i) At dawn on 15 June 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and a bulldozer covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided Palestinian territory in the periphery of Sufa Crossing northeast of Rafah city and opened fire intensively towards agricultural land and civilian houses while leveling an area of land.
- (ii) In the morning of 16 June 2010, the Israeli army, including 4 armored vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided 300 meters east of An-Nahda neighborhood that is located east of Rafah city and opened fire intensively towards agricultural land and civilian houses while leveling an area of land.
- <u>Attack</u>: In the morning of 15 June 2010, Israeli navy boats opened fire intensively towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea opposite Rafah city beach.
